7 PROPOSED POLICY COMMITTEE SUBSTITUTE

8 An Act relating to artificial intelligence education;  
9 creating the Oklahoma AI Education Innovation Act;  
10 creating the Oklahoma AI Education Innovation  
11 Revolving Fund; providing funding sources;  
12 establishing the Office of Management and Enterprise  
13 Services as the agency to distribute funds;  
14 establishing how often funds shall be distributed;  
15 providing allowable uses of funds by agencies;  
16 clarifying monies are limited to specified purposes;  
17 establishing that monies not expended shall remain  
18 with receiving agencies; requiring annual submission  
19 of report; directing the State Treasurer to maintain  
20 separate accounts; creating the Oklahoma AI Education  
21 Advisory Council; providing the membership of  
22 Council; providing terms of office for members of the  
23 Council; exempting members from dual office holding  
24 prohibition; clarifying members shall receive no  
compensation other than necessary travel expenses;  
providing the powers and duties of the Council;  
clarifying limitations of Council's power; directing  
the Council to submit annual report; directing the  
Council to meet at least quarterly; requiring the  
election of a chair and vice-chair; establishing that  
a majority of members constitutes a quorum;  
permitting the establishment of subcommittees;  
clarifying all meetings are subject to the Oklahoma  
Open Meeting Act; directing agencies to provide  
staffing support; making an appropriation; providing  
for severability; providing for codification;  
providing an effective date; and declaring an  
emergency.

1 BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:

2 SECTION 1. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified  
3 in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 200 of Title 75A, unless there  
4 is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:

5 This act shall be known and may be cited as the "Oklahoma AI  
6 Education Innovation Act".

7 SECTION 2. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified  
8 in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 201 of Title 75A, unless there  
9 is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:

10 A. There is hereby created in the State Treasury a revolving  
11 fund to be designated the "Oklahoma AI Education Innovation  
12 Revolving Fund". The fund shall be a continuing fund, not subject to  
13 fiscal year limitations, and shall consist of:

- 14 1. All monies appropriated to the fund by the Legislature;
- 15 2. All monies received from gifts, grants, reimbursements, or  
16 other contributions from public or private sources for purposes  
17 consistent with this act;
- 18 3. Any interest or investment earnings attributable to monies  
19 in the fund; and
- 20 4. Any other monies designated for deposit in the fund.

21 B. All monies accruing to the credit of the Oklahoma AI  
22 Education Innovation Revolving Fund are hereby appropriated and  
23 shall be budgeted and distributed by the Office of Management and  
24 Enterprise Services as follows:

1       1. Forty-two and two-tenths percent (42.2%) to the State  
2 Department of Education;

3       2. Forty-two and two-tenths percent (42.2%) to the Oklahoma  
4 State Regents for Higher Education;

5       3. Eight and nine-tenths percent (8.9%) to the Oklahoma  
6 Department of Career and Technology Education; and

7       4. Six and seven-tenths percent (6.7%) to the Oklahoma  
8 Department of Libraries.

9       C. Distributions from the fund shall be made quarterly,  
10 beginning on the first day of the fiscal quarter following the  
11 effective date of this act, and on the first day of each fiscal  
12 quarter thereafter. The Office of Management and Enterprise  
13 Services shall transfer the amounts specified in subsection B of  
14 this section to each designated agency within ten (10) business days  
15 of the beginning of each fiscal quarter.

16       D. Monies distributed from the Oklahoma AI Education Innovation  
17 Revolving Fund shall be expended by the receiving agencies solely  
18 for one or more of the following purposes related to artificial  
19 intelligence in education:

20       1. Development, acquisition, and implementation of artificial  
21 intelligence tools, platforms, and resources for educational use;

22       2. Professional development and training for educators,  
23 administrators, librarians, and staff on the effective and ethical  
24 use of artificial intelligence in educational settings;

1 3. Curriculum development integrating artificial intelligence  
2 concepts, digital literacy, and computational thinking;

3 4. Research and evaluation of artificial intelligence  
4 applications in education;

5 5. Student programs and initiatives promoting artificial  
6 intelligence literacy and workforce readiness;

7 6. Infrastructure improvements necessary to support artificial  
8 intelligence educational initiatives;

9 7. Public awareness and community education programs regarding  
10 artificial intelligence; and

11 8. Administrative costs directly related to the purposes  
12 enumerated in this subsection, provided that no more than five  
13 percent (5%) of any agency's annual distribution may be expended for  
14 administrative costs.

15 E. Monies in the Oklahoma AI Education Innovation Revolving  
16 Fund, and monies distributed therefrom to the agencies designated in  
17 subsection B of this section, shall be used solely for the purposes  
18 specified in subsection D of this section and for no other purpose  
19 whatsoever. Any appropriation, transfer, expenditure, or use of any  
20 monies in the fund or distributed from the fund for any purpose not  
21 authorized by subsection D of this section shall be null and void  
22 and of no effect.

