PROPOSED POLICY COMMITTEE SUBSTITUTE

An Act relating to commercial driver licenses;
creating the Ray Davis Safe Roads Act; amending 47
O.S. 2021, Section 6-101, as last amended by Section
3, Chapter 330, O.S.L. 2025 (47 O.S. Supp. 2025,
Section 6-101), which relates to class requirements
for driver licenses; prohibiting the issuance of
commercial driver license to certain individuals;
amending 47 O.S. 2021, Section 6-103, as amended by
Section 40, Chapter 282, O.S.L. 2022 (47 O.S. Supp.
2025, Section 6-103), which relates to persons not to
be licensed; prohibiting the issuance of commercial
driver license to certain individuals; requiring
Service Oklahoma make certain verification; modifying
list of persons not to be licensed; providing for
noncodification; and providing an effective date.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:

SECTION 1. NEW LAW A new section of law not to be
codified in the Oklahoma Statutes reads as follows:

This act shall be known and may be cited as the "Ray Davis Safe
Roads Act".

1 SECTION 2. AMENDATORY 47 O.S. 2021, Section 6-101, as
2 last amended by Section 3, Chapter 330, O.S.L. 2025 (47 O.S. Supp.
3 2025, Section 6-101), is amended to read as follows:

4 Section 6-101. A. No person, except those hereinafter
5 expressly exempted in Sections 6-102 and 6-102.1 of this title,
6 shall operate any motor vehicle upon a highway in this state unless
7 the person has a valid Oklahoma driver license for the class of
8 vehicle being operated under the provisions of this title. No
9 person shall be permitted to possess more than one valid license at
10 any time, except as provided in paragraph 4 5 of subsection F of
11 this section.

12 B. 1. No person shall operate a Class A commercial motor
13 vehicle unless the person is eighteen (18) years of age or older and
14 holds a valid Class A commercial license, except as provided in
15 paragraph ~~5~~ 6 of this subsection and subsection F of this section.
16 Any person holding a valid Class A commercial license shall be
17 permitted to operate motor vehicles in Classes A, B, C and D, except
18 as provided for in paragraph 4 of this subsection.

19 2. No person shall operate a Class B commercial motor vehicle
20 unless the person is eighteen (18) years of age or older and holds a
21 valid Class B commercial license, except as provided in paragraph ~~5~~
22 6 of subsection F of this section. Any person holding a valid Class
23 B commercial license shall be permitted to operate motor vehicles in
24

1 Classes B, C and D, except as provided for in paragraph 4 of this
2 subsection.

3 3. No person shall operate a Class C commercial motor vehicle
4 unless the person is eighteen (18) years of age or older and holds a
5 valid Class C commercial license, except as provided in subsection F
6 of this section. Any person holding a valid Class C commercial
7 license shall be permitted to operate motor vehicles in Classes C
8 and D, except as provided for in paragraph 4 of this subsection.

9 4. No person under twenty-one (21) years of age shall be
10 licensed to operate any motor vehicle which is required to be
11 placarded for hazardous materials pursuant to 49 C.F.R., Part 172,
12 subpart F, except as provided in subsection F of this section;
13 provided, a person eighteen (18) years of age or older may be
14 licensed to operate a farm vehicle which is required to be placarded
15 for hazardous materials pursuant to 49 C.F.R., Part 172, subpart F,
16 except as provided in subsection F of this section.

17 5. A person at least seventeen (17) years of age who
18 successfully completes all examinations required by law may be
19 issued by Service Oklahoma:

20 a. a restricted Class A commercial license which shall
21 grant to the licensee the privilege to operate a Class
22 A or Class B commercial motor vehicle for harvest
23 purposes or a Class D motor vehicle, or
24

b. a restricted Class B commercial license which shall grant to the licensee the privilege to operate a Class B commercial motor vehicle for harvest purposes or a Class D motor vehicle.

