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1 AMENDMENT NO. 1. Strike the title, enacting clause, and entire bill  
and insert:

17 BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:

18 SECTION 1. AMENDATORY 26 O.S. 2021, Section 4-120, as  
19 last amended by Section 2, Chapter 357, O.S.L. 2023 (26 O.S. Supp.  
20 2024, Section 4-120), is amended to read as follows:

21 Section 4-120. A. The registration of any registered voter  
22 shall be canceled only for one of the following reasons:

23 1. Written notice from the voter pursuant to Section 4-120.1 of  
24 this title;

- 1        2. Death;
- 2        3. Conviction of a felony;
- 3        4. Judicial determination of mental incapacitation under Title
- 4 30 of the Oklahoma Statutes;
- 5        5. Registration in another county or state;
- 6        6. Failure to respond to a confirmation of address mailing and
- 7 failure to vote as prescribed in Section 4-120.2 of this title;
- 8        7. The surrendering of the voter's Oklahoma driver license to
- 9 Service Oklahoma upon being issued a driver license in another
- 10 state; ~~or~~
- 11        8. Being excused from jury duty for not being a citizen of the
- 12 United States; or
- 13        9. Determination that the voter is not a citizen of the United
- 14 States.

15        B. For purposes of this section, paragraphs 5 and 7 of

16 subsection A of this section shall constitute confirmation from the

17 voter to cancel his or her voter registration due to a change of

18 residence.

19        C. A list of voter registrations that were canceled during the

20 previous twenty-four (24) months, and the reason for the

21 cancellation, shall be made available to the public.

22        SECTION 2.        NEW LAW        A new section of law to be codified

23 in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 4-122 of Title 26, unless there

24 is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:

1       A. The Secretary of the State Election Board may compare the  
2 list of registered voters in this state with the database of any  
3 federal, state, or local agency, board, or commission that maintains  
4 information regarding the citizenship of persons residing in this  
5 state.

6       B. If a registered voter definitively matches a person who is  
7 recorded in a database described in subsection A of this section as  
8 not being a citizen of the United States, the Secretary or his or  
9 her designee shall send a notice of such finding to the voter. The  
10 voter shall, within thirty (30) days from the date the notice is  
11 sent to the voter, present proof of citizenship to the secretary of  
12 the county election board in the county where the voter is  
13 registered. Voters may present legible copies of qualifying  
14 documents in person or by mail, electronic mail, or any other secure  
15 method approved by the Secretary.

16       C. If a voter fails to present proof of citizenship within the  
17 prescribed time to the county election board or otherwise provides  
18 notice that the voter is not a citizen, then the voter's  
19 registration shall be canceled, and the voter shall be reported to  
20 the appropriate district attorney and United States attorney.

21       D. For purposes of this section, "proof of citizenship" shall  
22 mean any citizenship-confirming document that meets the minimum  
23 standards of the REAL ID Act of 2005, Public Law No. 109-13, Section  
24 202(c).

1 E. The Secretary shall promulgate rules and procedures as  
2 necessary to effectuate the provisions of this section.

3 SECTION 3. AMENDATORY 26 O.S. 2021, Section 7-103.2, as  
4 last amended by Section 2, Chapter 264, O.S.L. 2023 (26 O.S. Supp.  
5 2024, Section 7-103.2), is amended to read as follows:

6 Section 7-103.2. A. 1. County election boards shall maintain  
7 a current list of all registered voters in each precinct, which will  
8 reflect the address and party affiliation of each voter. The list  
9 shall be public information subject to the requirements described in  
10 subsection B of this section.

11 2. The list shall only be shared with a court system if that  
12 court system agrees to regularly provide the names of persons  
13 convicted of a felony in that court system to the Secretary of the  
14 State Election Board and the appropriate secretary of a county  
15 election board, or if the court system is required by state law to  
16 provide such information.

17 3. The list shall note any voter for whom a first-class mailing  
18 from the county election board or the State Election Board was  
19 returned undeliverable.

20 B. 1. The Secretary of the State Election Board shall ensure  
21 that an electronic copy of the voter registration list described in  
22 subsection A of this section is made available ~~to the public,~~ free  
23 of charge, to the following:

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- a. bona fide residents of this state who are citizens of the United States,
- b. official representatives of political parties recognized by the laws of this state,
- c. candidates for office in this state and their official representatives, or
- d. other persons authorized by state law.

