8 PROPOSED POLICY COMMITTEE SUBSTITUTE

9 An Act relating to courts; amending 20 O.S. 2021,  
10 Section 1651.1, which relates to professional and  
11 educational programs for judges; authorizing  
12 professional and education programs provided by the  
13 Council on Judicial Complaints to satisfy mandatory  
14 judicial continuing legal education requirements; and  
15 providing an effective date.

16 BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:

17 SECTION 1. AMENDATORY 20 O.S. 2021, Section 1651.1, is  
18 amended to read as follows:

19 Section 1651.1. A. The Council on Judicial Complaints is  
20 authorized to provide funding for the attendance and participation  
21 of state, municipal, and administrative judges in professional and  
22 educational programs, schools, or conferences for the purpose of  
23 improving the quality of the Oklahoma Judiciary and to improve the  
24 administration of justice in this state. The Council may contract  
or partner with public or private entities or otherwise fund and

1 participate in the development, implementation, and conduct of  
2 professional and educational programs for judges.

3 B. Professional and education programs, schools, or conferences  
4 provided by the Council on Judicial Complaints as authorized by  
5 subsection A of this section shall satisfy mandatory judicial  
6 continuing legal education requirements without additional approval.

7 SECTION 2. This act shall become effective November 1, 2026.
