**Bill Analysis**

SB 1971 provides that any state or education employee who is a member of the Oklahoma Law Enforcement Retirement System, Oklahoma Public Employees Retirement System, Teachers' Retirement System of Oklahoma, or Uniform Retirement System for Justices and Judges who is charged with a felony shall lose access to his or her benefits. The prosecuting attorney is directed to notify the relevant system that the employee is a member within 48 hours of the filed charge. A member who is found not guilty shall have his or her access restored.
