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8 PROPOSED SUBCOMMITTEE SUBSTITUTE

9 An Act relating to Medicaid; clarifying and
10 standardizing coverage and reimbursement for certain
11 maternal health services; providing for depression
12 screening for pregnant and postpartum women;
13 authorizing flexible payment structures for prenatal,
delivery, and postpartum care; directing coverage for
certain maternal health services delivered through
remote and home-based care models; providing for
codification; and providing an effective date.

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16 BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:

17 SECTION 1. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified
18 in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 4013 of Title 56, unless there
19 is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:

20 A. The Oklahoma Medicaid Program shall reimburse for depression
21 screening during pregnancy and during the postpartum period, as
22 authorized by law.

1 B. The Oklahoma Health Care Authority shall apply for any
2 federal waiver, state plan amendment, or other authority necessary
3 to implement this section.

4 C. The Oklahoma Health Care Authority shall adopt rules to
5 implement this section.

6 SECTION 2. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified
7 in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 4014 of Title 56, unless there
8 is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:

9 A. The Oklahoma Medicaid Program shall reimburse for prenatal,
10 delivery, and postpartum services separately in lieu of a global
11 payment or an all-inclusive payment methodology for maternity
12 services.

13 B. Prenatal, delivery, and postpartum services include, but are
14 not limited to:

- 15 1. Office visits;
- 16 2. Laboratory fees;
- 17 3. Physician-ordered testing;
- 18 4. Blood work;
- 19 5. Remote monitoring;
- 20 6. Fetal nonstress tests; and
- 21 7. Continuous glucose monitors or other services for
22 gestational diabetes, when medically necessary.

1 SECTION 3. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified

2 in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 4015 of Title 56, unless there
3 is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:

4 A. 1. The Oklahoma Medicaid Program shall reimburse for
5 medically necessary remote ultrasound procedures utilizing
6 established Current Procedural Terminology codes for remote
7 ultrasound procedures when the patient is in a residence or other
8 off-site location from the health care provider and the same
9 standard of care is met.

10 2. Paragraph 1 of this subsection shall apply to the fee-for-
11 service categories of the program and any managed care plan within
12 the program.

13 B. A remote ultrasound procedure shall be reimbursable when the
14 health care provider uses digital technology that:

15 1. Collects medical and other forms of health data from a
16 patient and electronically transmits the information securely to a
17 health care provider in a different location for interpretation and
18 recommendation;

19 2. Is compliant with the Health Insurance Portability and
20 Accountability Act (HIPAA) of 1996, 42 U.S.C., Section 1320d et
21 seq., as it existed on January 1, 2026; and

22 3. Is approved by the United States Food and Drug
23 Administration.

1 SECTION 4. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified

2 in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 4016 of Title 56, unless there
3 is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:

4 The Oklahoma Medicaid Program shall reimburse for home
5 visitation services related to prenatal care and postpartum care
6 when such services are provided by doulas, community health workers,
7 or other qualified personnel, as determined by the Oklahoma Health
8 Care Authority.

9 SECTION 5. This act shall become effective November 1, 2026.
