8 An Act relating to motor vehicles; creating the  
9 Oklahoma Wrecker Services Division; requiring  
10 Division acquire certain employees to carry out its  
11 objectives; transferring certain powers, duties and  
12 responsibilities from the Corporation Commission and  
13 the Department of Public Safety to the Department of  
14 Labor by certain date; requiring the Department of  
15 Labor succeed any contractual rights or  
16 responsibilities; providing for the transfer of  
17 certain rules; requiring certain notice; transferring  
18 rulemaking authority; authorizing the transfer of  
19 personnel; providing details for personnel transfer;  
20 requiring certain coordination for transfer; creating  
21 the Oklahoma Wrecker and Towing Services Board;  
22 providing for membership of the Board; providing for  
23 initial staggered membership; providing for  
24 appointment of members; requiring Board members  
maintain certain occupations for eligibility;  
requiring certain notice and resignation if certain  
conditions are met; providing for selection of chair;  
authorizing chair to set meetings; requiring quorum  
for actions of the Board; providing quorum  
requirements; requiring the Department of Labor  
provide certain support and venue; authorizing Board  
to promulgate rules; listing powers and duties of the  
Board; prohibiting Board compensation; providing for  
certain reimbursement; providing for removal without  
cause; requiring Board act in accordance with certain  
laws; creating the Oklahoma Wrecker and Towing  
Services Revolving Fund; stating type of fund;  
authorizing expenditures; amending 47 O.S. 2021,  
Section 156.1, as last amended by Section 55, Chapter  
452, O.S.L. 2024 (47 O.S. Supp. 2025, Section 156.1),

1 which relates to private use of state-owned motor  
2 vehicles; removing certain exception; amending 47  
3 O.S. 2021, Section 904, which relates to payment of  
4 cost of removal and storage; modifying responsible  
5 agency; amending 47 O.S. 2021, Section 951, which  
6 relates to definitions; modifying definitions;  
7 amending 47 O.S. 2021, Section 952, which relates to  
8 rulemaking authority; modifying responsible agency;  
9 requiring certain rules be enforced until new rules  
10 are in place; authorizing the promulgation of certain  
11 rules; requiring filing and updating of all rotation  
12 logs; requiring Department of Public Safety to  
13 promulgate certain rules; amending 47 O.S. 2021,  
14 Section 953, which relates to license fees and  
15 renewals; modifying responsible agency; modifying the  
16 deposit of funds; creating certain annual fee;  
17 directing deposit of collected fee; amending 47 O.S.  
18 2021, Section 953.1, which relates to maximum fees  
19 and charges; modifying responsible agency; removing  
20 various rates and fees; removing certain weekly rate  
21 and fee adjustment requirement; removing certain fee  
22 mark-up allowance; requiring wreckers to provide  
23 certain list; requiring certain letterhead for list;  
24 requiring certain updates; disallowing exceedance of  
certain prices; allowing only for certain charges;  
listing allowable rates; disallowing the use of  
certain equipment and personnel; requiring certain  
fees be reasonable; requiring fuel surcharge be based  
upon certain prices; allowing certain adjustment of  
fuel surcharge; disallowing certain deviation;  
authorizing collection of certain charges; requiring  
the posting of certain prices at place of business;  
requiring certain investigation for complaints;  
requiring certain contempt proceedings be held;  
authorizing certain removal from rotation log;  
requiring Department of Public Safety make certain  
communication; requiring Department of Public Safety  
make certain statement; requiring certain opportunity  
for appeal and resubmission of rates; requiring  
certain rates remain in effect until modified;  
requiring Department of Public Safety promulgate  
certain rules; requiring review of price list after  
opening complaint; authorizing certain review;  
dividing the state into certain geographic areas;  
requiring certain validity determination; requiring  
return of certain amount of collected monies;  
requiring bringing of charges after certain

1           complaints are made; requiring certain appeal  
2           process; describing appeal process; authorizing the  
3           Department of Labor to issue certain corrective  
4           action plan; authorizing the Department of Labor to  
5           deny, cancel, suspend, or revoke certain licenses;  
6           amending 47 O.S. 2021, Section 953.2, as amended by  
7           Section 1, Chapter 316, O.S.L. 2023 (47 O.S. Supp.  
8           2025, Section 953.2), which relates to fees charged  
9           for storage and release; modifying responsible  
10          agency; modifying definition; removing certain set  
11          rates; amending 47 O.S. 2021, Section 954, which  
12          relates to enforcement; modifying responsible  
13          agencies; amending 47 O.S. 2021, Section 954A, which  
14          relates to abandoned motor vehicles; modifying  
15          responsible entity; updating language on licensed  
16          operators; amending 47 O.S. 2021, Section 955, as  
17          amended by Section 12, Chapter 228, O.S.L. 2022 (47  
18          O.S. Supp. 2025, Section 955), which relates to  
19          towing vehicle from roadway; modifying responsible  
20          agency; amending 47 O.S. 2021, Section 956, which  
21          relates to gifts prohibited; modifying responsible  
22          agency; amending 47 O.S. 2021, Sections 966, 967, and  
23          968 which relates to the Nonconsensual Towing Act of  
24          2011; modifying responsible agency; providing for  
             codification; and providing an effective date.

16        BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:  
17  
18        SECTION 1.        NEW LAW        A new section of law to be codified  
19        in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 3-111 of Title 47, unless there  
20        is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:  
21  
22        A.        The Oklahoma Wrecker Services Division, a division of the  
23        Department of Labor, is hereby created, which shall consist of such  
24        divisions, sections, committees, offices and positions as may be  
             established by the Department of Labor or by law. The Division  
             shall employ a Division Director and a team of three employees to

1 | investigate consumer complaints related to overcharging for  
2 | nonconsensual towing, recovery, storage fees, and violations of the  
3 | rules promulgated by the Oklahoma Wrecker and Towing Services Board.  
4 | Division employees shall act as analysts, administrative assistants,  
5 | administrative technicians, and investigators.

6 |       B. 1. The applicable powers, duties, and responsibilities  
7 | exercised by the Transportation Division of the Oklahoma Corporation  
8 | Commission relating to wrecker and towing services shall be fully  
9 | transferred to the Department of Labor on November 1, 2026. All  
10 | records, property, equipment, assets, monies, financial interests,  
11 | liabilities, matters pending, and funds of the Commission related to  
12 | wrecker and towing services shall be transferred to the Department  
13 | of Labor.

14 |       2. With the exception of initial inspections of wrecker and  
15 | towing facilities and equipment and rotation log requirements  
16 | performed by the Department of Public Safety, the applicable powers,  
17 | duties, and responsibilities for regulating the wrecker and towing  
18 | industry in this state exercised by the Department of Public Safety  
19 | shall be fully transferred to the Department of Labor on November 1,  
20 | 2026. All records, property, equipment, assets, monies, financial  
21 | interests, liabilities, matters pending, and funds of the Department  
22 | of Public Safety related to wrecker and towing services shall be  
23 | transferred to the Department of Labor.