6. No person shall operate a Class D motor vehicle unless the person is sixteen (16) years of age or older and holds a valid Class D license, except as provided for in Section 6-102 or 6-105 of this title. Any person holding a valid Class D license shall be permitted to operate motor vehicles in Class D only.

C. Any person issued a driver license pursuant to this section may exercise the privilege thereby granted upon all streets and highways in this state.

D. No person shall operate a motorcycle or motor-driven cycle without having a valid Class A, B, C or D license with a motorcycle endorsement. Except as otherwise provided by law, any new applicant for an original driver license shall be required to successfully complete a written examination, vision examination and driving examination for a motorcycle as prescribed by the Department of Public Safety, in conjunction with Service Oklahoma, and a certified state-approved motorcycle basic rider course approved by the Department, in conjunction with Service Oklahoma, if the applicant is seventeen (17) years of age or younger to be eligible for a motorcycle endorsement thereon. The written examination and driving examination for a motorcycle shall be waived by Service Oklahoma

1 upon verification that the person has successfully completed a
2 certified Motorcycle Safety Foundation rider course approved by the
3 Department, in conjunction with Service Oklahoma.

4 E. Except as otherwise provided by law, any person who lawfully
5 possesses a valid Oklahoma driver license which is eligible for
6 renewal shall be required to successfully complete a written
7 examination, vision examination and driving examination for a
8 motorcycle as prescribed by the Department, in conjunction with
9 Service Oklahoma, and a certified state-approved motorcycle basic
10 rider course approved by the Department, in conjunction with Service
11 Oklahoma, if the person is seventeen (17) years of age or younger to
12 be eligible for a motorcycle endorsement. The written examination
13 and driving examination for a motorcycle shall be waived by Service
14 Oklahoma upon verification that the person has successfully
15 completed a certified Motorcycle Safety Foundation rider course
16 approved by the Department, in conjunction with Service Oklahoma.

17 F. 1. Any person eighteen (18) years of age or older may apply
18 for a restricted Class A, B or C commercial learner permit. Service
19 Oklahoma, after the applicant has passed all parts of the
20 examination for a Class D license and has successfully passed all
21 parts of the examination for a Class A, B or C commercial license
22 other than the driving examination, may issue to the applicant a
23 commercial learner permit which shall entitle the person having
24 immediate lawful possession of the commercial learner permit and a

1 valid Oklahoma driver license or provisional driver license pursuant
2 to Section 6-212 of this title to operate a Class A, B or C
3 commercial motor vehicle upon the public highways solely for the
4 purpose of behind-the-wheel training in accordance with rules
5 promulgated by the Department.

6 2. This commercial learner permit shall be issued for a period
7 as provided in Section 6-115 of this title of one (1) year;
8 provided, such commercial learner permit may be suspended, revoked,
9 canceled, denied or disqualified at the discretion of the
10 Department, with notice to Service Oklahoma, for violation of the
11 restrictions, for failing to give the required or correct
12 information on the application or for violation of any traffic laws
13 of this state pertaining to the operation of a motor vehicle.
14 Except as otherwise provided, the lawful possessor of a commercial
15 learner permit who has been issued a commercial learner permit for a
16 minimum of fourteen (14) days may have the restriction requiring an
17 accompanying driver removed by satisfactorily completing a driver's
18 examination; provided, the removal of a restriction shall not
19 authorize the operation of a Class A, B or C commercial motor
20 vehicle if such operation is otherwise prohibited by law.

21 3. Service Oklahoma shall not issue an original Class A, B, or
22 C driver license to any applicant who is disqualified under
23 paragraph 5 of subsection A of Section 6-103 of this title.
24

1 4. No person shall apply for and Service Oklahoma shall not
2 issue an original Class A, B or C driver license until the person
3 has been issued a commercial learner permit and held the permit for
4 at least fourteen (14) days. Any person who currently holds a Class
5 B or C license and who wishes to apply for another class of
6 commercial driver license shall be required to apply for a
7 commercial learner permit and to hold the permit for at least
8 fourteen (14) days before applying for the Class A or B license, as
9 applicable. Any person who currently holds a Class A, B or C
10 license and who wishes to add an endorsement or remove a restriction
11 for which a skills examination is required shall be required to
12 apply for a commercial learner permit and to hold the permit for at
13 least fourteen (14) days before applying for the endorsement.

