**Research Analysis**

The proposed committee substitute for HB 1505 authorizes insurers to post insurance policies or endorsements on their website. The policies must be easily accessible online and able to be printed or saved for free. The insurer must also provide information on the declarations page given to customers detailing how to request a paper or electronic copy and where to find the policies online. Once a policy expires, the insurer must archive the policy according to record retention requirements and make it available upon request.
