### **Research Analysis**

SB 725 creates the Canine Cooperative Grant Program under the Department of Public Safety. The Program shall provide financial assistance for state, county, and municipal law enforcement entities for acquisition and training of law enforcement canines. The Commissioner of Public Safety is authorized to retain 5% of the monies provided to the Program for administrative purposes.

### **Fiscal Analysis**

SB 758 in its current form realigns the apportionments of medical marijuana taxes and license fees. The measure also reorganizes the flow of such funds to finance Redbud grants at the Department of Education. The measure realigns existing funds within the agency budget, state appropriated base, and existing taxes and fees; the measure does not change the totals of such funds; therefor the changes in the measure should be budget neutral to the State and medical marijuana taxpayers and licensees.