14 ~~4.~~ 5. A commercial learner permit shall be issued by Service
15 Oklahoma as a separate and unique document which shall be valid only
16 in conjunction with a valid Oklahoma driver license or provisional
17 driver license pursuant to Section 6-212 of this title, both of
18 which shall be in the possession of the person to whom they have
19 been issued whenever that person is operating a commercial motor
20 vehicle as provided in this subsection.

21 ~~5.~~ 6. After one renewal of a commercial learner permit, as
22 provided in paragraph 2 of this subsection, a commercial permit
23 shall not be renewed again. Any person who has held a commercial
24 learner permit for the initial issuance period and one renewal

1 period shall not be eligible for and Service Oklahoma shall not
2 issue another renewal of the permit; provided, the person may
3 reapply for a new commercial learner permit, as provided for in this
4 subsection.

5 G. 1. For purposes of this title:

6 a. "REAL ID Compliant Driver License" or "Identification
7 Card" means a driver license or identification card
8 issued by this state that has been certified by the
9 United States Department of Homeland Security (USDHS)
10 as compliant with the requirements of the REAL ID Act
11 of 2005, Public Law No. 109-13. A REAL ID Compliant
12 Driver License or Identification Card and the process
13 through which it is issued incorporate a variety of
14 security measures designed to protect the integrity
15 and trustworthiness of the license or card. A REAL ID
16 Compliant Driver License or Identification Card will
17 be clearly marked on the face indicating that it is a
18 compliant document, and

19 b. "REAL ID Noncompliant Driver License" or
20 "Identification Card" means a driver license or
21 identification card issued by this state that has not
22 been certified by the United States Department of
23 Homeland Security (USDHS) as being compliant with the
24 requirements of the REAL ID Act of 2005. A REAL ID

1 Noncompliant Driver License or Identification Card
2 will be clearly marked on the face indicating that it
3 is not compliant with the federal REAL ID Act of 2005
4 and is not acceptable for official federal purposes.
5 The driver license or identification card will have a
6 unique design or color indicator that clearly
7 distinguishes it from a compliant license or card.

8 2. Original Driver License and Identification Card Issuance:

- 9 a. Application for an original REAL ID Compliant or REAL
10 ID Noncompliant Driver License or Identification Card
11 shall be made to Service Oklahoma or a licensed
12 operator provided such licensed operator is authorized
13 to process application for REAL ID Compliant Driver
14 Licenses and Identification Cards. Application for a
15 REAL ID Noncompliant Driver License or Identification
16 Card shall be made to Service Oklahoma.
- 17 b. Service Oklahoma employees or authorized licensed
18 operators shall perform all document recognition and
19 other requirements needed for approval of an original
20 REAL ID Compliant Driver License or Identification
21 Card application. Service Oklahoma employees shall
22 perform all document recognition and other
23 requirements needed for approval of a REAL ID
24

1 Noncompliant Driver License or Identification Card
2 application.

3 c. Upon approval of an original REAL ID Compliant or REAL
4 ID Noncompliant Driver License or Identification Card
5 application, the applicant may take the approved
6 application document to a licensed operator to receive
7 a temporary driver license or identification card.

8 d. The licensed operator shall process the approved REAL
9 ID Compliant or REAL ID Noncompliant Driver License or
10 Identification Card application and upon payment shall
11 provide the applicant a temporary driver license or
12 identification card. A temporary driver license or
13 identification card shall afford the holder the
14 privileges otherwise granted by the specific class of
15 driver license or identification card for the period
16 of time listed on the temporary driver license or
17 identification card or the period of time prior to the
18 applicant receiving a REAL ID Compliant or REAL ID
19 Noncompliant Driver License or Identification Card,
20 whichever time period is shorter.

