The Board shall determine which measurement systems may be 9 utilized, which shall include, but not be limited to, pump and 10 irrigation monitoring telemetry devices capable of reporting usage. 11 Such measuring systems shall be in proper operating condition at all 12 times when groundwater is being produced. Data from the measuring 13 system shall be utilized for the annual groundwater use report. 14 B. To encourage groundwater conservation, beginning January 1, 15 2026, the Board shall provide a five-year flex allocation of 16 groundwater usage based upon the previously determined allocated 17 annual use of the basin or subbasin. A five-year flex allocation 18 shall not require a new permit for existing permit holders. A five-19 year flex allocation shall be available for: 20 1. Existing permit holders for groundwater use permits in 21 basins or subbasins, based upon the maximum annual yield 22 determination at the time of the original application; 23

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1	2. New applicants for groundwater use permits in basins or
2	subbasins based upon the current maximum annual yield determination;
3	and
4	3. New and existing applicants and temporary permit holders for
5	groundwater use permits in basins or subbasins where the maximum
6	annual yield has yet to be determined.
7	C. An applicant for a five-year flex allocation shall be
8	required to:
9	1. Submit an annual usage report of the prior year's usage from

12	D. A five-year flex allocation shall allow the permit holder to
13	exceed the determined annual allocation in any year of the five-year
