**Bill Analysis**

HB 2672 appropriates \$500 million from the General Revenue Fund for the financial support of public schools. The appropriation shall be used to provide a minimum salary increase to teachers in the following amounts:

- 1) \$4,000 increase for years 0-5,
- 2) \$5,000 increase for years 6-10,
- 3) \$6,000 increase for years 11-15,
- 4) \$7,000 increase for years 16-20, and
- 5) \$8,000 increase for years 21-25.

The measure also provides that if a school district does not receive Foundation Aid or Salary Incentive Aid the State Board of Education will allocate funds to cover the cost of the salary increases. The measure additionally provides for a one-time \$3,000.00 stipend for certified personnel, and support personnel at public school districts as well as DOC and OJA instructional employees/teachers and CareerTech instructional employees. The measure also establishes parameters for annual qualitative bonus pay plans.