21 3. REAL ID Compliant Driver License and Identification Card

22 Renewal and Replacement:

23 a. Application for renewal or replacement of a REAL ID
24 Compliant Driver License or Identification Card may be

1 made to Service Oklahoma or to a licensed operator;
2 provided, such licensed operator is authorized to
3 process application for REAL ID Compliant Driver
4 Licenses and Identification Cards. A licensed
5 operator may process the voluntary downgrade of a REAL
6 ID Compliant Commercial Driver License to any lower
7 class license upon request of the licensee; provided,
8 no additional endorsements or restrictions are placed
9 on the license.

10 b. Service Oklahoma employees or authorized licensed
11 operators shall perform all document recognition and
12 other requirements needed for approval of a renewal or
13 replacement REAL ID Compliant Driver License or
14 Identification Card application.

15 c. Upon approval of a renewal or replacement REAL ID
16 Compliant Driver License or Identification Card
17 application, the applicant may receive a temporary
18 driver license or identification card from Service
19 Oklahoma or an authorized licensed operator.

20 d. A temporary driver license or identification card
21 acquired under the provisions of this paragraph shall
22 afford the holder the privileges otherwise granted by
23 the specific class of driver license or identification
24 card being renewed or replaced for the period of time

1 listed on the temporary driver license or
2 identification card or the period of time prior to the
3 applicant receiving a REAL ID Compliant Driver License
4 or Identification Card, whichever time period is
5 shorter.

6 e. For purposes of this title, an application for a REAL
7 ID Compliant Driver License or Identification Card by
8 an individual with a valid Oklahoma-issued driver
9 license or identification card shall be considered a
10 renewal of a REAL ID Compliant Driver License or
11 Identification Card.

12 4. REAL ID Noncompliant Driver License and Identification Card
13 Renewal and Replacement:

14 a. Application for renewal or replacement of a REAL ID
15 Noncompliant Driver License or Identification Card may
16 be made to Service Oklahoma or to a licensed operator.
17 A licensed operator may process the voluntary
18 downgrade of a REAL ID Noncompliant Commercial Driver
19 License to any lower class license upon request of the
20 licensee; provided, no additional endorsements or
21 restrictions are added to the license.

22 b. Service Oklahoma employees or licensed operators shall
23 perform all document recognition and other
24 requirements needed for approval of a renewal or

1 replacement REAL ID Noncompliant Driver License or
2 Identification Card application.

3 c. Upon approval of a renewal or replacement REAL ID
4 Noncompliant Driver License or Identification Card
5 application, the applicant may receive a temporary
6 driver license or identification card from Service
7 Oklahoma or a licensed operator.

8 d. A temporary driver license or identification card
9 acquired under the provisions of this paragraph shall
10 afford the holder the privileges otherwise granted by
11 the specific class of driver license or identification
12 card being renewed or replaced for the period of time
13 listed on the temporary driver license or
14 identification card or the period of time prior to the
15 applicant receiving a REAL ID Noncompliant Driver
16 License or Identification Card, whichever time period
17 is shorter.

18 H. 1. The fee charged for an approved application for an
19 original Oklahoma REAL ID Compliant or REAL ID Noncompliant Driver
20 License or an approved application for the addition of an
21 endorsement to a current valid Oklahoma REAL ID Compliant or REAL ID
22 Noncompliant Driver License shall be assessed in accordance with the
23 following schedule:
24

12 2. Notwithstanding the provisions of Section 1104 of this
13 title, all monies collected from the fees charged for Class A, B and
14 C commercial licenses pursuant to the provisions of this subsection
15 shall be deposited in the General Revenue Fund of this state.

