**Fiscal Analysis**

In its current form, SB800 allows manufacturers to include goods with alcoholic beverages in packaging, provided that wholesalers and retailers cannot sell the packages at a higher price than the alcohol alone. The measure also allows retailers to offer discounts on retail packages for specific professions.

Retail spirits license holders are prohibited from pricing items higher online than in store. Wine and spirits cannot be sold to a licensee for less than fifteen percent above the wholesaler's cost unless the product is discontinued.

The measure is not expected to directly impact state revenue or state appropriations.
