12	An Act relating to higher education; providing
13	legislative intent; amending 70 O.S. 2021, Sections 3213.1, 3405.1, 4662, 4665, 4667, and 4668, which relate to course offerings at certain institutions
14	within The Oklahoma State System of Higher Education; authorizing additional course offerings at certain
15	institutions beginning in certain academic year; allowing duplication of certain course offerings beginning in certain academic year; updating
16 17	statutory references; updating statutory language; providing for noncodification; and providing an
18	effective date.
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20	BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:
22	SECTION 1. NEW LAW A new section of law not to be
23	codified in the Oklahoma Statutes reads as follows:
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1 The Legislature encourages the Oklahoma State Regents for Higher 2 Education to exercise all powers necessary or convenient to accomplish the purposes of Article XIII-A of the Oklahoma 3 Constitution and recommends that the State Regents allow up to one 4 5 change of function for each institution within The Oklahoma State System of Higher Education. Exceptions to functions and associated 6 degree programs may also be considered for unique and specific 7 purposes, such as addressing unmet workforce needs that cannot be 8 9 met through existing programs or collaboration. All such requests shall be approved by the institution's governing board and meet the 10 criteria outlined in the State Regents' policies and procedures. 11 70 O.S. 2021, Section 3213.1, is 12 SECTION 2. AMENDATORY 13 amended to read as follows:

14 Section 3213.1. A. The Oklahoma State Regents for Higher 15 Education shall make educational program resources at institutions 16 in The Oklahoma State System of Higher Education available to the 17 people in the Ponca City area. This program shall be known as the 18 University Center at Ponca City.

B. The State Regents shall draw upon the educational programs of institutions best suited to provide the kind of educational programs needed and shall, in pursuance of Article XIII-A of the <u>Oklahoma</u> Constitution of Oklahoma and appropriate statutes, set the standards of education as they relate to the programs operated to assure that credits earned by students will be fully accepted at

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1 institutions of higher education to which the students may transfer 2 the credit to apply toward an educational study objective. Northern Oklahoma College shall have exclusive authority to offer all lower 3 division courses and programs at the University Center at Ponca City 4 5 as listed in the current college catalog of Northern Oklahoma College. Beginning with the 2026-2027 academic year, Northern 6 Oklahoma College may offer, but shall not have exclusive authority 7 to offer, lower division courses and programs at the University 8 9 Center at Ponca City.

C. The State Regents may establish appropriate funds and 10 accounts τ including a revolving fund τ in the Office of State Finance 11 12 Office of Management and Enterprise Services for servicing the fiscal operations of the University Center at Ponca City. The funds 13 and accounts shall be subject to the direct supervision, management, 14 and control of the board of trustees created by subsection D of this 15 section. The people locally shall provide suitable physical plant 16 accommodations for the University Center at Ponca City. 17

D. There is hereby created a board of nine (9) trustees to be appointed by the Governor by and with the consent of the Senate to serve as the administrative agency for the University Center at Ponca City. The board shall be a body corporate and shall adopt and use an official seal. The board so created shall have the authority to submit a budget annually to the Oklahoma State Regents for Higher Education, administer monies budgeted by the State Regents, provide

1 educational facilities, recommend courses and programs to be offered by participating institutions, select a chief executive officer 2 whose duties include the general coordination of approved programs 3 and services, and the selection of other appropriate nonteaching 4 5 personnel. The board of trustees is authorized to expend all monies allocated to the University Center at Ponca City as may be necessary 6 to perform the duties and responsibilities imposed upon the board by 7 this section. For purposes of acquiring and taking title to real 8 9 and personal property from sources other than state appropriations, the board is authorized to enter into contracts and to adopt rules 10 and regulations pertaining to such actions. The initial nine (9) 11 12 members shall serve their terms for the period to which originally appointed, in numbered positions having dates of expiration 13 identical to the dates of expiration of the original appointments: 14 Position No. 1. The term of office of one member shall expire 15 on June 30, 2013, and each nine (9) years thereafter; 16 Position No. 2. The term of office of one member shall expire 17 on June 30, 2014, and each nine (9) years thereafter; 18 Position No. 3. The term of office of one member shall expire 19 on June 30, 2015, and each nine (9) years thereafter; 20 Position No. 4. The term of office of one member shall expire 21 on June 30, 2016, and each nine (9) years thereafter; 22 Position No. 5. The term of office of one member shall expire 23 on June 30, 2017, and each nine (9) years thereafter; 24