2. Any person accessing the voter registration list shall be required to complete an application form approved by the Secretary that shall include:

- a. the legal name, address of residence in this state, telephone number, and electronic mail address of the person,
- b. an attestation under penalty of perjury that the person meets the legal requirements to access the list, and
- c. any additional information deemed necessary by the Secretary.

3. It shall be unlawful for the recipient of a voter registration list to use such list for any commercial marketing or advertising purposes. Provided, for the purposes of this section, a commercial purpose shall not include the use of the voter list by campaigns, political parties, government officials, or public opinion pollsters to contact or interact with voters.

1       4. It shall be unlawful for the recipient of a voter  
2 registration list to knowingly make the list available or provide  
3 such list to a foreign national, foreign commercial interest, or  
4 foreign government entity.

5       SECTION 4. This act shall become effective November 1, 2025."

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SECTION 5. AMENDATORY 26 O.S. 2021, Section 4-120, as  
last amended by Section 2, Chapter 357, O.S.L. 2023 (26 O.S. Supp.  
2024, Section 4-120), is amended to read as follows:



1 Section 4-120. A. The registration of any registered voter  
2 shall be canceled only for one of the following reasons:

3 1. Written notice from the voter pursuant to Section 4-120.1 of  
4 this title;

5 2. Death;

6 3. Conviction of a felony;

7 4. Judicial determination of mental incapacitation under Title  
8 30 of the Oklahoma Statutes;

9 5. Registration in another county or state;

10 6. Failure to respond to a confirmation of address mailing and  
11 failure to vote as prescribed in Section 4-120.2 of this title;

12 7. The surrendering of the voter's Oklahoma driver license to  
13 Service Oklahoma upon being issued a driver license in another  
14 state; ~~or~~

15 8. Being excused from jury duty for not being a citizen of the  
16 United States; or

17 9. Determination that the voter is not a citizen of the United  
18 States.

19 B. For purposes of this section, paragraphs 5 and 7 of  
20 subsection A of this section shall constitute confirmation from the  
21 voter to cancel his or her voter registration due to a change of  
22 residence.

1 C. A list of voter registrations that were canceled during the  
2 previous twenty-four (24) months, and the reason for the  
3 cancellation, shall be made available to the public.

4 SECTION 6. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified  
5 in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 4-122 of Title 26, unless there  
6 is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:

7 A. The Secretary of the State Election Board may compare the  
8 list of registered voters in this state with the database of any  
9 federal, state, or local agency, board, or commission that maintains  
10 information regarding the citizenship of persons residing in this  
11 state.

12 B. If a registered voter definitively matches a person who is  
13 recorded in a database described in subsection A of this section as  
14 not being a citizen of the United States, the Secretary or his or  
15 her designee shall send a notice of such finding to the voter. The  
16 voter shall, within thirty (30) days from the date the notice is  
17 sent to the voter, present proof of citizenship to the secretary of  
18 the county election board in the county where the voter is  
19 registered.

20 C. If a voter fails to present proof of citizenship within the  
21 prescribed time to the county election board or otherwise provides  
22 notice that the voter is not a citizen, then the voter's  
23 registration shall be canceled, and the voter shall be reported to  
24 the appropriate district attorney and United States attorney.

1 D. For purposes of this section, "proof of citizenship" shall  
2 mean the requirements for proof of citizenship pursuant to the  
3 provisions of the REAL ID Act of 2005, Public Law No. 109-13.

4 E. The Secretary shall promulgate rules and procedures as  
5 necessary to effectuate the provisions of this section.

6 SECTION 7. AMENDATORY 26 O.S. 2021, Section 7-103.2, as  
7 last amended by Section 2, Chapter 264, O.S.L. 2023 (26 O.S. Supp.  
8 2024, Section 7-103.2), is amended to read as follows:

9 Section 7-103.2. A. 1. County election boards shall maintain  
10 a current list of all registered voters in each precinct, which will  
11 reflect the address and party affiliation of each voter. The list  
12 shall be public information.

13 2. The list shall only be shared with a court system if that

5 national, foreign commercial interest, or foreign government entity.

6 SECTION 8. This act shall become effective November 1, 2025.
