**Law Library Fund: Revenue positive**

**Research Analysis**

The committee substitute for HB3039 modifies procedures related to the transfer of funds to the law library and increases, from \$6 to \$12, the law library fund fee for all civil court filings in any county that has a population greater than 500,000 people. The current fee is \$6 regardless of the county population. Counties with a population less than 500,000 are also required to send a portion of its court funds, up to \$9,000 per year depending on the population of the county, to the law library fund.

**Fiscal Analysis**

This measure changes the Law Library Fund fee collected from \$6 to \$12 in certain counties. Officials with the Administrative Office of the Courts (AOC) have provided the following information:

**No Fiscal Impact to either the Supreme Court or District Courts.**

Therefore, in its current form, HB3039 creates no fiscal impact to the AOC, and there is a positive impact on the Oklahoma County and Tulsa County Law Libraries as the fee collected is doubled.
