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1 BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:

2 SECTION 1. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified 3 in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 1-1150 of Title 63, unless there 4 is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:

A. For the purposes of this section, the term "cultivated meat" means a meat or meat product that was produced from cultured animal tissue produced from in vitro animal cell cultures outside of the animal from which the cells were derived.

9 B. 1. It shall be unlawful for any person to manufacture,
10 sell, hold or offer for sale, or distribute any cultivated meat
11 product in this state.

Any person who violates the provisions of this subsection
 shall, upon conviction, be guilty of a misdemeanor.

C. 1. A seller of food under Sections 1-1118, 1-1118.1, and 1-15 1119 of Title 63 of the Oklahoma Statutes that sells or distributes 16 cultivated meat products in violation of subsection B of this 17 section shall be subject to all enforcement measures as provided by 18 rule of the State Department of Health.

19 2. The license of a seller of food may be suspended or revoked, 20 as provided by rule of the State Department of Health, upon the 21 conviction of an owner or an employee of the licensed seller of food 22 for a violation of subsection B of this section.

D. The State Department of Health may adopt rules as necessaryto implement this section.

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1	E. Nothing in this section shall be construed as preventing any
2	federal, state, or local governmental entity or institution of
3	higher education, or a person that is partnered with a governmental
4	entity or institution of higher education as evidenced by a formal
5	agreement, from conducting research in this state regarding the
6	production of cultivated meat products.

8	Consumer Protection Act; defining terms; requiring disclosure; providing for promulgation of rules; and

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12	BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:
13	SECTION 3. AMENDATORY 2 O.S. 2021, Section 5-107, is
14	amended to read as follows:
15	Section 5-107. A. There is hereby created the "Oklahoma Meat
16	Consumer Protection Act".
17	B. As used in the Oklahoma Meat Consumer Protection Act:
18	1. "Cell-cultured meat", also referred to as lab-grown meat,
19	cultivated meat, clean meat, in vitro meat, imitation meat,
20	synthetic meat, and fake meat, means a food product developed from
21	animal cell cultures rather than through the traditional raising and
22	slaughtering of livestock. Cell-cultured meat does not include
23	imitation meat made of non-meat ingredients including, but not
24	limited to, plant-based protein;

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1 2. "Insect-protein food product" means a food product having one or more sensory attributes that resemble a type of tissue 2 originating from an agricultural food animal but that, in lieu of 3 4 being derived from meat processing, is derived from manufacturing insect parts; 5 3. "Livestock" means animals defined by paragraph 9 of Section 6 1-3 of Title 2 of the Oklahoma Statutes; 7 2. 4. "Meat" means any edible portion of livestock or part 8 9 thereof; 3. 5. "Misrepresent" means the use of any untrue, misleading, 10 or deceptive oral or written statement, advertisement, label, 11 12 display, picture, illustration, or sample; and 4. 6. "Represent" means the use of any form of oral or written 13 statement, advertisement, label, display, picture, illustration, or 14 15 sample. C. Pursuant to the Oklahoma Meat Consumer Protection Act, no 16 person advertising, offering for sale, or selling meat shall engage 17 in any misleading or deceptive practices, including, but not limited 18 to, the following: 19 1. Misrepresenting the cut, grade, brand, trade name, or weight 20 or measure of any meat, or misrepresenting a product as meat that is 21 not derived from harvested production livestock; provided, product 22 packaging for plant-based items shall not be considered in violation 23 of the provisions of this paragraph so long as the packaging 24

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1 displays that the product is derived from plant-based sources in 2 type that is uniform in size and prominence to the name of the 3 product;

2. Using a USDA-quality grade on a product not graded by the
United States Department of Agriculture (USDA) or Oklahoma
Department of Agriculture, Food, and Forestry (ODAFF); or
3. Failing to fully and conspicuously disclose the correct
government grade for any product if the product is represented as
having been graded by the USDA or ODAFF; or

4. Failing to fully and conspicuously disclose that a product
 is cell-cultured meat or is an insect-protein food product.
 D. The State Board of Agriculture shall promulgate rules