1       C. The Department of Labor shall succeed to any contractual  
2 rights or responsibilities incurred by the Commission pertaining to  
3 wrecker and towing services.

4       D. The administrative rules related to wrecker and towing  
5 services previously promulgated by the Corporation Commission shall  
6 be transferred to and become a part of the administrative rules of  
7 the Department of Labor upon the effective date of this act. The  
8 Office of Administrative Rules in the Office of the Secretary of  
9 State shall provide adequate notice in "The Oklahoma Register" of  
10 the transferred rules and shall place the transferred rules under  
11 the Administrative Code section of the Department of Labor. On the  
12 effective date of this act, any amendment, repeal, or addition to  
13 the transferred rules shall be under the rulemaking authority of the  
14 Department of Labor.

15       E. Aside from rules promulgated by the Department of Public  
16 Safety pertaining to rotation logs and inspections of wrecker and  
17 towing facilities and equipment, the administrative rules previously  
18 promulgated by the Department of Public Safety shall be transferred  
19 to and become a part of the administrative rules of the Department  
20 of Labor upon the effective date of this act. The Office of  
21 Administrative Rules in the Office of the Secretary of State shall  
22 provide adequate notice in "The Oklahoma Register" of the  
23 transferred rules and shall place the transferred rules under the  
24 Administrative Code section of the Department of Labor. On the

1 effective date of this act, any amendment, repeal, or addition to  
2 the transferred rules shall be under the rulemaking authority of the  
3 Department of Labor.

4 F. The Department of Labor, the Corporation Commission, and the  
5 Department of Public Safety may enter into an agreement for the  
6 transfer of personnel, if any, from the Commission and Department of  
7 Public Safety to the Department of Labor. However, in no instance  
8 shall more than four employees receive transfers. No employee shall  
9 be transferred to the Department of Labor except on the freely given  
10 written consent of the employee. Any employees who are transferred  
11 to the Department of Labor shall not be required to accept a lesser  
12 grade or salary than presently received. All employees shall retain  
13 leave, sick, and annual time earned, and any retirement and  
14 longevity benefits which have accrued during their tenure with the  
15 Corporation Commission or the Department of Public Safety. The  
16 transfer of any personnel between the state agencies shall be  
17 coordinated with the Office of Management and Enterprise Services.

18 G. The Office of Management and Enterprise Services shall  
19 coordinate the transfer of records, property, equipment, assets,  
20 funds, allotments, purchase orders, liabilities, outstanding  
21 financial obligations, or encumbrances provided for in this section.

22 SECTION 2. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified  
23 in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 951.1 of Title 47, unless there  
24 is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:

1       A. There is hereby created the Oklahoma Wrecker and Towing  
2 Services Board which shall be the regulatory authority to the  
3 Oklahoma Wrecker Services Division created in Section 1 of this act.  
4 The Board shall be independent and shall consist of nine (9) members  
5 who shall initially serve staggered terms of membership with the  
6 Board. The initial staggered terms of membership of the Board shall  
7 be as follows:

8           1. One member appointed by the President Pro Tempore of the  
9 Oklahoma State Senate from the state at large whose membership shall  
10 expire June 30, 2028;

11           2. One member appointed by the Speaker of the Oklahoma House of  
12 Representatives from the state at large whose membership shall  
13 expire June 30, 2029;

14           3. One member holding a license or licensed by the Department  
15 of Labor to engage in nonconsensual towing who operates in a county  
16 with a population of one hundred thousand (100,000) or more,  
17 according to the latest Federal Decennial Census, shall be appointed  
18 by the President Pro Tempore of the Oklahoma State Senate and whose  
19 membership shall expire June 30, 2030;

20           4. One member holding a license or licensed by the Department  
21 of Labor to engage in nonconsensual towing who operates in a county  
22 with a population of less than one hundred thousand (100,000),  
23 according to the latest Federal Decennial Census, shall be appointed

1 by the Speaker of the House of Representatives and whose membership  
2 shall expire June 30, 2028;

3       5. One member from the Oklahoma Trucking Association shall be  
4 appointed by the Speaker of the Oklahoma House of Representatives  
5 and whose membership shall expire June 30, 2029;

6       6. One member from law enforcement shall be appointed by the  
7 Governor and whose membership shall expire June 30, 2030;

8       7. One member holding a license or licensed by the Department  
9 of Labor to engage in nonconsensual towing shall be appointed by the  
10 Governor and whose membership shall expire June 30, 2028;

11       8. One member from the commercial insurance industry shall be  
12 appointed by the Speaker Pro Tempore of the Oklahoma State Senate  
13 and whose membership shall expire June 30, 2029; and

14       9. One member from the Oklahoma Department of Transportation  
15 shall be appointed by the Governor and whose membership shall expire  
16 June 30, 2030.

17       Thereafter, persons appointed pursuant to paragraphs 1 through 9  
18 of this subsection shall be appointed for terms of three (3) years  
19 beginning July 1. Any vacancy shall be filled by the appointing  
20 authority for the remainder of the unexpired term.

21       B. Members appointed pursuant to paragraphs 3 through 9 of  
22 subsection A of this section shall remain engaged in the business or  
23 industry described in subsection A of this section. Members so  
24 appointed who no longer satisfy the requirements for his or her

1 Board position pursuant to subsection A of this section shall  
2 provide notification of his or her change of status to his or her  
3 appointing authority and to the chair of the Oklahoma Wrecker and  
4 Towing Services Board and shall resign from the Board within thirty  
5 (30) days of the date upon which the member no longer satisfies the  
6 requirements of the appointment.

7 C. The members shall determine by majority vote of the quorum  
8 of the Board who shall serve as chair. The chair shall be elected  
9 annually, with the right to succeed himself or herself, from the  
10 membership of the Board.

11 D. The Board shall meet at such times that the chair deems  
12 necessary, but no meeting shall be held outside the State of  
13 Oklahoma. All actions of the Board shall be by a quorum. Five  
14 members of the Board shall constitute a quorum for the purpose of  
15 transacting business. The Department of Labor shall provide  
16 administrative support and a meeting venue for the Board.

