8 An Act relating to schools; creating Rain's Law;  
9 requiring certain instruction on fentanyl abuse  
10 prevention and drug poisoning awareness; prescribing  
11 frequency of and grades for instruction; listing  
12 information to be included in fentanyl abuse  
13 instruction; authorizing organizations and persons to  
14 provide instruction; directing the State Department  
15 of Education to adopt certain curriculum standards;  
16 requiring the Department to provide certain resources  
17 to schools; requiring fentanyl awareness curriculum  
18 in certain units of instruction; directing Governor  
19 to designate Fentanyl Poisoning Awareness Week in  
20 schools; requiring correlation with National Red  
21 Ribbon Week; providing for certain instruction during  
22 designated week; providing for noncodification;  
23 providing for codification; providing an effective  
24 date; and declaring an emergency.

18 BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:

19 SECTION 1. NEW LAW A new section of law not to be  
20 codified in the Oklahoma Statutes reads as follows:

21 This act shall be known and may be cited as "Rain's Law".

22 SECTION 2. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified  
23 in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 1210.229-8 of Title 70, unless  
24 there is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:

1       A. As part of the comprehensive, integrated curriculum for  
2 substance abuse programs provided in Section 1210.229-5 of Title 70  
3 of the Oklahoma Statutes, each school district shall annually  
4 provide research-based instruction related to fentanyl abuse  
5 prevention and drug poisoning awareness to students in grades six  
6 through twelve.

7       B. The instruction required by this section shall include:

8       1. Suicide prevention;

9       2. Prevention of the abuse of and addiction to fentanyl;

10       3. Awareness of local school and community resources and how to  
11 access those resources; and

12       4. Health education that includes information about substance  
13 use and abuse of fentanyl, including youth substance use and abuse  
14 of fentanyl.

15       C. The instruction required by this section may be provided by  
16 an organization or an employee or agent of an organization that is:

17       1. A public or private institution of higher education;

18       2. A library;

19       3. A community service organization;

20       4. A religious organization;

21       5. A local public health agency; or

22       6. An organization employing mental health professionals.

23       D. The State Department of Education shall identify and adopt  
24 curriculum standards for fentanyl awareness instruction that reflect

1 the areas of instruction listed in subsection B of this section.  
2 The standards shall be incorporated into the appropriate health  
3 standards for grades six through twelve.

4 E. The State Department of Education shall provide resources to  
5 assist schools and teachers in providing instruction on fentanyl  
6 awareness.

7 F. Any school district that offers a health education class in  
8 grades six through twelve shall include fentanyl awareness  
9 curriculum in the drug awareness unit.

10 G. To educate students about the dangers posed by fentanyl and  
11 the risks of fentanyl poisoning, including overdose, the Governor  
12 shall designate a week to be known as Fentanyl Poisoning Awareness  
13 Week in public schools. Fentanyl Poisoning Awareness Week shall be  
14 in correlation with National Red Ribbon Week. Fentanyl Poisoning  
15 Awareness Week may include age-appropriate instruction, including  
16 instruction on the prevention of the abuse of and addiction to  
17 fentanyl, as determined by each school district.

18 SECTION 3. This act shall become effective July 1, 2025.

19 SECTION 4. It being immediately necessary for the preservation  
20 of the public peace, health or safety, an emergency is hereby  
21 declared to exist, by reason whereof this act shall take effect and  
22 be in full force from and after its passage and approval.
