**Research Analysis**

**HB 3512**, as introduced, requires schools to provide fentanyl abuse prevention and drug poisoning awareness instruction to students in 6th through 12th grades. The instruction will cover:

- Suicide prevention;
- Prevention of fentanyl abuse and addiction;
- Awareness of local school and community resources and how to access them; and
- Health education about youth substance use and fentanyl abuse.

The instruction may be provided by higher education institutions, libraries, community service organizations, religious organizations, local public health agencies, or organizations employing mental health professionals. The measure also directs the Governor to designate a week as Fentanyl Poisoning Awareness Week in public schools.

Additionally, the measure repeals [70 O.S. Section 11-103.3](#), which requires schools to provide AIDS prevention education.