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1	Position No. 6. The term of office of one member shall expire
2	on June 30, 2018, and each nine (9) years thereafter;
3	Position No. 7. The term of office of one member shall expire
4	on June 30, 2019, and each nine (9) years thereafter;
5	Position No. 8. The term of office of one member shall expire
6	on June 30, 2020, and each nine (9) years thereafter; and
7	Position No. 9. The term of office of one member shall expire
8	on June 30, 2021, and each nine (9) years thereafter.
9	The board shall organize and elect a chair, vice-chair <u>vice</u>
10	chair, and secretary annually.
11	E. The board of trustees may establish and maintain plans for
12	tenure and retirement of its employees and for payment of deferred
13	compensation of employees and may provide hospital and medical
14	benefits, accident, health and life insurance, and annuity contracts
15	for employees and pay for all or part of the cost with funds
16	available for payment of its operating expenses.
17	F. The board may establish with the State Treasurer any
18	accounts as are necessary to operate retirement, deferred
19	compensation, or benefits plans for its employees. The accounts
20	shall be revolving funds not subject to fiscal year limitations.
21	Funds deposited in the accounts may be invested in any of the types
22	of instruments in which the State Treasurer is authorized by law to
23	invest.
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1SECTION 3.AMENDATORY70 O.S. 2021, Section 3405.1, is2amended to read as follows:

3 Section 3405.1. A. The Oklahoma State Regents for Higher
4 Education shall make resident college credit courses and programs
5 available to the people of Muskogee.

The Oklahoma State Regents for Higher Education shall 6 Β. provide lower division classes and programs through a branch of 7 Connors State College, which shall be established and located in 8 9 Muskogee. Beginning with the 2026-2027 academic year, the State Regents may provide lower and upper division classes and programs 10 11 through a branch of Connors State College, which shall be 12 established and located in Muskogee. The branch campus of Connors State College shall be governed by the Board of Regents for the 13 Oklahoma Agricultural and Mechanical Colleges and administered 14 through Connors State College. 15

The Oklahoma State Regents for Higher Education shall 16 С. provide upper division classes and programs and graduate classes at 17 the Masters level through a branch of Northeastern State University, 18 which shall be established and located at Muskogee. Beginning with 19 the 2026-2027 academic year, the State Regents may provide lower and 20 upper division classes and programs and graduate classes at the 21 Masters level through a branch of Northeastern State University, 22 which shall be located at Muskogee. The branch campus of 23 Northeastern State University shall be governed by the Board of 24

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Regents of Oklahoma Colleges and administered through Northeastern
 State University.

3 SECTION 4. AMENDATORY 70 O.S. 2021, Section 4662, is 4 amended to read as follows:

Section 4662. On January 1, 1999, there shall be established as 5 a successor to Rogers University in Tulsa a branch institution of 6 Oklahoma State University which shall be known as Oklahoma State 7 University/Tulsa Oklahoma State University-Tulsa and shall offer 8 9 upper division undergraduate courses and baccalaureate degree 10 programs. Beginning with the 2026-2027 academic year, Oklahoma State University-Tulsa may offer lower and upper division 11 12 undergraduate courses and baccalaureate degree programs. No later 13 than July 1, 2001, the Board of Regents for the Oklahoma Agricultural and Mechanical Colleges, in cooperation with the 14 Oklahoma State Regents for Higher Education, shall have developed 15 and implemented programs leading to baccalaureate degrees that can 16 17 be earned at Oklahoma State University/Tulsa Oklahoma State University-Tulsa. Beginning with the 2001 - 2002 2001-2002 academic 18 year, degrees earned at Oklahoma State University/Tulsa Oklahoma 19 State University-Tulsa shall be designated as awarded by the 20 Oklahoma State Regents for Higher Education acting through Oklahoma 21 State University; provided, that dual degree programs may be offered 22 at Oklahoma State University/Tulsa Oklahoma State University-Tulsa 23

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and dual degrees may be awarded through Oklahoma State University
 and other institutions.

SECTION 5. 70 O.S. 2021, Section 4665, is 3 AMENDATORY amended to read as follows: 4 5 Section 4665. Courses A. Except as provided for in subsection 6 B of this section, courses offered at the undergraduate level through Oklahoma State University/Tulsa Oklahoma State University-7 Tulsa shall not duplicate those offered by Tulsa Community College. 8 9 B. Beginning with the 2026-2027 academic year, courses offered 10 at the undergraduate level through Oklahoma State University-Tulsa may duplicate those offered by Tulsa Community College, as 11 12 determined by the Oklahoma State Regents for Higher Education. 13 SECTION 6. AMENDATORY 70 O.S. 2021, Section 4667, is amended to read as follows: 14 Section 4667. On July 1, 2001, there shall be established a 15 branch of Langston University within the Tulsa metropolitan area 16 17 consistent with the statewide plan for Langston University as provided in Section 6 of this act Section 4666 of this title. 18 Langston University shall continue to meet the missions and programs 19 of the Langston Urban Center in Tulsa. The Oklahoma State Regents 20 for Higher Education are authorized to make upper division 21 undergraduate and graduate course offerings at the Langston 22 University Branch branch in Tulsa available as the State Regents 23