17 E. Nothing in this act shall be construed to authorize the  
18 Board to regulate consensual towing services, voluntary roadside  
19 assistance, or privately negotiated towing contracts. The Board  
20 shall promulgate rules to carry out its intent and shall regulate  
21 the wrecker and towing industry in this state, including:

22 1. Establishing reasonable tow rates for nonconsensual tows for  
23 any rates not tied to the federal per diem rate. "Reasonable tow  
24 rates" means rates that are directly related to the actual cost of

1 providing the nonconsensual tow, include a modest and customary  
2 margin, and do not exceed the maximum rates approved by the Board;

3       2. Establishing reasonable licensing, insurance, and equipment  
4 requirements for any person engaging in towing and related services;

5       3. Establishing reasonable tow truck safety requirements for  
6 any wrecker or wrecker vehicle as defined in Section 951 of Title 47  
7 of the Oklahoma Statutes;

8       4. Establishing a procedure to accept and investigate  
9 complaints from a consumer who claims that he or she has been  
10 overcharged for fees related to nonconsensual towing, recovery, or  
11 storage;

12       5. Determining and sanctioning excessive or unnecessary fees  
13 charged to consumers related to nonconsensual towing, recovery, or  
14 storage;

15       6. Requiring all entities permitted, licensed, or regulated by  
16 the Board to provide all documents in response to information  
17 requests by the Board pursuant to the investigation of consumer  
18 complaints or Board complaints against the permittee or licensee;

19       7. Requiring all entities permitted, licensed, or regulated by  
20 the Board to provide itemized billing for fees related to towing,  
21 storage, or vehicle immobilization services that explains how the  
22 charges were calculated;

23       8. Requiring all entities permitted, licensed, or regulated by  
24 the Board to maintain a copy of the current maximum rate schedule or

1 fee schedule established by the Board posted in a conspicuous place  
2 and readily accessible to the public;

3 9. Requiring all entities permitted, licensed, or regulated by  
4 the Board to allow the owner or agent of the owner of a motor  
5 vehicle removed pursuant to Section 951 et seq. of Title 47 of the  
6 Oklahoma Statutes to use any other entity permitted, licensed, or  
7 regulated by the Board when reclaiming the motor vehicle from  
8 storage;

9 10. Requiring all entities permitted, licensed, or regulated by  
10 the Board to post a sign notifying customers of the procedure to  
11 obtain a vehicle from storage and the consumer complaint process  
12 pursuant to Section 953.1 of Title 47 of the Oklahoma Statutes. The  
13 sign shall be in a conspicuous and central location in the public  
14 area and shall be a minimum of sixteen inches by twenty inches (16"  
15 x 20") in size. The Board may assess a fine of between Fifty  
16 Dollars (\$50.00) and Two Hundred Fifty Dollars (\$250.00) for failure  
17 to comply with the provisions of this paragraph;

18 11. Utilizing Oklahoma Wrecker Services Division investigators  
19 to investigate consumer complaints related to overcharging for  
20 nonconsensual towing, recovery, storage fees, and violations of the  
21 rules promulgated by the Board; and

22 12. Promulgation of rules setting standards for initial  
23 inspections of wrecker and towing facilities performed by the  
24

1      Department of Public Safety and standards and procedures for any  
2      additional inspections required by the Board.

3            F. Members of the Board shall serve without compensation, but  
4      shall be reimbursed through the Department of Labor for expenses  
5      incurred in the performance of his or her duties in accordance with  
6      the provisions of the State Travel Reimbursement Act.

7            G. Each member shall serve at the pleasure of his or her  
8      appointing authority and may be removed or replaced without cause.

9            H. The Board shall act in accordance with the provisions of the  
10     Oklahoma Open Records Act, the Oklahoma Open Meeting Act, and the  
11     Administrative Procedures Act.

12        SECTION 3.        NEW LAW        A new section of law to be codified  
13      in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 1003 of Title 40, unless there  
14      is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:

15            There is hereby created in the State Treasury a revolving fund  
16      for the Department of Labor, to be designated the "Oklahoma Wrecker  
17      and Towing Services Revolving Fund". The fund shall be a continuing  
18      fund not subject to fiscal year limitations. All monies accruing to  
19      the credit of the fund are hereby appropriated and shall be budgeted  
20      and expended by the Department of Labor for the purpose of  
21      administering the Oklahoma Wrecker Services Division. Expenditures  
22      from the fund shall be made upon warrants issued by the State  
23      Treasurer against claims filed as prescribed by law with the

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1 Director of the Office of Management and Enterprise Services for  
2 approval and payment.

3 SECTION 4. AMENDATORY 47 O.S. 2021, Section 156.1, as  
4 last amended by Section 55, Chapter 452, O.S.L. 2024 (47 O.S. Supp.  
5 2025, Section 156.1), is amended to read as follows:

6 Section 156.1. A. It shall be unlawful for any state official,  
7 officer or employee, except any essential employees approved by the  
8 Governor and those officers or employees authorized in subsection B  
9 of this section, to ride to or from the place of residence of the  
10 employee in a state-owned or state-leased automobile, truck or  
11 pickup, except in the performance of the official duty of the  
12 employee, or to use or permit the use of any such automobile, truck,  
13 ambulance or pickup for other personal or private purposes. Any  
14 person convicted of violating the provisions of this section shall  
15 be guilty of a misdemeanor and shall be punished by a fine of not  
16 more than One Hundred Dollars (\$100.00) or by imprisonment in the  
17 county jail for a period not to exceed thirty (30) days, or by both  
18 said fine and imprisonment, and in addition thereto, shall be  
19 discharged from state employment.

20 B. 1. Any state employee, other than the individuals provided  
21 for in paragraph 2 of this subsection and any employee of the  
22 Department of Public Safety who is a wrecker inspector ~~or auditor~~ of  
23 the Wrecker Services Division as provided for in paragraph 3 of this  
24 subsection, who receives emergency telephone calls regularly at the

1 | residence of the employee when the employee is not on duty and is  
2 | regularly called upon to use a vehicle after normal work hours in  
3 | response to such emergency calls, may be permitted to use a vehicle  
4 | belonging to the state to provide transportation between the  
5 | residence of the employee and the assigned place of employment,  
6 | provided such distance does not exceed seventy-five (75) miles in  
7 | any round trip or is within the county where the assigned place of  
8 | employment is located. Provided further, an employee may be  
9 | permitted to use a state-owned or state-leased vehicle to provide  
10 | temporary transportation between a specific work location other than  
11 | the assigned place of employment and the residence of the employee,  
12 | if such use shall result in a monetary saving to the agency, and  
13 | such authorization shall not be subject to the distance or area  
14 | restrictions provided for in this paragraph. Authorization for  
15 | temporary use of a state-owned or state-leased vehicle for a  
16 | specific project shall be in writing stating the justification for  
17 | this use and the saving expected to result. Such authorization  
18 | shall be valid for not to exceed sixty (60) days. Any state entity  
19 | other than law enforcement that avails itself of this provision  
20 | shall keep a monthly record of all participating employees, the  
21 | number of emergency calls received and the number of times that a  
22 | state vehicle was used in the performance of such emergency calls.

23 |       2. Any employee of the Department of Public Safety, Oklahoma  
24 |       Department of Corrections, Office of the Attorney General, Oklahoma

1 State Bureau of Narcotics and Dangerous Drugs Control, Oklahoma  
2 State Bureau of Investigation, Alcoholic Beverage Laws Enforcement  
3 Commission, Oklahoma Horse Racing Commission, Oklahoma Department of  
4 Agriculture, Food, and Forestry, Office of the Inspector General  
5 within the Department of Human Services or Office of the State Fire  
6 Marshal, who is a law enforcement officer or criminalist, Public  
7 Information officer, Special Investigator or Assistant Director of  
8 the Oklahoma State Bureau of Investigation, the Executive Director  
9 of CLEET, CLEET-certified Investigator for a state board or any  
10 employee of a district attorney who is a law enforcement officer,  
11 may be permitted to use a state-owned or state-leased vehicle to  
12 provide transportation between the residence of the employee and the  
13 assigned place of employment and between the residence and any  
14 location other than the assigned place of employment to which the  
15 employee travels in the performance of the official duty of the  
16 employee.

