12	SECTION 1. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified
13	in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 126 of Title 74, unless there is
14	created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:
15	A. State agencies and public institutions listed in subsection
16	B of this section shall prepare a report that includes:
17	1. Documented efforts and associated costs within the past ten
18	(10) years to eradicate invasive woody species;
19	2. An estimate of the amount of acreage owned by the state
20	agency or public institution covered by invasive woody species;
21	3. A plan on future eradication efforts on the property of the
22	state agency or public institution of invasive woody species within
23	the next five (5) years; and

4. The associated costs of the future eradication efforts.

1 State agencies and public institutions required to prepare a 2 report pursuant to subsection A of this section are as follows: 3 The Commissioners of the Land Office; 1. 4 The Oklahoma Department of Agriculture, Food, and Forestry; 2. 5 3. The Department of Corrections; 6 4. The Grand River Dam Authority;

- 5. The Oklahoma Tourism and Recreation Department;
- 6. The Department of Transportation;

- 7. The Oklahoma Turnpike Authority;
- 8. The Department of Wildlife Conservation; and
- 9. Any public universities or technical schools of this state.
- C. State agencies and public institutions required to prepare a report pursuant to this section shall transmit the report electronically to the Governor, the President Pro Tempore of the Senate, the Speaker of the House of Representatives, and to the Office of Management and Enterprise Services by January 1, 2024.
 - D. As used in section, "invasive woody species" includes:
 - 1. Juniperus virginiana or the eastern red cedar;
 - 2. Tamarix ramosissima or the salt cedar;
 - 3. Juniperus scopulorum or the Rocky Mountain juniper; and
 - 4. Prosopis glandulosa or the honey mesquite.
- SECTION 2. It being immediately necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health or safety, an emergency is hereby
