NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified 20 in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 161.21 of Title 59, unless there 21 is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows: 22 This statute is intended to authorize licensed chiropractic 23 physicians in Oklahoma, who have obtained injectable certification, 24

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to administer specific emergency medications in life-threatening

situations. This provision seeks to enhance patient safety by
equipping chiropractic physicians with the ability to respond
effectively to urgent medical emergencies occurring within his or
her practice.

- B. 1. Licensed chiropractic physicians who hold an injectable certification may administer the following emergency medications in the event of a documented emergency:
 - a. Epinephrine (EpiPen) for anaphylactic reactions,
 - b. Diphenhydramine (Benadryl) for severe allergic reactions, and
 - c. Naloxone (Narcan) for opioid overdoses.
- 2. Chiropractic physicians shall administer the medications in subparagraphs a, b, and c of paragraph 1 of this subsection only in situations where immediate intervention is necessary to prevent severe harm or death to the patient, prior to or in conjunction with the arrival of emergency medical services.
- C. 1. Only chiropractic physicians licensed and certified by the Oklahoma State Board of Chiropractic Examiners to administer injectables are permitted to administer the specified emergency medications.
- 2. Chiropractic physicians authorized to administer emergency medications shall complete an initial eight (8) hours of board-approved training in the recognition, management, and safe administration of these medications, including Cardiopulmonary

- Resuscitation (CPR) and basic life support recertification. This
 training shall be renewed every two (2) years with six (6) hours of
 board-certified courses.
 - D. 1. All licensed chiropractic physicians practicing in Oklahoma shall obtain and maintain certification in Basic Life Support (BLS) and Cardiopulmonary Resuscitation (CPR).

 Certification shall be issued by an accredited organization recognized by the Oklahoma State Board of Chiropractic Examiners.

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- 2. Chiropractic physicians shall obtain BLS and CPR certification within six (6) months of licensure and renew his or her certification at intervals specified by the certifying organization or as required by the Oklahoma State Board of Chiropractic Examiners.
- 3. Chiropractic physicians are required to provide proof of current BLS and CPR certification as part of his or her license renewal process. Failure to maintain certification may result in disciplinary action or suspension of the chiropractic license until compliance is restored.
- E. 1. Chiropractic physicians administering emergency medications shall establish and maintain written protocols for the use of these medications, including protocols for assessing patient conditions, indications for administration, dosage guidelines, and procedures for post-administration care.

2. Any instance of emergency medication administration shall be documented in the patient's medical record, including the time, dosage, reason for administration, and any subsequent actions taken. Chiropractic physicians shall also report the incident to the Oklahoma State Board of Chiropractic Examiners within seventy-two (72) hours from the occurrence.

- F. Licensed chiropractic physicians who administer emergency medications in compliance with this section shall be considered to be acting within the scope of chiropractic practice and provided liability protection under applicable Oklahoma state laws governing emergency medical intervention.
- SECTION 2. AMENDATORY 59 O.S. 2021, Section 161.2, is amended to read as follows:
 - Section 161.2. A. Chiropractic is the science and art that teaches health in anatomic relation and disease or abnormality in anatomic disrelation, and includes hygienic, sanitary, and therapeutic measures incident thereto in humans. The scope of practice of chiropractic shall include those diagnostic and treatment services and procedures which have been taught by an accredited chiropractic college and or have been approved by the Board of Chiropractic Examiners.
 - B. A chiropractic physician may engage in the practice of animal chiropractic diagnosis and treatment if certified to do so by the Board. A licensed chiropractic physician may provide

- chiropractic treatment to an animal without being certified in
 animal chiropractic diagnosis and treatment by the Board if an
 animal has been referred to the chiropractic physician by a licensed
 veterinarian in writing.
- 5 SECTION 3. AMENDATORY 59 O.S. 2021, Section 161.3, is 6 amended to read as follows:
 - Section 161.3. As used in the Oklahoma Chiropractic Practice Act, these words, phrases or terms, unless the context otherwise indicates, shall have the following meanings:
 - 1. "Accredited chiropractic college" means a chiropractic educational institution which is accredited by an accrediting agency recognized by the U.S. Department of Education;
 - 2. "Animal chiropractic diagnosis and treatment" means treatment that includes vertebral subluxation complex (vsc) and spinal manipulation of nonhuman vertebrates. The term "animal chiropractic diagnosis and treatment" shall not be construed to allow the:
 - a. use of x-rays,

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- b. performing performance of any form of surgery,
- c. dispensing or administering of medications, or
- d. performance of traditional veterinary care;
- 3. "Applicant" means any person submitting an application for licensure to the Board;
 - 4. "Board" means the Board of Chiropractic Examiners;

5. "Certified chiropractic assistant" means an unlicensed member of a chiropractic physician's team of healthcare workers who may assist a chiropractic physician in the performance of examination and therapeutic procedures and techniques necessary to deliver healthcare services to patients within the scope of chiropractic and has been certified by the Board;

- 6. "Chiropractic physician", "chiropractor", "doctor of chiropractic", "practitioner of chiropractic" and "licensee" are synonymous and mean a person holding an original license to practice chiropractic in this state;
- 7. "Examination" means the process used by the Board, prior to the issuance of an original license, to test the qualifications and knowledge of an applicant on any or all of the following: current statutes, rules or any of those subjects listed in Section 161.8 of this title;
- 8. "Intern" means a student at an accredited chiropractic college who is participating in the Chiropractic Undergraduate Preceptorship Program;
- 9. "Nonclinical" means of a business nature including, but not limited to, practice management, insurance information, and computer information. It shall also mean the discussion of philosophy as it relates to the performance of chiropractic;
- 10. "Nutritional Supplements" which can be administered by a needle, means articles of natural origin, including, but not limited

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    to, vitamins, minerals, amino acids, fatty acids, enzymes,
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    antioxidants, oxygen, cellular agents or extracts, botanicals or
    phytonutrients, and articles within the homeopathic pharmacopeia and
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    its derivatives. The term nutritional supplements shall not be
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    construed to allow the administration of autologous stem cells and
    any federally scheduled narcotics. Any natural medicine agent found
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    within an over-the-counter nutritional supplement that is available
    in a compounded, sterile, injectable solution;
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             "Original license" means a license granting initial
    authorization to practice chiropractic in this state issued by the
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    Board to an applicant found by the Board to meet the licensing
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    requirements of the Oklahoma Chiropractic Practice Act, by
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    examination pursuant to Section 161.7 of this title, or by
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    relocation of practice pursuant to Section 161.9 of this title;
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        11. 12. "Preceptor" means a chiropractic physician who is
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12. 13. "Relocation of practice" means the recognition and approval by the Board, prior to the issuance of an original license, of the chiropractic licensing process in another state, country, territory or province; and

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July of each year, which authorizes such licensee to practice
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    chiropractic in this state during the succeeding calendar year.
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        SECTION 4. This act shall become effective November 1, 2025.
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