17       3. Any employee of the Department of Public Safety who is a  
18 wrecker inspector ~~or auditor~~ of the Wrecker Services Division, or a  
19 noncommissioned pilot may be permitted, as determined by the  
20 Commissioner, to use a state-owned or state-leased vehicle to  
21 provide transportation between the residence of the employee and the  
22 assigned place of employment and between the residence and any  
23 location other than the assigned place of employment to which the  
24

1 employee travels in the performance of the official duty of the  
2 employee.

3       4. The Director, department heads and other essential employees  
4 of the Department of Wildlife Conservation, as authorized by the  
5 Wildlife Conservation Commission, may be permitted to use a state-  
6 owned or state-leased vehicle to provide transportation between the  
7 residence of the employee and the assigned place of employment and  
8 between the residence and any location other than the assigned place  
9 of employment to which the employee travels in the performance of  
10 the official duty of the employee.

11       5. The Director, department heads, emergency responders and  
12 other essential employees of the Department of Corrections, as  
13 authorized by the Director, may be permitted to use a state-owned or  
14 state-leased vehicle to provide transportation between the residence  
15 of the employee and the assigned place of employment and between the  
16 residence and any location other than the assigned place of  
17 employment to which the employee travels in the performance of the  
18 official duty of the employee.

19       6. Designated Examiner Auditors, Designated Examiner  
20 Supervisors, Commercial Driver License Examiners, Commercial Driver  
21 License Auditors, Commercial Driver License Supervisors, and Driver  
22 License Supervisors, as an employee of Service Oklahoma may be  
23 permitted, as determined by the Director of Service Oklahoma, to use  
24 a state-owned or state-leased vehicle to provide transportation

1 between the residence of the employee and the assigned place of  
2 employment and between the residence and any location other than the  
3 assigned place.

4       7. The Attorney General, division heads, emergency responders,  
5 agents, assistant attorneys general, and other essential employees  
6 of the Office of the Attorney General, as authorized by the Attorney  
7 General, may be permitted to use a state-owned or state-leased  
8 vehicle to provide transportation between the residence of the  
9 employee and the assigned place of employment and between the  
10 residence and any location other than the assigned place of  
11 employment to which the employee travels in the performance of the  
12 official duty of the employee.

13       C. The principal administrator of the state agency with which  
14 the employee is employed shall so designate the status of the  
15 employee in writing or provide a copy of the temporary authorization  
16 to the Governor, the President Pro Tempore of the Senate and the  
17 Speaker of the House of Representatives. Such employee status  
18 report shall also be provided to the State Fleet Manager of the  
19 Division of Fleet Management if the motor vehicle for emergency use  
20 is provided by said Division.

21       SECTION 5.       AMENDATORY       47 O.S. 2021, Section 904, is  
22 amended to read as follows:

23       Section 904. The owner of a motor vehicle or lienholder of the

1 or the owner of any vehicle or lienholder of the vehicle or insurer  
2 accepting liability for paying a claim on a vehicle or purchasing  
3 the vehicle as a total loss vehicle from the registered owner which  
4 shall have been lawfully removed from any highway or other public  
5 property may regain possession of the vehicle in accordance with  
6 regulations of the Department of ~~Public Safety~~ Labor upon payment of  
7 the reasonable cost of removal and storage of such vehicle. The  
8 operator is authorized to collect all lawful fees from the owner,  
9 lienholder that seeks possession of a vehicle under a security  
10 interest, agent, or insurer accepting liability for paying the claim  
11 for a vehicle or purchasing the vehicle as a total loss vehicle from  
12 the registered owner of the towed vehicle for the performance of any  
13 and all such services. An operator shall release the vehicle from  
14 storage upon authorization from the owner, agent or lienholder of  
15 the vehicle or in the case of a total loss, the insurer accepting  
16 liability for paying the claim on the vehicle or purchasing the  
17 vehicle where the vehicle is to be moved to an insurance pool yard  
18 for sale. In the case of death or incapacitation of the owner of a  
19 motor vehicle, the operator may release the vehicle to a legal  
20 representative or an immediate family member who is within the first

22 representative or family member shall provide a notarized affidavit

9 1. "Wrecker or wrecker vehicle" means any motor vehicle that is  
10 equipped with any device designed to tow another vehicle or  
11 combination of vehicles. The use of the term "wrecker" or "wrecker  
12 vehicle" shall be construed to include a combination wrecker or  
13 combination wrecker vehicle, as defined in paragraph 2 of this

  - (2) through Oklahoma in transit to another state; provided, the out-of-state wrecker service shall comply with all other requirements regarding interstate commerce as set forth in law;

1 roadway for public safety or public convenience, or accidents, by  
2 any law enforcement officer or property agent or removal from public  
3 or private property as a result of abandonment or unauthorized  
4 parking by the property owner, agent, possessor, or other legal  
5 entity for the property owner;

6 11. 10. "Operator" means any person owning or operating a  
7 wrecker vehicle or wrecker or towing service;

8 12. 11. "Officer" means any duly authorized law enforcement  
9 officer;

10 13. 12. "Roadway" means any public street, road, highway or  
11 turnpike or the median, easement or shoulder of a roadway;

12 14. 13. "Service call" means the act of responding to a request  
13 for service with a wrecker vehicle in which a service is performed;

5 which shall be performed by the Department of Public Safety, the

9       B. The ~~Department of Public Safety~~ Labor, through the Oklahoma

4 AA wrecker service on the Highway Patrol Rotation Log in a highway

8 Safety. Upon further request of the wrecker service, the  
9 Commissioner of Public Safety or the Department of Public Safety

17       D. ~~Distance rates.~~

18       1. ~~Rates in this subsection shall apply to the distance the~~  
19 ~~towed vehicle is transported and shall include services of the~~  
20 ~~operator of the wrecker vehicle. Hourly rates, as provided in~~  
21 ~~subsection E of this section, may be applied in lieu of distance~~  
22 ~~rates. Hourly rates may be applied from the time the wrecker~~  
23 ~~vehicle is assigned to the service call until the time it is~~  
24 ~~released from service either upon return to the premises of the~~

1   wrecker or towing service or upon being assigned to perform another  
2   wrecker or towing service, whichever occurs first. When the hourly  
3   rate is applied in lieu of distance towing rates, the operator may

17                   E. Hourly Rates.

18                   1. Rates in this subsection shall apply for the use of a  
19                   wrecker vehicle and shall include services of the operator of such  
20                   wrecker, except as provided in paragraph 4 of this subsection.  
21                   Rates shall apply for all wrecker or towing services performed that  
22                   are not otherwise provided for in this section, including, but not  
23                   limited to, waiting and standby time, but shall not include the  
24                   first fifteen (15) minutes of service following the hookup of a

1 vehicle when a hookup fee is assessed, as provided in subsection F  
2 of this section.

