9 PROPOSED POLICY COMMITTEE SUBSTITUTE

10 An Act relating to health insurance; directing fair  
11 coverage for individuals with epilepsy; disallowing  
12 termination of coverage for individuals diagnosed  
with epilepsy; providing coverage for devices or  
surgeries for epilepsy if certain criteria are met;  
providing for codification; and providing an  
effective date.

14 BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:

15 SECTION 1. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified  
16 in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 6060.31 of Title 36, unless  
17 there is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:

18 A. All individual and group health insurance policies that  
19 provide medical and surgical benefits shall provide the same  
20 coverage and benefits to any individual who has been diagnosed with  
21 epilepsy as the policy would provide coverage and benefits to an  
22 individual who has not been diagnosed with epilepsy.

1       B. No insurer shall terminate coverage or refuse to renew an  
2 individual's health insurance coverage solely based upon the  
3 individual's diagnosis of epilepsy.

4       C. To reduce the risk of death from sudden unexpected death in  
5 epilepsy (SUDEP), all individual and group health insurance policies  
6 that provide medical and surgical benefits shall adopt medical  
7 policies that provide coverage for medically necessary  
8 neurostimulation devices if prescribed by a licensed physician who  
9 is actively treating the enrollee.

10      SECTION 2. This act shall become effective November 1, 2026.
