7	An Act relating to public ports; amending 82 O.S.
8	2021, Section 1141, which relates to the McClellan- Kerr Arkansas River Navigation System Infrastructure
9	Revolving Fund; redesignating fund as the Oklahoma Public Ports Infrastructure Revolving Fund; modifying conditions for access of the fund; defining term;
10	granting certain authority; updating statutory references; appropriating certain monies to certain
11	fund; and providing an effective date.
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15	BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:
16	SECTION 1. AMENDATORY 82 O.S. 2021, Section 1141, is
17	amended to read as follows:
18	Section 1141. <u>A.</u> There is hereby created in the State Treasury
19	a revolving fund for the Oklahoma Department of Transportation to be
20	designated the "McClellan-Kerr Arkansas River Navigation System
21	<u>"Oklahoma Public Ports</u> Infrastructure Revolving Fund" (OPPIRF). The
22	fund shall be a continuing fund, not subject to fiscal year
23	limitations, for the purpose of pooling all monies received by the
24 27	Oklahoma Department of Transportation from appropriations, dedicated

revenues, federal funds, private contributions or other sources authorized by law dedicated to the McClellan-Kerr Arkansas River Navigation System (MKARNS) <u>or Oklahoma's public waterway ports.</u> <u>Such monies shall include but not be limited to:</u> <u>1. Monies received by the Department of Transportation for</u> <u>waterway projects or infrastructure projects at public waterway</u>

7 ports;

8 <u>2. Principal and interest and penalty payments on loans made</u> 9 <u>directly from appropriated monies in the fund; and</u>

10 <u>3. Any other sums deposited into the fund from any public or</u> 11 private source.

12 All monies accruing to the credit of the fund are hereby 13 appropriated and may be budgeted and expended by the Oklahoma 14 Department of Transportation for qualified projects upon a 15 recommendation by the Waterways Advisory Board of review by the 16 Oklahoma Department of Transportation and upon consultation with all 17 Native American tribes with an ownership interest in the Arkansas 18 riverbed for the purpose of repairing or constructing assets which 19 are part of the MKARNS located in the State of Oklahoma which are 20 essential to the safe and efficient operation of such system and may 21 also be used to match federal grants and awards associated with 22 channel improvements of the MKARNS, whether due to natural 23 disasters, emergency conditions, operations and maintenance needs or 24 construction projects approval from the Transportation Commission. _ _

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1 Expenditures from the fund shall be made upon warrants issued by the 2 State Treasurer against claims filed as prescribed by law with the 3 Director of the Office of Management and Enterprise Services for 4 approval and payment. 5 B. The monies placed in the OPPIRF shall be invested by the 6 State Treasurer as prescribed by Section 89.2 of Title 62 of the 7 Oklahoma Statutes. Notwithstanding any other provision of law, 8 income and earnings on the fund shall accrue to the fund and may be 9 used for the purposes provided for in this section. Any interest 10 earned by the State Treasurer from such funds invested shall be 11 deposited in the OPPIRF. 12 C. As used in this section, a "qualified project" shall: 13 Enhance the safe and efficient operation of Oklahoma's 1. 14 freight transportation systems; 15 2. Repair, improve, or construct waterway or industrial park 16 infrastructure located at or within public waterway ports of this 17 state; and 18 3. Be developed in consultation with the United States Army 19 Corps of Engineers or all Indian tribes with an ownership interest 20 in the riverbed of the Arkansas River when necessary. 21 D. The OPPIRF may be utilized by public port authorities which 22 have active public waterway ports in this state for pooling 23 available federal, private, and state monies for capital projects at 24

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1 their public ports, not inconsistent with Section 1106 of this
2 title.

3	E. The Department of Transportation shall be authorized to:
4	1. Grant or make loans from the OPPIRF for qualified projects
5	in order to implement the provisions of this section;
6	2. Grant an amount not to exceed twenty percent (20%) of the
7	funds available in the OPPIRF during any one (1) year for qualified
8	projects; and
9	3. Loan an amount not to exceed thirty-five percent (35%) of
10	the funds available in the OPPIRF during any one (1) year for
11	qualified projects.
12	No less than ten percent (10%) of the funds available in the
13	OPPIRF during any one (1) year will be reserved for emergency
14	repairs to public ports or waterway infrastructure as authorized by
15	the Transportation Commission. Such determination of ten percent
16	(10%) shall be made based off of the funds available in the OPPIRF
17	at the start of each calendar year.
18	F. The Department of Transportation shall promulgate rules
19	necessary to effectuate the provisions of this section.
20	SECTION 2. There is hereby appropriated to the Department of
21	Transportation from any monies not otherwise appropriated from the
22	General Revenue Fund of the State Treasury for the fiscal year
23	ending June 30, 2025, the sum of Thirty-five Million Dollars
24 27	(\$35,000,000.00) or so much thereof as may be necessary to transfer

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1	to the Oklahoma Public Ports Infrastructure Revolving Fund created
2	pursuant to Section 1141 of Title 82 of the Oklahoma Statutes.
3	SECTION 3. This act shall become effective January 1, 2025.
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
