Research Analysis

The CS to SB 1168 directs the Department of Public Safety to establish a pilot program to increase the availability of Advanced Roadside Impaired Driving Enforcement (ARIDE) training to increase the number of peace officers qualified to conduct certain drug-impairment screening tests during impaired driving investigations.

Fiscal Analysis

SB1168 requires the Department of Public Safety (DPS) to establish funding to administer a pilot program in effort to increase the number of Advanced Roadside Impaired Driving Enforcement (ARIDE) trained officers. Officials from DPS anticipate issuing direct grants to agencies to cover overtime costs for officers attending and teaching ARIDE training. In its current form, SB1168 has no direct fiscal implications for the state.
