8 PROPOSED OVERSIGHT COMMITTEE SUBSTITUTE

9 An Act relating to labor; defining terms; requiring
10 compensation for minors appearing in Internet
11 content; requiring certain records be kept; requiring
12 certain trust account be kept for minor; permitting
13 civil action; permitting the Attorney General to
14 enforce act; requiring content removal; providing age
15 exception; providing for codification; and providing
16 an effective date.

17 BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:

18 SECTION 1. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified
19 in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 90 of Title 40, unless there is
20 created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:

21 As used in this act:

22 1. "Content creation" means content shared on an online
23 platform in exchange for compensation;

24 2. "Content creator" means an individual or individuals
eighteen (18) years of age or older, including family members, who

1 create video content performed in Oklahoma in exchange for
2 compensation, and includes any proprietorship, partnership, company,
3 or other corporate entity assuming the name or identity of a
4 particular individual or individuals, or family members, for the
5 purpose of that content creator. Content creator does not include a
6 person under the age of eighteen (18) who produces their own video
7 content; and

8 3. "Online platform" means any public-facing website, web
9 application, or digital application, including a mobile application.
10 Online platform includes a social network, advertising network,
11 mobile operating system, search engine, email service, monetization
12 platform to sell digital services, streaming services, paid
13 subscription, or Internet access service.

14 SECTION 2. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified
15 in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 90.1 of Title 40, unless there
16 is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:

17 A. A minor is considered engaged in the work of content
18 creation when the following criteria are met at any time during the
19 previous twelve-month period:

20 1. At least thirty percent (30%) of the content creator's
21 compensated video content produced within a thirty-day period
22 included the likeness, name, or photograph of the minor. Content
23 percentage is measured by the percentage of time the likeness, name,
24 or photograph of the minor visually appears or is the subject of an

1 oral narrative in a video segment as compared to the total length of
2 the segment; and

3 2. The number of views received per video segment on any online
4 platform met the online platform's threshold for generating
5 compensation or the content creator received actual compensation for
6 video content equal to or greater than ten cents (\$0.10) per view;
7 or

8 3. The content creator received compensation greater than Ten
9 Thousand Dollars (\$10,000.00).

10 B. All video content creators whose content features a minor
11 engaged in the work of content creation shall maintain the following
12 records and retain the records until the minor reaches the age of
13 twenty-one (21):

14 1. The name and documentary proof of the age of the minor
15 engaged in the work of content creation;

16 2. The amount of content creation that generated compensation
17 as described in subsection A of this section during the reporting
18 period;

19 3. The total number of minutes of content creation for which
20 the content creator received compensation during the reporting
21 period;

22 4. The total number of minutes a minor was featured in content
23 creation during the reporting period;

24

1 5. The total compensation generated from content creation
2 featuring a minor during the reporting period; and

3 6. The amount deposited into the trust account for the benefit
4 of the minor engaged in the work of content creation as required by
5 Section 3 of this act.

6 C. The records required by this section must be readily
7 accessible to the minor for review. The content creator shall
8 provide notice to the minor of the existence of the records.

9 SECTION 3. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified
10 in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 90.2 of Title 40, unless there
11 is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:

12 A. A minor who is engaged in the work of content creation
13 consistent with this act must be compensated by the content creator.
14 The content creator must set aside gross earnings on the video
15 content that includes the likeness, name, or photograph of the minor
16 in a trust account to be preserved for the benefit of the minor
17 until the minor reaches the age of majority, according to the
18 following distribution:

19 1. If only one minor meets the content threshold described in
20 subsection A of Section 2 of this act, the percentage of total gross
21 earnings on any video segment, including the likeness, name, or
22 photograph of the minor that is equal to or greater than half of the
23 content percentage that includes the minor as described in
24 subsection A of Section 2 of this act; or

1 2. If more than one minor meets the content threshold described
2 in subsection A of Section 2 of this act and a video segment
3 includes more than one of those minors, the percentage described in
4 paragraph 1 of this subsection for all minors in any segment must be
5 equally divided between the minors regardless of differences in
6 percentage of content provided by the individual minors.

7 B. A trust account required under this act must, at a minimum,
8 provide that:

9 1. The money in the account is available only to the minor
10 engaged in the work of content creation;

11 2. The account is held by a bank or trust company, as those
12 terms are defined in Section 102 of Title 6 of the Oklahoma
13 Statutes;

14 3. The money in the account becomes available to the minor
15 engaged in the work of content creation upon the minor attaining the
16 age of eighteen (18) years or upon a declaration that the minor is
17 emancipated; and

18 4. That the account meets the requirements of the Uniform
19 Transfers to Minors Act in Title 58 of the Oklahoma Statutes.

20 C. Content containing the likeness of a child must be deleted
21 and removed from any online platform when the request is made by a
22 minor age thirteen (13) or older, or an adult, whose likeness
23 appears in the content. The request shall be in writing through
24 mail or an electronic communication. The content must be deleted

1 and removed by the content creator from the online platform
2 immediately, and in any instance no longer than seven (7) days after
3 the written request is made.

4 SECTION 4. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified
5 in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 90.3 of Title 40, unless there
6 is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:

7 A. If a content creator knowingly or recklessly violates this
8 act, a minor satisfying the criteria described in subsection A of
9 Section 2 of this act may commence a civil action to enforce the
10 provisions of this act regarding the trust account. In any action
11 brought in accordance with this act, the court may award the
12 following damages:

- 13 1. Actual damages;
- 14 2. Punitive damages; and
- 15 3. The costs of the action, including attorney fees and
16 litigation costs.

17 B. This act does not affect a right or remedy available under
18 any other law.

19 C. Nothing in this act shall be interpreted to have any effect
20 on a party that is neither the content creator nor the minor who
21 engaged in the work of content creation.

22 SECTION 5. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified
23 in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 90.4 of Title 40, unless there
24 is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:

1 If a content creator whose content features minors engaged in
2 the work of content creation fails to maintain the records as
3 provided in Section 2 of this act, the minor may commence a civil
4 action against the content creator for damages and to enforce this
5 act.

6 SECTION 6. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified
7 in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 90.5 of Title 40, unless there
8 is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:

9 A minor compensated under this act is exempt from the minimum
10 age provisions of Section 71 of Title 40 of the Oklahoma Statutes.

11 SECTION 7. This act shall become effective November 1, 2026.
