## 1 STATE OF OKLAHOMA 2 2nd Session of the 59th Legislature (2024) 3 SENATE BILL 1881 By: Bullard 4 5 6 AS INTRODUCED 7 An Act relating to schools; amending 70 O.S. 2021, Section 11-106.1, which relates to public inspection 8 of instructional materials; requiring school districts and public charter schools to disclose on 9 certain website certain information regarding the process to review or approve lesson plans or 10 instructional materials, a listing of certain training, and certain materials or activities; 11 requiring certain disclosure to occur within certain time period after first use; requiring information to 12 remain on website for certain time period; updating statutory language; removing definition; providing 13 certain construction; allowing a teacher or school employee to request use of certain title and initial; 14 providing an effective date; and declaring an emergency. 15 16 17 BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA: 18 SECTION 1. 70 O.S. 2021, Section 11-106.1, is AMENDATORY 19 amended to read as follows: 20 Section 11-106.1. A. Each school district and public charter 21 school in this state shall disclose on its website the following: 22 The procedure or processes in effect for the school 23 principal or other staff to document, review, or approve lesson 24

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plans or the instructional materials and activities used for student
instruction;

- 2. A listing of the teacher and school employee training materials and activities being used in the current school year; and
- 3. All instructional material, materials including, but not limited to, textbooks, articles, and other required reading materials; teacher manuals; films, tapes, audio recordings, and digital materials; websites; online applications for a phone, laptop, or tablet; or other supplementary instructional material in any format, used by a public school as part of the educational curriculum, shall be available for inspection by the parents or guardians of students enrolled in the school including the title, the author or organization, and, if accessible online, the link to the website associated with the material. The materials posted on a school district's or public charter school's website pursuant to this paragraph shall be organized, at a minimum, by subject area, grade level, and teacher.
- B. The disclosure of information required by subsection A of this section shall be posted on a school district's or public charter school's website not more than ten (10) school days after the first use of each material. The information shall remain on the website for a minimum of two (2) years and shall be electronically searchable or sortable.

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- C. Each school district and public charter school shall develop and adopt policies pertaining to the in-person inspection of instructional materials in consultation with parents and guardians of enrolled students. The policies shall include procedures for granting a request by a parent or guardian for reasonable access to instructional material materials within a reasonable period of time after the request is received.
- C. For the purposes of this section, "instructional material" means instructional content that is provided to a student, regardless of the format, including printed or representational materials, audio-visual materials and materials in electronic or digital formats.
- D. The provisions of this section shall not be construed to require:
- 1. The digital reproduction of the instructional materials or activities;
  - 2. The disclosure of academic assessments;
- 3. The separate reporting of individual components of instructional materials that are produced as a single volume, except for digital volumes with works by multiple authors for which a school district or public charter school shall provide either a table of contents or Internet address that discloses the discrete works and authors contained within the volume. Articles, videos, or other materials from websites shall be identified, if possible, with

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an Internet address specific to the relevant content used for student instruction;

- 4. The posting or distribution of any instructional material or activity in a manner that would constitute infringement of copyright under the Copyright Act of 1976; or
- 5. The listing of instructional materials and activities used at a school site with fewer than thirty (30) enrolled students or used only for individualized special education instruction as part of an individualized education program developed pursuant to the Individuals with Disabilities Education Act.
- E. For privacy purposes, a teacher or school employee may request that the school district or public charter school use the teacher's or employee's personal title and last initial instead of his or her full name when posting instructional materials and activities.
  - SECTION 2. This act shall become effective July 1, 2024.
- SECTION 3. It being immediately necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health, or safety, an emergency is hereby declared to exist, by reason whereof this act shall take effect and be in full force from and after its passage and approval.

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
