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13	BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:
14	SECTION 1. AMENDATORY 47 O.S. 2021, Section 11-1110, is
15	amended to read as follows:
16	Section 11-1110. A. No person shall throw or deposit upon any
17	highway any glass bottle, glass, nails, tacks, wire, cans or any
18	other substances likely to injure any person, animal or vehicle upon
19	such highway.
20	B. Any person who drops, or permits to be dropped or thrown,
21	upon any highway any destructive or injurious material shall
22	immediately remove the same or cause it to be removed.
23	1. C. Any person, wrecker, or towing operator removing a
24	wrecked or damaged vehicle from a highway, highway right-of-way or

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any other location as the result of an accident shall remove any glass or other injurious substance dropped upon the highway or highway right-of-way or other location from such vehicle. The owner or insurer of the owner of the vehicle if the owner's insurance policy provides coverage for such expense, owner has the minimum coverage amounts as required by Section 7-324 of this title, shall be responsible for the cost of removal of the vehicle and the glass or other injurious substance and any vehicle storage fees. The cost of the removal of the vehicle and any storage fees shall be the same as established by the Corporation Commission for nonconsensual tows.

D. Upon receipt of a claim by the insurer from a person, wrecker, or towing operator for the removal of a wrecked or damaged vehicle, glass, or other injurious substance from a highway, highway right-of-way, or any other location, the insurer shall remit payment for the removal claim payable to the company providing the removal. The fees for removal and cleanup constitutes a special lien and is payable before any other claims.

2. E. Truck-tractors carrying cargo on the roadways of this state shall maintain a commercial auto, farm and ranch, inland marine or cargo liability insurance policy that covers the costs of cleanup of any substance that is spilled or otherwise deposited on the roadway or right-of-way in violation of this section.