3 Hourly rates shall apply from the time the vehicle or labor is  
4 assigned to the service call until the time it is released from  
5 service either upon return to the premises of the wrecker or towing  
6 service or upon being assigned to perform another wrecker or towing  
7 service, whichever occurs first. Whenever a wrecker vehicle is used  
8 to tow a vehicle subject to distance rates, as provided in

32       4. a. Maximum hourly rates for extra labor shall be Thirty  
 33       Dollars (\$30.00) per person per hour.

34       b. Maximum hourly rates for skilled or specialized labor  
 35       and/or equipment shall be the actual customary and  
 36       ordinary rates charged for such labor and/or  
 37       equipment. When skilled or specialized labor or  
 38       equipment is required, the wrecker operator's cost for

such skilled or specialized labor or equipment plus a twenty-five percent (25%) gross profit markup to cover overhead costs for such labor will be added to the invoice or freight bill to be collected in addition to all other applicable charges.

#### F. Hookup Rates.

7       1. Rates in this subsection shall apply to the hookup of a  
8       vehicle to a wrecker vehicle when such hookup is performed in  
9       connection with a wrecker or towing service described in this  
10      section. Such hookup rate shall include the first fifteen (15)  
11      minutes of such service, for which there shall be no additional fee  
12      charged, but shall not include the use of a dolly or rollback  
13      equipment or a combination wrecker vehicle to accomplish such  
14      hookup, for which an additional fee may be charged as provided in  
15      subsection C of this section. Hookup shall include, but not be  
16      limited to, the attachment of a vehicle to or the loading of a  
17      vehicle onto a wrecker vehicle.

3       G. Additional Service Rates.

4       1. Rates in this subsection shall apply to the performance of  
5       the following services:

- 6       a. the disconnection and reconnection of a towed  
7               vehicle's drive line when necessary to prevent  
8               mechanical damage to such vehicle,
- 9       b. the removal and replacement of a towed vehicle's axle  
10              when necessary to prevent mechanical damage to such  
11              vehicle, or
- 12       c. the use of a dolly or rollback equipment when  
13              essential to prevent mechanical damage to a towed  
14              vehicle or when neither end of such vehicle is capable  
15              of being towed safely while in contact with the  
16              roadway.

H. C. An operator shall be required to provide reasonable

4 documentation to the Department of Labor to substantiate all lawful  
5 fees charged the owner, lienholder, agent or insurer paying the  
6 claim for the towed vehicle. Fees for which the operator is being  
7 reimbursed or having paid to a third party, shall include copies of  
8 the invoice or other appropriate documents to substantiate such  
9 payment to said third party.

I. Wrecker fees, including maximum distance, hourly, and hookup

11 rates shall be adjusted weekly by adding a fuel surcharge as  
12 provided in this section. The fuel surcharge shall be based on the  
13 Department of Energy "weekly retail on-highway diesel prices" for  
14 the "Midwest region" using Two Dollars (\$2.00) per gallon as the  
15 base price with no fees added. The wrecker fees shall be adjusted  
16 to allow a one-percent increase in fees for every ten-cent increase  
17 in fuel cost starting at Two Dollars and ten cents (\$2.10) per  
18 gallon.

J. When skilled or specialized labor or equipment is required,

20 the cost incurred by the wrecker operator for such skilled or  
21 specialized labor or equipment plus an additional twenty-five

23 allowed to cover overhead costs for such labor and will be added to  
24 the invoice or freight bill to be collected in addition to all other

1 ~~applicable charges. This applies to labor and equipment not~~  
2 ~~regulated by the Commission~~

3 D. Wrecker or towing service companies shall provide the  
4 Department of Labor a detailed comprehensive list of all prices for  
5 the services performed related to the towing and storage of any  
6 vehicle that is deemed a nonconsensual tow. The list shall be on  
7 the letterhead of the wrecker or towing service company. The  
8 wrecker or towing service company shall be responsible for updating  
9 the list when prices change by submitting a new price list  
10 biannually, on January 1 and July 1 of each calendar year, and shall  
11 contain the date when new prices will take effect. The wrecker or  
12 towing service company shall not exceed the prices on file with the  
13 Department of Labor for a nonconsensual tow. The wrecker or towing  
14 service company shall only charge for services that are on file with  
15 the Department of Labor. All prices provided to the Department of  
16 Labor may be provided to citizens needing a wrecker or towing  
17 service. No other rates will be allowed apart from the prices  
18 provided to the Department of Labor and shall include, but may not  
19 be limited to:

20 1. Indoor storage rates;  
21 2. Outdoor storage rates;  
22 3. Specialized storage rates including, but not limited to,  
23 vehicle storage;  
24 4. Hourly rates;

1       5. Additional labor rates;  
2       6. Specialized equipment rates;  
3       7. After-hours release rates;  
4       8. Distance rates; and  
5       9. Hookup rates.

6       E. Rates and Charges Requirements.

7       1. A wrecker or towing service company receiving calls for  
8       service from a law enforcement agency shall not charge fees in  
9       excess of those provided in writing by the wrecker or towing service  
10       company to the Department of Labor, nor shall said company charge  
11       for the use of equipment and personnel not reasonably necessary to  
12       perform the requested services in a timely and professional manner.

13       2. Storage fees shall be reasonable, as determined by fees  
14       charged by other wrecker or towing service companies in the same  
15       geographic area. A list of fees shall be given to the Department of  
16       Labor in accordance with subsection D of this section. Consumer  
17       charges shall not deviate from the list provided.

18       3. Fuel surcharge shall be based on the Department of Energy's  
19       Energy Information Administration's "weekly on-highway diesel fuel  
20       prices" for the Midwest region using Two Dollars (\$2.00) per gallon  
21       as a base price with no fees added. The fuel surcharge fee shall be  
22       adjusted to allow a one-percent increase in fuel cost starting at  
23       Two Dollars and ten cents (\$2.10) per gallon.

1       4. Any wrecker or towing service company that subcontracts for  
2       the utilization of additional skilled or specialized labor,  
3       equipment, or a wrecker vehicle that is for the purpose of a  
4       nonconsensual tow, the cost incurred by the wrecker or towing  
5       service company for such skilled or specialized labor, equipment, or  
6       wrecker vehicle plus an additional twenty-five percent (25%) gross  
7       profit markup or gross profit margin shall be allowed to cover  
8       overhead costs for such labor and will be added to the invoice or  
9       freight bill to be collected in addition to all other applicable  
10      charges.

11       5. Wrecker or towing service companies shall post at their  
12      place of business a list of all prices for the standard services it  
13      performs related to the towing and storage of any vehicle that is  
14      deemed a nonconsensual tow.

15       6. Whenever complaints are received by the Department of Labor  
16      concerning the services provided or fees charged for towing and  
17      related services that are requested through the Department of Labor,  
18      the complaint shall be investigated to determine its validity and  
19      whether any action is warranted against the wrecker or towing  
20      service company.