23 F. Monies distributed from the fund to the agencies designated  
24 in subsection B of this section that are not expended during a

1 fiscal year shall not revert to the fund or to the General Revenue  
2 Fund but shall be retained by the receiving agency and shall remain  
3 available for expenditure in subsequent fiscal years for the  
4 purposes specified in subsection D of this section.

5 G. No later than October 1 of each year, each agency receiving  
6 monies from the Oklahoma AI Education Innovation Revolving Fund  
7 shall submit a report to the Governor, the President Pro Tempore of  
8 the Oklahoma State Senate, the Speaker of the Oklahoma House of  
9 Representatives, and the Oklahoma AI Education Advisory Council  
10 detailing:

11 1. The total amount of monies received from the fund during the  
12 preceding fiscal year;

13 2. A detailed accounting of all expenditures made from such  
14 monies, organized by the purpose categories specified in subsection  
15 D of this section;

16 3. The educational outcomes achieved through such expenditures;

17 4. Any unexpended balances and the intended use of such  
18 balances; and

19 5. Recommended improvements or modifications to the agency's  
20 artificial intelligence education initiatives.

21 H. The State Treasurer shall maintain separate accounts within  
22 the Oklahoma AI Education Innovation Revolving Fund sufficient to  
23 track deposits, distributions, and balances attributable to each  
24 funding source.

1 SECTION 3. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified  
2 in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 202 of Title 75A, unless there  
3 is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:

4 A. There is hereby created, to continue until July 1, 2031, in  
5 accordance with the provisions of the Oklahoma Sunset Law, the  
6 Oklahoma AI Education Advisory Council.

7 B. The Oklahoma AI Education Advisory Council shall consist of  
8 seventeen (17) members as follows:

9 1. The State Superintendent of Public Instruction, or designee;

10 2. The Chancellor of the Oklahoma State Regents for Higher  
11 Education, or designee;

12 3. The State Director of the Oklahoma Department of Career and  
13 Technology Education, or designee;

14 4. The Director of the Oklahoma Department of Libraries, or  
15 designee;

16 5. One member appointed by the Governor with experience in  
17 artificial intelligence research or development;

18 6. One member appointed by the Governor with experience in K-12  
19 education;

20 7. One member appointed by the Governor with experience in  
21 workforce development;

22 8. One member appointed by the President Pro Tempore of the  
23 Senate with experience in higher education;

24

1           9. One member appointed by the President Pro Tempore of the  
2 Senate with experience in educational technology;

3           10. One member appointed by the Speaker of the House of  
4 Representatives with experience in business or industry utilizing  
5 artificial intelligence;

6           11. One member appointed by the Speaker of the House of  
7 Representatives with experience in rural education;

8           12. One member who is a current classroom teacher, appointed  
9 jointly by the State Superintendent of Public Instruction and the  
10 Chancellor of the Oklahoma State Regents for Higher Education;

11           13. One member who is a current public school administrator,  
12 appointed by the State Superintendent of Public Instruction;

13           14. One member who is a current faculty member at an  
14 institution within The Oklahoma State System of Higher Education,  
15 appointed by the Chancellor of the Oklahoma State Regents for Higher  
16 Education;

17           15. One member representing Oklahoma tribal nations with  
18 interest in educational technology, appointed by the Governor in  
19 consultation with the Oklahoma Indian Affairs Commission;

20           16. One member who is a current student enrolled in a public  
21 high school or institution of higher education in Oklahoma,  
22 appointed jointly by the Speaker of the House of Representatives and  
23 the President Pro Tempore of the Senate; and

24

1 17. One member representing the Oklahoma business community,  
2 appointed by the Governor.

3 C. 1. The four ex officio members designated in paragraphs 1  
4 through 4 of subsection B of this section shall serve for the  
5 duration of their terms of office.

6 2. Appointed members shall serve for terms of three (3) years  
7 and may be reappointed for one additional term.

8 3. Initial appointments shall be staggered as follows:

9 a. members appointed pursuant to paragraphs 5, 8, 10, 12,  
10 and 15 of subsection B of this section shall serve  
11 initial terms of three (3) years,

12 b. members appointed pursuant to paragraphs 6, 9, 11, 13,  
13 and 16 of subsection B of this section shall serve  
14 initial terms of two (2) years, and

15 c. members appointed pursuant to paragraphs 7, 14, and 17  
16 of subsection B of this section shall serve initial  
17 terms of one (1) year.

18 4. Vacancies shall be filled for the unexpired term in the same  
19 manner as the original appointment.

20 5. Any member may be removed by the appointing authority for  
21 cause.

22 D. Members of the Oklahoma AI Education Advisory Council shall  
23 be exempt from the dual-office-holding prohibitions of Section 6 of  
24 Title 51 of the Oklahoma Statutes.

1 E. Members of the Council shall receive no compensation for  
2 their service but shall be reimbursed for necessary travel expenses  
3 incurred in the performance of their duties in accordance with the  
4 State Travel Reimbursement Act.

