AMENDATORY Section 1, Chapter 106, O.S.L. 8 2024 (74 O.S. Supp. 2024, Section 325.20), is amended to read as 9 follows: 10 Section 325.20. A. In lieu of an automatic fire extinguishing 11 system, portable fire extinguishers shall be installed in mobile 12 food establishments that produce All mobile food preparation 13 vehicles operating within this state prior to July 1, 2024, that are 14 capable of producing smoke or grease-laden vapors shall be in 15 compliance with the most current adopted fire code. With the 16 exception of an automatic fire extinguishing system, such 17 requirement shall apply to vehicles including, but not limited to, 18 vehicles utilizing electric energy, liquefied petroleum gas, 19 compressed natural gas, or a combination thereof for cooking, 20 provided that portable fire extinguishers are installed and 21 maintained in accordance with the most current version of NFPA 10: 22 Standard for Portable Fire Extinguishers. All fire extinguishers 23 shall be inspected annually by a licensed contractor. A six-liter 24 Class K-rated, portable fire extinguisher is required for all

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cooking equipment involving solid fuels or, vegetable or animal oils
and fats, or a combination thereof. All portable fire extinguishers
shall be in clear view and immediately available for use.

4 B. The provisions of this section shall cease to have the force and effect of law on November 1, 2025 All mobile food preparation 5 vehicles utilizing, handling, or transporting liquefied petroleum 6 7 gas or any liquefied petroleum gas system, equipment, container, apparatus, or appliance shall receive and maintain a permit from, 8 9 and be inspected annually by, the Oklahoma Liquefied Petroleum Gas 10 Administration or its employees, in conjunction with the State Fire 11 Marshal issuing an annual operation permit decal to mobile food 12 preparation vehicles. 13 C. The provisions in subsection A of this section shall expire

14 <u>on January 1, 2026, and all mobile food preparation vehicles shall</u> 15 <u>comply with the most current adopted fire codes set forth by this</u> 16 state.

17 D. Mobile food preparation vehicles shall be under the 18 jurisdiction of the State Fire Marshal for fire and life safety code 19 compliance and shall be inspected annually by the State Fire Marshal 20 to ensure compliance with the latest version of the state-adopted 21 minimum codes for fire and life safety as adopted by the Oklahoma 22 Uniform Building Code Commission. The State Fire Marshal shall 23 coordinate, at minimum, annual inspections conducted: 24 1. Within each of the four quadrants of this state; and

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1	2. Twice within each county with a population exceeding four
2	hundred thousand (400,000) according to the latest Federal Decennial
3	<u>Census.</u>
4	E. Upon approval, the State Fire Marshal shall issue an
5	operational permit decal indicating that the vehicle meets the
6	minimum fire and life code requirements adopted at the time of
7	inspection.
8	F. Nothing in this section shall prevent:
9	1. The State Fire Marshal from enforcing the minimum fire code
10	requirements as allowed by law and revoking the operations of a
11	mobile food preparation vehicle for cause when such vehicle is
12	determined to be inherently dangerous to the health, safety, or
13	welfare of persons within this state;
14	2. A political subdivision from enforcing the event permits,
15	operational fees, land use regulations, zoning, or other ordinances
16	in relation to the operation of a mobile food preparation vehicle
17	within the boundaries of the political subdivision; or
18	3. The State Department of Health from licensing and regulating
19	mobile food preparation vehicles as provided by the provisions of