21       7. Any wrecker or towing services company found to have  
22      exceeded the prices provided to the Department of Labor, using  
23      unnecessary services to increase its fee, or engaging in unethical  
24      business practices shall be subject to contempt proceedings before

1 the Oklahoma Wrecker and Towing Services Board and removal from the  
2 towing rotation log by the troop commander.

3 8. The Department of Labor shall communicate with any wrecker  
4 or towing service company the filing rates and state whether the  
5 rates have been accepted or rejected. If the Department of Labor  
6 rejects rates, it shall state why it did so and provide the  
7 opportunity for appeal and resubmission of rates.

8 9. Rates established by the Department of Labor, through the  
9 Board, shall remain in effect until a wrecker or towing service  
10 company files rates with the Department of Labor and those rates are  
11 accepted.

12 10. The Department of Labor, through the Oklahoma Wrecker and  
13 Towing Services Board, shall promulgate rules for the acceptance and  
14 enforcement of rates.

15 F. 1. If the Department of Labor opens a complaint, it shall  
16 review the current price list provided to the Department of Labor by  
17 the wrecker or towing service company in question, and determine  
18 whether fees charged for a nonconsensual tow have been exceeded.

19 2. If fees charged for a nonconsensual tow do not exceed the  
20 current price list provided to the Department of Labor, the  
21 Department of Labor may review fees charged with those lists of  
22 prices provided to the Department of Labor by other licensed wrecker  
23 and towing service companies that are located in the same geographic  
24 area. Geographic areas of the state shall consist of four regions

1    separated east and west by Interstate 35, and north and south by  
2    Interstate 40. If the fees charged by the wrecker and towing  
3    service company that are being reviewed by the Department of Labor,  
4    due to a complaint, exceed by more than thirty-five percent (35%) of  
5    the current listed price of service or equipment of other licensed  
6    wrecker or towing service companies in the same geographic area, the  
7    Department of Labor shall determine the complaint as valid and  
8    prohibit said wrecker or towing service company from collecting any  
9    payments that exceed the thirty-five-percent threshold mentioned in  
10   this paragraph. If a wrecker or towing service company has already  
11   collected monies exceeding the thirty-five-percent threshold, the  
12   wrecker or towing service company shall be required to return all  
13   amounts exceeding the thirty-five-percent threshold mentioned in  
14   this paragraph.

15    3. The Department of Labor shall only bring a charge against a  
16   wrecker or towing service company for rates charged or equipment  
17   utilized if a complaint has been filed with the Department of Labor  
18   by a third party such as the:

- 19    a. owner or lien holder of the vehicle, or  
20    b. insurer of the vehicle.

21    G. 1. Where a wrecker or towing service company on a rotation  
22   log seeks to dispute an action of the Department of Labor due to an  
23   order regarding a complaint, the wrecker or towing service company  
24   shall be provided a process by which an appeal may be made regarding

1 inappropriate fees charged for a service or utilization of equipment  
2 related to a nonconsensual tow, or the removal of said wrecker or  
3 towing service company from the rotation log.

4 2. The Department of Labor shall allow the wrecker or towing  
5 service company to appeal a determination by submitting supporting  
6 documentation. Once supporting documentation has been provided, the  
7 Department of Labor shall make a determination of whether the  
8 Department of Labor's action against the wrecker or towing service  
9 company stands, or if the supporting documentation shows the  
10 Department of Labor erred in its determination against the wrecker  
11 or towing service company. If the Department of Labor errs  
12 regarding its action against a wrecker or towing service company,  
13 said company shall be entitled to collect any monies prohibited by  
14 the Department of Labor.

15 H. The Department of Labor shall issue a corrective action plan  
16 to any wrecker or towing service found to be in violation of the law  
17 governing wrecker or towing services or deny, cancel, suspend, or  
18 revoke the license of any wrecker or towing service found to be in  
19 noncompliance with the law governing the wrecker or towing service.

20 K. I. Wrecker operators shall be allowed to obtain ownership  
21 and insurer information, including accident reports and other public  
22 records, from the ~~Service~~ Oklahoma Tax Commission or other states'  
23 motor vehicle agencies or from law enforcement agencies for the  
24 purpose of determining ownership and responsibility for wrecker

1 fees. In the event a state of origin is not known, the Department  
2 of Public Safety and ~~the Service~~ Oklahoma ~~Tax Commission~~ shall  
3 assist in providing such information. The wrecker operator is  
4 authorized to collect lawful fees for such costs and services from  
5 the owner, ~~or~~ lienholder that seeks possession of a vehicle under a  
6 security interest, agent, or insurer accepting liability for paying  
7 the claim for a vehicle or purchasing the vehicle as a total loss  
8 vehicle from the owner of any towed or stored vehicle.

9 SECTION 10. AMENDATORY 47 O.S. 2021, Section 953.2, as  
10 amended by Section 1, Chapter 316, O.S.L. 2023 (47 O.S. Supp. 2025,  
11 Section 953.2), is amended to read as follows:

12 Section 953.2. A. The rates established by ~~order of the~~  
13 ~~Corporation Commission~~ the Oklahoma Wrecker and Towing Services  
14 Board shall determine the maximum fees and charges for the storage  
15 and after-hours release of nonconsensual towed vehicles, including  
16 incorporated and unincorporated areas, by a wrecker or towing  
17 service licensed by the Department of ~~Public Safety~~ Labor and repair  
18 facilities as defined in Section 953 of Title 15 of the Oklahoma  
19 Statutes. No wrecker or towing service or repair facilities shall

11 Rates shall apply to each calendar day of outdoor storage; provided,  
12 the maximum twenty-four hour fee, as provided for in this section,  
13 may be charged for any towed vehicle which is stored for a portion

## E. Indoor Storage Rates.

8       1. Rates in this subsection shall apply to the indoor storage  
9       of a towed vehicle. Rates may be applied from the time the towed  
10      vehicle is brought into the indoor storage facility premises. Rates  
11      shall apply to each calendar day of indoor storage; provided, the  
12      maximum twenty four hour fee, as provided for in this section, may  
13      be charged for any towed vehicle which is stored for a portion of a  
14      twenty-four hour period.

3. For purposes of this subsection, "indoor storage" means the vehicle is kept in an enclosed facility.

F. After-Hours Release Rate.

1. The rate in this subsection shall apply to the release of a  
vehicle to the owner, lienholder, or agent when such release  
is at a time other than normal business hours.

2. As used in this subsection:

a. "after-hours release rate"

1. "After-hours release rate" shall mean the rate charged for release of a towed vehicle between the hours of midnight and 6 a.m., or between the hours of 4:00 p.m. and midnight Monday through Friday, or any time on Saturday, Sunday or a national holiday; and

b. ~~"national holiday"~~

2. "National holiday" shall mean New Year's Day, Martin Luther King Day, George Washington's Birthday, on the third Monday in February, Memorial Day, Independence Day, Labor Day, Veterans Day, Thanksgiving Day and Christmas Day any holiday observed for which

1 federal or Oklahoma State offices are closed, and shall further  
2 include the Friday before such national holiday which falls on a  
3 Saturday and the Monday following such national holiday which falls  
4 on a Sunday.

