**Research Analysis**

HB3507, as introduced, eliminates the prohibition against credit and debit card surcharges by allowing credit and debit card processing fees to be passed onto the consumer into any sales transaction.

**Fiscal Analysis**

HB 3507 broadens the range of fees a seller can transfer to the consumer or cardholder by allowing a seller to impose a surcharge for the processing fee on consumers who elect to pay by credit or debit card instead of cash, check, or other similar payment methods.

The provisions of this measure target an industry without imposing action on appropriated state agencies. Therefore, this measure is not anticipated to have a direct fiscal impact on the state budget or appropriations.