16 I. The fee charged for any failed examination shall be Four
17 Dollars (\$4.00) for any license classification. Notwithstanding the
18 provisions of Section 1104 of this title, all monies collected from
19 such examination fees pursuant to the provisions of this subsection
20 shall be deposited in the General Revenue Fund of this state.

21 J. In addition to any fee charged pursuant to the provisions of
22 subsection H of this section, the fee charged for the issuance or
23 renewal of a REAL ID Noncompliant Driver License shall be in
24 accordance with the following schedule; provided, that any applicant

1 who has a CDL Learner Permit shall be charged only the replacement
2 fee for the issuance of the license:

14 K. In addition to any fee charged pursuant to the provisions of
15 subsection H of this section, the fee charged for the issuance or
16 renewal of a REAL ID Compliant Driver License shall be in accordance
17 with the following schedule; provided, that any applicant who has a
18 CDL Learner Permit shall be charged only the replacement fee for the
19 issuance of the license:

11 L. A commercial learner permit may be renewed one time for a
12 period of one hundred eighty (180) days. The cost for the renewed
13 permit shall be the same as for the original permit.

14 M. Notwithstanding the provisions of Section 1104 of this
15 title, of each fee charged pursuant to the provisions of subsections
16 J, K and L of this section:

17 1. Five Dollars and fifty cents (\$5.50) of a 4-year license or
18 Eleven Dollars (\$11.00) of an 8-year license shall be deposited to
19 the Trauma Care Assistance Revolving Fund created in Section 1-
20 2530.9 of Title 63 of the Oklahoma Statutes;

21 2. Six Dollars and seventy-five cents (\$6.75) of a 4-year
22 license or Thirteen Dollars and fifty cents (\$13.50) of an 8-year
23 license shall be deposited to the Department of Public Safety
24 Computer Imaging System Revolving Fund to be used solely for the

1 purpose of administration and maintenance of the computerized
2 imaging system of the Department through October 31, 2022.
3 Beginning November 1, 2022, Six Dollars and seventy-five cents
4 (\$6.75) of a 4-year license or Thirteen Dollars and fifty cents
5 (\$13.50) of an 8-year license shall be deposited to the Service
6 Oklahoma Computer Imaging System Revolving Fund to be used solely
7 for the purpose of administration and maintenance of the
8 computerized imaging system of Service Oklahoma;

9 3. Ten Dollars (\$10.00) of a 4-year license or Twenty Dollars
10 (\$20.00) of an 8-year license shall be deposited to the Department
11 of Public Safety Revolving Fund for all original or renewal
12 issuances of licenses through October 31, 2022. Beginning November
13 1, 2022, Ten Dollars (\$10.00) of a 4-year license or Twenty Dollars
14 (\$20.00) of an 8-year license shall be deposited to the Service
15 Oklahoma Revolving Fund for all original or renewal issuances of
16 licenses; and

17 4. Five Dollars (\$5.00) of a 4-year license or Six Dollars
18 (\$6.00) of an 8-year license shall be deposited to the State Public
19 Safety Fund created in Section 2-147 of this title.

20 N. All original and renewal driver licenses shall expire as
21 provided in Section 6-115 of this title.

22 O. 1. Through May 31, 2025, any person sixty-two (62) to
23 sixty-four (64) years of age during the calendar year of issuance or
24

1 renewal of a Class D license or motorcycle endorsement shall be
2 charged the following prorated fee:

7 2. Any person sixty-five (65) years of age or older during the
8 calendar year of issuance or renewal of a Class D license or
9 motorcycle endorsement shall not be charged a fee.