5 ~~3. The maximum after hours release rate shall be Fifteen~~  
6 ~~Dollars (\$15.00) per quarter hour for the release of any single~~  
7 ~~vehicle or combination of vehicles.~~

8 E. D. An operator or repair facility shall be required to  
9 provide reasonable documentation to substantiate all lawful fees  
10 charged to the owner, lienholder, agent or insurer accepting  
11 liability for paying the claim for the towed vehicle or purchasing  
12 the towed vehicle. Fees for which the operator or repair facility  
13 is being reimbursed, or having paid to a third party, shall include  
14 copies of the invoice or other appropriate documents to substantiate  
15 the payment to the third party.

16 SECTION 11. AMENDATORY 47 O.S. 2021, Section 954, is  
17 amended to read as follows:

18 Section 954. A. The Department of ~~Public Safety~~ Labor shall be  
19 charged with the duty of enforcing the provisions of Section 951 et  
20 seq. of this title for licensed wreckers and towing services  
21 operating in this state.

22 B. Duly appointed peace officers of the political subdivisions  
23 of this state shall have authority to detain and arrest any person  
24 operating a wrecker or tow truck or offering towing services to the

1 public for a charge without a valid license issued pursuant to the  
2 provisions of Section 951 et seq. of this title. Such officers,  
3 upon reasonable belief that any wrecker or tow truck is being  
4 operated without proper authority or without a valid license issued

21       D. The ~~Department~~ Board shall design and promulgate a suitable  
22 Tow Request and Authorization Form containing space for the  
23 following information:

1       1. A description of the vehicle, including the type of vehicle,  
2 year of manufacture, name of the manufacturer, vehicle color or  
3 colors, identification number and license tag number;

4       2. The name, address and business telephone number of the  
5 licensed Class AA wrecker service;

6       3. The name, address, telephone number and driver license  
7 number or state-issued identification card number of the real  
8 property owner, legal possessor or authorized agent;

9       4. Inventory of personal property within the vehicle to be  
10 towed;

11       5. Time and date the form is completed; and

12       6. Signatures of the driver of the wrecker vehicle and of the

16       The driver license number or state-issued identification card number

22       E. The real property owner, legal possessor or authorized agent

3      an inventory cannot be completed, the reasons therefor shall be

5              F. A copy of the completed Tow Request and Authorization Form

5    ascertain ownership, if needed. The licensed Class AA wrecker  
6    service shall, within seven (7) days from receipt of the requested

8    ~~license agent~~ licensed operator, send a notice of the location of  
9    the vehicle by certified mail, or if by Department of Labor  
10   notification, the Department of Labor may notify by first-class

13   possession of the vehicle in accordance with rules of the Department

20        H. No licensed Class AA wrecker service or operator of a  
21   licensed Class AA wrecker service shall tow or cause to be towed a  
22   vehicle pursuant to this section until the form furnished by the  
23   Department of Labor has been appropriately completed by the parties  
24   as required by rules of the Department of Labor.

1 SECTION 13. AMENDATORY 47 O.S. 2021, Section 955, as  
2 amended by Section 12, Chapter 228, O.S.L. 2022 (47 O.S. Supp. 2025,  
3 Section 955), is amended to read as follows:

4 Section 955. A. Any officer of the Department of Public Safety  
5 or any other political subdivision of this state is hereby  
6 authorized to cause to be towed any vehicle found upon public roads,  
7 highways, streets, turnpikes, private parking lots accessible to the  
8 public, other public places or upon any private road, street, alley  
9 or lane which provides access to one or more single-family or  
10 multifamily dwellings when:

11 1. A report has been made that the vehicle has been stolen or  
12 taken without the consent of its owner;

13 2. The officer has reason to believe the vehicle has been  
14 abandoned as defined in Sections 901 and 902 of this title;

15 3. The person driving or in control of the vehicle is arrested  
16 for an alleged offense for which the officer is required by law to  
17 take the person arrested or summoned before a proper magistrate  
18 without unnecessary delay;

19 4. At the scene of an accident, if the owner or driver is not  
20 in a position to take charge of the vehicle and direct or request  
21 its proper removal;

22 5. The officer has probable cause that the person operating the  
23 vehicle has not been granted driving privileges or that the driving

1      privileges of the person are currently suspended, revoked, canceled,  
2      denied, or disqualified;

3            6. The officer has probable cause that the vehicle has been  
4      used in the commission of a felony offense and the officer has  
5      obtained a search warrant authorizing the search and seizure of the  
6      vehicle;

7            7. The officer has probable cause that the vehicle is not  
8      insured as required by the Compulsory Insurance Law of this state;  
9      or

10           8. The vehicle is involved in a fatal motor vehicle collision  
11      and is needed for evidentiary purposes; or

12           9. A vehicle is left unattended upon any street, sidewalk,  
13      alley or thoroughfare and constitutes a hazard or obstruction to the  
14      normal movement of public transit along a rail fixed guideway. An  
15      unattended vehicle shall be deemed to constitute an obstruction if  
16      any portion of the vehicle remains in that lane utilized for the  
17      rail fixed guideway as designated by traffic lane markings or if any  
18      portion of the vehicle is outside of the designated parking location  
19      and protrudes into the lane of traffic utilized for the rail fixed  
20      guideway. For purposes of this paragraph, the head of a political  
21      subdivision's transportation division may authorize employees to  
22      cause to be towed any vehicle which constitutes a hazard or  
23      obstruction to the normal movement of public transit along a rail  
24      fixed guideway.

1       No vehicle shall be released after impoundment unless the owner  
2 provides to the storing facility proof of valid insurance or an  
3 affidavit of nonuse on the roadway, or in the event of a release  
4 request from an insurer or the representative of the insurer who has  
5 accepted liability for the vehicle, no such proof of insurance or  
6 affidavit of nonuse on the roadway shall be required.

7       B. A licensed wrecker operator is not liable for damage to a  
8 vehicle, vessel, or cargo that obstructs the normal movement of  
9 traffic or creates a hazard to traffic and is removed in compliance  
10 with the request of a law enforcement officer, unless there is  
11 failure to exercise reasonable care in the performance of the act or  
12 for conduct that is willful or malicious.

13       C. Each officer of the Department shall use the services of the  
14 licensed wrecker operator whose location is nearest to the vehicle  
15 to be towed in all instances in subsection A of this section. The  
16 requests for services may be alternated or rotated among all  
17 licensed wrecker operators who are located within a reasonable  
18 radius of each other. In like manner, the officer shall advise any  
19 person requesting information as to the availability of a wrecker or  
20 towing service, the name of the nearest licensed wrecker operator,  
21 giving equal consideration to all licensed wrecker operators located  
22 within a reasonable radius of each other. In cities with a  
23 population of less than fifty thousand (50,000) population, all  
24 licensed wrecker operators located near or in the city limits of

1 such cities shall be considered as being equal distance and shall be  
2 called on an equal basis as nearly as possible. In counties  
3 bordering other states, if the officer deems safety and time  
4 considerations warrant, the officer may call a wrecker or towing  
5 service that is not on the rotation log.

