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13	BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:
14	SECTION 1. AMENDATORY 74 O.S. 2021, Section 5060.19, is
15	amended to read as follows:
16	Section 5060.19. A. The Center may use monies from the
17	Research Support Revolving Fund to carry out the purposes of this
18	act by awarding competitive applied research funds, through
19	professional service contracts or otherwise, to institutions of
20	higher education, nonprofit research foundations and private
21	enterprises of special importance to the Oklahoma economy. The
22	Center may use the fund to provide funding for the programs and
23	purposes specified in subsection $\frac{1}{2}$ E of this section.
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	purposes specified in subsection $ e \overline{E} $ of this section.

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B. The board shall award funding or professional service contracts only after:

1. Developing, adopting, and publishing the criteria it shall use when evaluating research proposals; and

2. Reviewing applied research proposals which present:

6 a. documentation, if the proposal is from an institution 7 of higher education or nonprofit research 8 institutions, that not less than fifty percent (50%) 9 of the total direct cost of the proposed project will 10 be provided by sources other than the Center and other 11 than state-appropriated money; machinery or equipment 12 may be considered as part of the matching funds for 13 the research, but must be accompanied by a statement: 14 (1) that the institution of higher education or 15 nonprofit research institution has received the 16 machinery or equipment and that it is appropriate 17 and useful to the program under review; and 18 either

22	C. The b	ooard may approve <del>such</del> <u>the</u> applied research proposals
23	after the boa	rd finds, based upon the proposal submitted, external
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1 peer review and such additional investigation as the staff of the 2 Center shall make and incorporate in its minutes, that: 3 1. The proposed project is research that leads to innovation, 4 new knowledge or technology and is not training or technical 5 assistance for business firms; 6 2. The project has a reasonable probability to enhance 7 employment opportunities within Oklahoma; and 8 3. The project is technically sound and will produce a 9 measurable result. 10 Before approving an applied research proposal, the Board D. 11 shall obtain a binding commitment from any nonprofit research 12 foundation or private enterprise that would receive funds pursuant 13 to an approval to provide information on an annual basis for the 14 duration of funding and the following year, which shall include but 15 not be limited to the following: 16 1. Employment levels for the year preceding the award and each 17 subsequent year; 18 2. Any additional funds raised as a direct result of the award; 19 3. Payroll data resulting from the research; 20 4. Gross sales or revenue as a direct result of the research; 21 and 22 5. Relevant industry sector information, as determined by the 23 Board. 24 \_ \_

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1	E. The Center is directed to develop a small business
2	innovation research (SBIR) matching support program which meets the
3	highest current standards for state matching support to federal SBIR
4	program grants. The Center shall also develop and implement a
5	program to financially support the preparation of SBIR grant
6	proposals by Oklahoma entities. The Center may also develop and
7	implement programs to encourage Oklahoma firms to participate in
8	other federal research and development programs including, but not
9	limited to, the Small Business Technology Transfer (SBTT) program.
10	E. F. Any commercialized research that results from Center
11	funding of applied research shall be subject to negotiations and
12	policies pursuant to the provisions of this act.
13	SECTION 2. This act shall become effective November 1, 2023.
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
