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13 AMENDMENT NO. 1. Page 1, strike the title, enacting clause and  
entire bill and insert  
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15 "An Act relating to agriculture; requiring persons  
entering certain areas to maintain position of the  
16 gate at use; prescribing penalties for violation;  
providing for promulgation of rules; providing for  
17 codification; and providing an effective date.

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19 BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:

20 SECTION 1. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified  
21 in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 2-34 of Title 2, unless there is  
22 created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:  
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1       A. Any individual entering through gates used for ingress or  
2 egress to a property designated as an easement shall maintain the  
3 position of the gate upon use.

4       B. 1. Any individual who violates the provisions of subsection  
5 A of this section shall, upon conviction, be guilty of a misdemeanor  
6 punishable by a fine not more than Five Hundred Dollars (\$500.00),  
7 by imprisonment in a county jail for not more than ninety (90) days,  
8 or by both such fine and imprisonment.

9       2. Any individual convicted of a second offense shall, upon  
10 conviction, be guilty of a misdemeanor punishable by a fine not more  
11 than One Thousand Dollars (\$1,000.00), by imprisonment in a county  
12 jail for not more than one hundred eighty (180) days, or by both  
13 such fine and imprisonment.

14       3. Any individual convicted of a third or subsequent offense  
15 shall, upon conviction, be punished by a fine not more than One  
16 Thousand Five Hundred Dollars (\$1,500.00), by imprisonment in a  
17 county jail for not more than one (1) year, or by both such fine and  
18 imprisonment.

19       4. Any individual convicted pursuant to the provisions of this  
20 subsection shall also be liable for damages.

21       C. The Oklahoma Department of Agriculture, Food, and Forestry  
22 shall promulgate rules necessary to implement the provisions of this  
23 act.

24       SECTION 2. This act shall become effective November 1, 2025."

15 BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:

16 SECTION 3. NEW LAW A new section of law not to be  
17 codified in the Oklahoma Statutes reads as follows:

18 This act shall be known and may be cited as "Kenny's Law".

19 SECTION 4. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified  
20 in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 2-34 of Title 2, unless there is  
21 created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:

22 A. As used in this act:

23 1. "Livestock" means the same as defined in Section 1-3 of  
24 Title 2 of the Oklahoma Statutes; and

1        2. "Maintenance" means the functional checking, servicing,  
2        repairing, or replacing of necessary infrastructure conducted by the  
3        property owner, utility company, municipality, or state or federal  
4        agency.

5        B. All gates that are part of an enclosure or barrier designed  
6        to contain livestock shall remain closed at all times, except when:

7        1. Ingress or egress is in progress; provided, that the ingress  
8        or egress shall be reasonable and not prolonged as to allow persons  
9        to enter and leave without causing containment of livestock to be  
10       compromised;

11       2. Maintenance is occurring within the property;

12       3. Livestock are being moved from one area to another; or

13       4. The livestock owner, utility company, municipality, or any  
14       state or federal agency has a functional reason to access the  
15       enclosed area.

16       C. A person with or without express permission to access a  
17       livestock or landowner's land shall be in violation of this act if  
18       he or she knowingly and maliciously:

19       1. Leaves a gate open that is part of an enclosure or barrier  
20       designed to contain livestock on private or public property;

21       2. Damages any part of a gate that is part of an enclosure or  
22       barrier designed to contain livestock, which compromises the  
23       containment of livestock; or

24       3. Allows livestock to escape containment.

1 D. Individuals in violation of this act shall be deemed guilty  
2 of a misdemeanor and, upon conviction, shall be punished by a fine  
3 not more than One Thousand Dollars (\$1,000.00) for each separate  
4 offense or imprisonment in a county jail for not more than one  
5 hundred eighty (180) days for each separate offense, or by both such  
6 fine and imprisonment, for the first and second convictions. Third  
7 and subsequent convictions for this violation shall be punished by a  
8 fine not more than Two Thousand Five Hundred Dollars (\$2,500.00) for  
9 each separate offense or imprisonment in a county jail for not more  
10 than one (1) year for each separate offense, or by both such fine  
11 and imprisonment. Individuals in violation of this section shall  
12 also incur all financial liability from damages caused.

13 E. The Oklahoma Department of Agriculture, Food and Forestry  
14 may promulgate rules necessary to implement the provisions of this  
15 act.

16 F. The express intent of this law is to protect farmers,  
17 livestock owners, the public, and landowners from malicious acts of  
18 damage, allowance of livestock to escape, and negligence on the part  
19 of others.

20 SECTION 5. This act shall become effective November 1, 2025.