6 D. Any officer of the Department who has been requested by a  
7 person in need of wrecker or towing service to call a specific  
8 wrecker or towing service for such person, and who calls a different  
9 wrecker or towing service other than the one requested, without the  
10 consent of the person, except where hazardous conditions exist,  
11 shall be subject to progressive discipline issued by the Department  
12 except in instances where a vehicle is removed from the roadway  
13 under the authority of paragraphs 3, 4 and 6 of subsection A of this  
14 section.

15 E. Operators conducting a tow under this section shall release  
16 all personal property within the vehicle to an insurer or  
17 representative of the insurer who has accepted liability for the  
18 vehicle, or to the registered owner or the owner's personal  
19 representative as designated by the registered owner on a form  
20 approved by the Department of Labor. The registered owner or  
21 representative of the registered owner shall provide proof of  
22 identity in accordance with the ~~Department's~~ Department of Labor's  
23 rules related to establishing identity. Upon the release of  
24 personal property to an insurer or representative of the insurer,

1      wrecker operators shall be exempt from all liability and shall be  
2      held harmless for any losses or claims of loss. Personal property  
3      shall include everything in a vehicle except the vehicle, the  
4      attached or installed equipment, vehicle keys or devices to start  
5      and unlock the vehicle, and the spare tire and tools to change the  
6      tire. Interlock devices may be removed pursuant to Section 11-902a  
7      of this title. If release of personal property occurs during normal  
8      business hours as prescribed by the ~~Corporation Commission~~  
9      Department of Labor, it shall be at no cost to the registered owner  
10     or the owner prior to the repossession. After-hour fees may be  
11     assessed as prescribed by ~~this Chapter or by the Corporation~~  
12     ~~Commission~~ the Department of Labor, when the release of property is  
13     made after the prescribed normal business hours.

14       F. The operator of a wrecker or towing service may request a  
15     person offering proof of ownership of personal property and any  
16     interlock device to execute a form provided by the operator  
17     exempting the operator from liability for such release.

18       SECTION 14.      AMENDATORY      47 O.S. 2021, Section 956, is  
19     amended to read as follows:

20       Section 956. A. No operator, employee, or contractor of a  
21     wrecker or towing service or of a person or business that derives  
22     any business or income from a wrecker or towing service shall offer,  
23     and no officer or employee of the ~~Corporation Commission, Department~~  
24     of Labor or the Department of Public Safety or any political

1 subdivision of the state shall accept, directly or indirectly, any  
2 compensation, gift, loan, favor or service given for the purpose of  
3 influencing the officer or employee in the discharge of official  
4 duties of the person.

5       B. Except as provided in subsection C of this section, no  
6 employee of the Department of Labor, officer of the Commission,  
7 Department of Public Safety or any law enforcement officer of any  
8 political subdivision of the state shall have any interest,  
9 financial or otherwise, in a wrecker or towing service, or with a  
10 person or in a business that derives business or income from a  
11 wrecker or towing service, nor shall a wrecker or towing service or  
12 a person or business that derives any business or income from a  
13 wrecker or towing service employ such officer or employee.

14       C. An employee of the Department of Labor, officer of the  
15 Commission, Department of Public Safety, or a law enforcement  
16 officer of any political subdivision may have an interest, financial  
17 or otherwise, in or may be employed by a wrecker or towing service  
18 when the sole purpose and only business of the wrecker or towing  
19 service is to perform repossession of vehicles which are subject to  
20 lien and are being repossessed by the lien holder of record.

21       SECTION 15.       AMENDATORY       47 O.S. 2021, Section 966, is  
22 amended to read as follows:

23       Section 966. A. This act shall be known and may be cited as  
24 the "Nonconsensual Towing Act of 2011".

1       B. The provisions of this act shall apply to every wrecker  
2 operating within the State of Oklahoma removing and storing vehicles  
3 from Oklahoma roads and highways or private property as a result of  
4 a nonconsensual tow.

5       C. ~~The Corporation Commission, by Commission order, Department~~  
6 of Labor, through the Oklahoma Wrecker and Towing Services Board,  
7 shall have the power and authority necessary:

8       1. To establish wrecker rates for the transportation and  
9 storage of motor vehicles removed due to a nonconsensual tow from  
10 Oklahoma roads and highways or private property for any rates not  
11 tied to the federal per diem rate;

12       2. To supervise and enforce such rates; and  
13       3. To mediate and adjudicate complaints that may arise from  
14 charges assessed as a result of such vehicle removal.

15       D. Rates as specified ~~in Sections 953.1 and 953.2 of Title 47~~  
16 ~~of the Oklahoma Statutes by the Oklahoma Corporation Commission~~  
17 shall remain in effect until rates are established by ~~order of the~~  
18 ~~Commission the Board.~~

19       E. Rates established by the ~~Commission~~ Board shall be fair and  
20 reasonable.

21       F. The ~~Commission~~ Board may assess fines or other penalties to  
22 any wrecker or towing service for failure to comply with prescribed  
23 rates as established by the ~~Commission~~ Board, failure to pay a  
24 levied assessment or comply with any applicable ~~order of the~~

1 | ~~Commission rule of the Board.~~ Repeat violations by a wrecker or  
2 | towing service are cause for revocation of its license issued by the  
3 | ~~Department of Public Safety Labor.~~

4 | G. The Department of Public Safety shall cooperate with the  
5 | ~~Commission Department of Labor~~ to implement this act and may enter  
6 | into agreements to facilitate this act.

7 | SECTION 16. AMENDATORY 47 O.S. 2021, Section 967, is  
8 | amended to read as follows:

9 | Section 967. A. The ~~Corporation Commission~~ Department of Labor  
10 | is hereby authorized to assess a fee upon each wrecker or towing  
11 | service licensed by the Department of ~~Public Safety Labor~~ and placed  
12 | upon an official rotation log, as specified in Section 952 of ~~Title~~  
13 | ~~47 of the Oklahoma Statutes this title,~~ to perform nonconsensual  
14 | tows.

15 | B. Each wrecker or towing service shall pay the assessment,  
16 | levied pursuant to this section, on an annual basis.

17 | C. The assessment shall be predicated upon the number of

6      E. ~~Beginning fiscal year 2013, the~~ The Legislature shall

7      establish budgetary limits for the ~~Commission~~ Department of Labor to

8      fulfill the duties of the Nonconsensual Towing Act of 2011. The

9      total assessments levied pursuant to this section shall not exceed

10     the amount of the budgetary limits and indirect costs for related

11     support functions established by the Legislature for any fiscal

12     year. Annual budgetary limits shall stay in effect unless

13     superseded by action of the Legislature.

14     SECTION 17.      AMENDATORY      47 O.S. 2021, Section 968, is

15     amended to read as follows:

16     Section 968. ~~The Corporation Commission~~ Department of Labor is

17     authorized to appoint unclassified employees to perform the duties

18     and responsibilities associated with the Nonconsensual Towing Act of

19     2011.

20     SECTION 18. This act shall become effective November 1, 2026.