5 SECTION 4. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified  
6 in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 203 of Title 75A, unless there  
7 is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:

8 A. The Oklahoma AI Education Advisory Council shall have the  
9 following powers and duties:

10 1. Advise and make recommendations to the State Department of  
11 Education, the Oklahoma State Regents for Higher Education, the  
12 Oklahoma Department of Career and Technology Education, and the  
13 Oklahoma Department of Libraries on matters relating to:

- 14 a. the development and implementation of artificial  
15 intelligence education initiatives,
- 16 b. coordination among agencies to maximize the  
17 effectiveness of artificial intelligence education  
18 investments,
- 19 c. best practices for integrating artificial intelligence  
20 into curriculum and instruction,
- 21 d. ethical considerations and responsible use of  
22 artificial intelligence in educational settings,
- 23 e. workforce preparation for careers involving artificial  
24 intelligence, and

1           f.    digital literacy and equitable access to artificial  
2                   intelligence educational resources;

3           2.   Review the annual reports submitted by agencies pursuant to  
4 Section 1 of this act and provide feedback and recommendations;

5           3.   Identify gaps, redundancies, or opportunities for  
6 collaboration among agencies receiving monies from the Oklahoma AI  
7 Education Innovation Revolving Fund;

8           4.   Monitor national and international trends in artificial  
9 intelligence education and make recommendations for Oklahoma to  
10 remain competitive;

11          5.   Engage with stakeholders including educators, students,  
12 parents, employers, and community members to gather input on  
13 artificial intelligence education needs and priorities;

14          6.   Develop and recommend metrics for evaluating the  
15 effectiveness of artificial intelligence education initiatives  
16 funded through the Oklahoma AI Education Innovation Revolving Fund;  
17 and

18          7.   Perform such other advisory duties as may be requested by  
19 the Governor, the Legislature, or the agencies receiving monies from  
20 the fund.

21          B.   The Council shall have no authority to direct, control, or  
22 supervise the operations of any state agency, institution, or school  
23 district. All recommendations of the Council shall be advisory only  
24 and shall not be binding on any agency or institution.

1 C. No later than December 1 of each year, the Council shall  
2 submit an annual report to the Governor, the President Pro Tempore  
3 of the Senate, the Speaker of the House of Representatives, the  
4 State Board of Education, and the Oklahoma State Regents for Higher  
5 Education. The report shall include:

6 1. A summary of Council activities during the preceding year;

7 2. An assessment of the progress of artificial intelligence  
8 education initiatives across all receiving agencies;

9 3. Findings and recommendations for improving coordination and  
10 effectiveness;

11 4. Identification of emerging opportunities or challenges in  
12 artificial intelligence education; and

13 5. Any recommended legislative or administrative actions.

14 SECTION 5. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified  
15 in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 204 of Title 75A, unless there  
16 is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:

17 A. The Oklahoma AI Education Advisory Council shall meet at  
18 least quarterly at the call of the chair. Additional meetings may  
19 be called by the chair, or upon written request of a majority of the  
20 members.

21 B. At its first meeting, the Council shall elect from among its  
22 members a chair and a vice-chair who shall serve for terms of two  
23 (2) years. The chair and vice-chair may be reelected.

24

1 C. A majority of the members of the Council shall constitute a  
2 quorum for the transaction of business. All official actions of the  
3 Council shall require the affirmative vote of a majority of those  
4 members present and voting.

5 D. The Council may establish subcommittees as it deems  
6 necessary to carry out its duties. Subcommittees may include  
7 individuals who are not members of the Council, provided that such  
8 individuals shall serve in a nonvoting advisory capacity.

9 E. All meetings of the Council and its subcommittees shall be  
10 subject to the Oklahoma Open Meeting Act.

11 F. The State Department of Education, the Oklahoma State  
12 Regents for Higher Education, the Oklahoma Department of Career and  
13 Technology Education, and the Oklahoma Department of Libraries shall  
14 provide staff support, information, and assistance to the Council as  
15 requested. The agencies may designate staff to serve jointly as  
16 support for the Council and may share the costs of such support  
17 proportionally based on the distribution percentages specified in  
18 Section 1 of this act.

19 SECTION 6. There is hereby appropriated to the Oklahoma AI  
20 Education Innovation Revolving Fund from any monies not otherwise  
21 appropriated from the General Revenue Fund of the State Treasury for  
22 the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2026, the sum of Forty-five  
23 Million Dollars (\$45,000,000.00).

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1 SECTION 7. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified  
2 in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 205 of Title 75A, unless there  
3 is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:

4 If any provision of this act or the application thereof to any  
5 person or circumstance is held invalid, the invalidity shall not  
6 affect other provisions or applications of the act which can be  
7 given effect without the invalid provision or application, and to  
8 this end the provisions of this act are declared to be severable.

9 SECTION 8. This act shall become effective July 1, 2026.

10 SECTION 9. It being immediately necessary for the preservation  
11 of the public peace, health or safety, an emergency is hereby  
12 declared to exist, by reason whereof this act shall take effect and  
13 be in full force from and after its passage and approval.

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
