LO	WHEREAS, 4-H is the youth development component of the Oklahoma
L1	State University Extension geared toward young people ages 5 to 19;

L3	WHEREAS, for 115 years, 4-H has helped thousands of club members
L 4	develop life skills, such as leadership, decision-making, and civic
L5	engagement. 4-H reaches nearly 92,781 participants annually through
L 6	membership, project clubs, and school enrichment; and
L7	WHEREAS, programming in 4-H is changing continually to meet the
L8	needs of today's youth, and extends beyond traditional agricultural
L 9	projects, including food and nutrition, horticulture, photography,
20	robotics, community development, companion animals, and more; and
21	WHEREAS, the Oklahoma 4-H Youth Development Program reinforces
22	the learn-by-doing philosophy through hands-on learning
23	opportunities. With a focus on health, nearly 29,000 youth have
24	been reached through healthy living programs. More than 11,400 club

members, as part of OSU Extension and Langston University, participate in science, technology, engineering, and math (STEM) projects. Nearly 9,600 youth have participated in environmental education programs. With agriculture being the backbone of Oklahoma, more than 46,380 youth contacts were made through agricultural programming; and WHEREAS, 4-H participants are four times more likely to make contributions to their communities. These students strive to improve the quality of life for all Oklahomans; and

WHEREAS, there are nearly 1,600 adult volunteer leaders who provide leadership and foster a positive adult/youth partnership.

Another 400 youth volunteers help develop life skills by serving as mentors and role models and provide leadership to club members; and

WHEREAS, adult volunteer leaders and club members combined annually contribute more than 100,000 volunteer hours to the betterment of Oklahoma; and

WHEREAS, youth participating in 4-H are encouraged to share with state leaders how 4-H is making communities better through project work and service-learning activities; and

WHEREAS, 4-H members continue to work together and follow the motto "To Make the Best Better" in all that they do.