24 shall determine are appropriate. <u>Beginning with the 2026-2027</u>

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1 academic year, the State Regents are authorized to make lower and 2 upper division undergraduate and graduate course offerings at the Langston University branch in Tulsa available as the State Regents 3 shall determine are appropriate. Undergraduate degree programs 4 5 offered through Oklahoma State University/Tulsa Oklahoma State 6 University-Tulsa shall not duplicate those undergraduate degree programs offered by the Langston University Branch branch in Tulsa, 7 as determined by the Oklahoma State Regents for Higher Education, 8 9 and shall be consistent with and in furthering implementation of the statewide plan for Langston University as developed by the State 10 Regents pursuant to Section 6 of this act Section 4666 of this title 11 12 and filed with the Office for Civil Rights, United States Department 13 of Education. Provided, however, that beginning with the 2026-2027 academic year, undergraduate degree programs offered through 14 Oklahoma State University-Tulsa may duplicate those undergraduate 15 degree programs offered by the Langston University branch in Tulsa, 16 as determined by the State Regents. 17

The Oklahoma State Regents for Higher Education shall fund Langston University at a level not less than its fiscal year 1998 level, and its Education and General Budget shall be held harmless from reductions in succeeding years. The Oklahoma State Regents for Higher Education shall allocate funds to Langston University sufficient to fund full time full-time faculty in Tulsa at a level equal to seventy percent (70%) of its faculty level that existed in

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Tulsa in fiscal year 1998 and adequate building and classroom space
 which were funded in fiscal year 1998 in order to carry out all
 functions in Tulsa. The Board of Regents for the Oklahoma
 Agricultural and Mechanical Colleges shall allocate space for
 Langston University in Tulsa.

It is the intent of the Legislature that Langston University be 6 funded at a level consistent with the average allocation and 7 allotment of the institutions in the regional funding tier as 8 9 established by the Oklahoma State Regents for Higher Education. Beginning with the 2001 - 2002 2001-2002 academic year, degrees 10 11 earned at the Langston University Branch branch in Tulsa shall be 12 designated as awarded by the Oklahoma State Regents for Higher 13 Education acting through Langston University.

14 SECTION 7. AMENDATORY 70 O.S. 2021, Section 4668, is

15 amended to read as follows:

Section 4668. On July 1, 2001, there may be established a 16 branch of Northeastern State University within the Tulsa 17 metropolitan area. The Oklahoma State Regents for Higher Education 18 are authorized to make upper division undergraduate and graduate 19 course offerings at the Northeastern State University branch in 20 Broken Arrow available as the State Regents shall determine are 21 appropriate. Beginning with the 2026-2027 academic year, the State 22 Regents are authorized to make lower and upper division 23 undergraduate and graduate course offerings at the Northeastern 24

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1 State University branch in Broken Arrow available as the State 2 Regents shall determine are appropriate. Undergraduate degree programs offered through Oklahoma State University/Tulsa Oklahoma 3 State University-Tulsa shall not duplicate those undergraduate 4 5 degree programs offered by Northeastern State University in Tulsa, as determined by the Oklahoma State Regents for Higher Education. 6 Provided, however, that beginning with the 2026-2027 academic year, 7 undergraduate degree programs offered through Oklahoma State 8 9 University-Tulsa may duplicate those undergraduate degree programs offered by Northeastern State University in Tulsa, as determined by 10 the State Regents. 11 12 The Oklahoma State Regents for Higher Education shall fund

Northeastern State University at a level not less than its fiscal year 1998 level, and its Education and General Budget shall be held harmless from reductions in succeeding years.

16 It is the intent of the Legislature that Northeastern State 17 University <u>in Broken Arrow</u> be funded at a level consistent with the 18 average allocation and allotment of the institutions in the regional 19 funding tier as established by the Oklahoma State Regents for Higher 20 Education.

Beginning with the <u>2001 - 2002</u> <u>2001-2002</u> academic year, degrees earned at <u>the</u> Northeastern State University Branch <u>branch</u> in Tulsa Broken Arrow shall be designated as awarded by the Oklahoma State

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1	Regents for Higher Education acting through Northeastern State
2	University.
3	SECTION 8. This act shall become effective November 1, 2025.
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