10 P. No person who has been honorably discharged from active
11 service in any branch of the Armed Forces of the United States or
12 Oklahoma National Guard and who has been certified by the United
13 States Department of Veterans Affairs, its successor or the Armed
14 Forces of the United States to be a disabled veteran in receipt of
15 compensation at the one-hundred-percent rate for a permanent
16 disability sustained through military action or accident resulting
17 from disease contracted while in such active service and registered
18 with the veterans registry created by the Oklahoma Department of
19 Veterans Affairs shall be charged a fee for the issuance,
20 replacement or renewal of an Oklahoma driver license; provided, that
21 if a veteran has been previously exempt from a fee pursuant to this
22 subsection, no registration with the veterans registry shall be
23 required.

24

1 Q. In accordance with the provisions of subsection G of this
2 section, Service Oklahoma is authorized to promulgate rules for the
3 issuance and renewal of driver licenses authorized pursuant to the
4 provisions of Sections 6-101 through 6-309 of this title; provided,
5 that no such rules applicable to the issuance or renewal of REAL ID
6 Noncompliant Driver Licenses shall create more stringent standards
7 than such rules applicable as of January 1, 2017, unless directly
8 related to a specific change in statutory law concerning standards
9 for REAL ID Noncompliant Driver Licenses. Applications, upon forms
10 approved by Service Oklahoma, for such licenses shall be handled, in
11 accordance with the provisions of subsection G of this section, by
12 the licensed operator; provided, Service Oklahoma is authorized to
13 assume these duties in any county of this state. Each licensed
14 operator accepting applications for driver licenses shall receive
15 Six Dollars (\$6.00) for a 4-year REAL ID Noncompliant Driver License
16 or Twelve Dollars (\$12.00) for an 8-year REAL ID Noncompliant Driver
17 License or Ten Dollars (\$10.00) for a 4-year REAL ID Compliant
18 Driver License or Twenty Dollars (\$20.00) for an 8-year REAL ID
19 Compliant Driver License to be deducted from the total collected for
20 each license or renewal application accepted through June 30, 2023.
21 Beginning July 1, 2022, and ending on June 30, 2023, each motor
22 license agent or licensed operator accepting applications for driver
23 licenses for individuals over the age of sixty-five (65) years or
24 for applications for drivers pursuant to subsection P of this

1 section shall receive Six Dollars (\$6.00) for a 4-year driver
2 license or Twelve Dollars (\$12.00) for an 8-year driver license to
3 be deducted daily by the motor license agent or licensed operator
4 receipts. Beginning July 1, 2023, these fees shall be retained by
5 the licensed operator pursuant to subsection E of Section 1141.1 of
6 this title. The fees received by the licensed operator, authorized
7 by this subsection, shall be used for operating expenses. The
8 amount retained pursuant to this subsection shall not be retained by
9 any state agency. The fees received by the licensed operator,
10 authorized by this subsection, shall be used for operating expenses.
11 For purposes of this subsection, "licensed operator" shall mean an
12 individual who obtains a license from the Service Oklahoma Operator
13 Board to operate a designated Service Oklahoma location and offers
14 third-party fulfillment of designated services to be rendered by
15 Service Oklahoma.

16 R. Notwithstanding the provisions of Section 1104 of this title
17 and subsection Q of this section and except as provided in
18 subsections H and M of this section, the first Sixty Thousand
19 Dollars (\$60,000.00) of all monies collected pursuant to this
20 section shall be paid by the Oklahoma Tax Commission to the State
21 Treasurer to be deposited in the General Revenue Fund of the State
22 Treasury.

23 The next Five Hundred Thousand Dollars (\$500,000.00) of monies
24 collected pursuant to this section shall be paid by the Tax

1 Commission to the State Treasurer to be deposited each fiscal year
2 under the provisions of this section to the credit of the Department
3 of Public Safety Restricted Revolving Fund for the purpose of the
4 Oklahoma Law Enforcement Telecommunications System. All other
5 monies collected in excess of Five Hundred Sixty Thousand Dollars

7 Section 1104 of this title, except as otherwise provided in this

9 S. Service Oklahoma shall retain the images displayed on
10 licenses and identification cards issued pursuant to the provisions

2 safety, in accordance with rules promulgated by the Department,
