19	for eligible students to enter into an agreement to participate in the program; allowing the Oklahoma
20	State Regents for Higher Education to provide an exception to certain age limits; prohibiting students
21	who are certain age or older from being eligible to enter into participation; providing income
22	eligibility for certain students who apply for participation beginning in certain school year;
23	finding students of certified classroom teachers to not have financial need if household income is over
24	certain percentage of the federal poverty level;

 requiring parent household income be below certain percentage of the federal poverty level during the
 program; requiring the Oklahoma State Regents for Higher Education to verify parent employment status;
 defining term; allowing the State Regents to provide an exception to certain age limits under certain circumstances; requiring State Regents promulgate rules; providing an effective date; and declaring an emergency.

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8 BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:

9 SECTION 1. AMENDATORY 70 O.S. 2021, Section 2603, as
10 amended by Section 1, Chapter 274, O.S.L. 2024 (70 O.S. Supp. 2024,
11 Section 2603), is amended to read as follows:

Section 2603. A. Except as otherwise provided for in subsection B of this section and elsewhere in this section, to be eligible to participate in the Oklahoma Higher Learning Access Program and to qualify for an award which includes payment of an amount equivalent to resident tuition or other tuition pursuant to Section 2604 of this title for the first semester or other academic unit of postsecondary enrollment, a student shall:

Be a resident of this state or be enrolled in a school
 district located in this state that serves students who reside in
 both this state and an adjacent state pursuant to a contract as
 authorized in Section 5-117.1 of this title;

23 2. Be a United States citizen or lawfully present in the United
24 States. A student who is not a United States citizen or lawfully

present in the United States shall not be eligible to participate in the Oklahoma Higher Learning Access Program and to qualify for an award notwithstanding the provisions of Section 3242 of this title. The provisions of this paragraph shall not apply to any student who was enrolled in the Oklahoma Higher Learning Access Program prior to the end of the 2006-2007 school year;

7 3. Have a record of satisfactory compliance with agreements
8 executed pursuant to Section 2605 of this title;

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  4. a. have <u>Have</u> graduated within the previous three (3)
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- 15 b. have Have graduated within the previous three (3) 16 years from a high school not accredited by the State 17 Board of Education with a minimum 2.5 cumulative grade 18 point average on a 4.0 scale for all work attempted in 19 grades nine through twelve and have achieved a 20 composite score of 22 or higher on the ACT test, or 21 с. have Have satisfactorily completed within the previous 22 three (3) years an educational program that was 23 provided through a means other than a public or

Have completed the curricular requirements for admission to 3 4 an institution within The Oklahoma State System of Higher Education. 5 Students shall also have attained a 2.5 grade point average in the core curriculum courses. Students who attended a high school which 6 7 did not offer all the core curriculum courses or students who were educated by other means and were not offered all the core curriculum 8 9 courses shall be allowed to satisfy this curriculum requirement by 10 participating in a program approved by the Oklahoma State Regents 11 for Higher Education for remediation of high school curricular 12 deficiencies:

Have satisfied admission standards as determined by the Oklahoma State Regents for Higher Education for first-time-entering students for the appropriate type of institution, or, if attending a private institution, have satisfied admission standards as determined by the private institution. No student participating in the Oklahoma Higher Learning Access Program shall be admitted into an institution of higher education by special admission standards;

7. Have secured admission to, and enrolled in, an institution which is a member of The Oklahoma State System of Higher Education, a postsecondary vocational-technical program offered by a technology center school that meets the requirements to be eligible for federal student financial aid, or a private institution of higher learning 1 located within this state and accredited pursuant to Section 4103 of 2 this title; and

For the 17 purposes of this paragraph, "certified classroom 18 teacher" shall have the same meaning as provided in 19 subparagraph d of paragraph 5 of subsection E of 20 Section 2605 of this title.

B. 1. A student shall be eligible to participate in the
Oklahoma Higher Learning Access Program and to qualify for an award
which includes payment of an amount equivalent to resident tuition
or other tuition pursuant to Section 2604 of this title for the

1 first semester or other academic unit of postsecondary enrollment if 2 the student meets all of the following criteria:

- is a child of any person killed after January 1, 2000, 3 a. 4 in the line of duty in any branch of the United States 5 Armed Forces or who died after January 1, 2000, as a result of an injury sustained while in the line of 6 7 duty in any branch of the United States Armed Forces and the person who was killed or died filed an 8 9 individual or joint Oklahoma income tax return for the tax year prior to the year during which the person was 10 11 killed or died,
- b. is a resident of this state or is enrolled in a school
  district located in this state that serves students
  who reside in both this state and an adjacent state
  pursuant to a contract as authorized in Section 5117.1 of this title,
- c. enrolls in an institution within The Oklahoma State
   System of Higher Education prior to reaching the age
   of twenty-one (21),
- 20d. has satisfied admission standards as determined by the21Oklahoma State Regents for Higher Education for first-22time-entering students for the appropriate type of23institution, or, if attending a private institution,24has satisfied admission standards as determined by the

private institution. No student participating in the Oklahoma Higher Learning Access Program shall be admitted into an institution of higher education by special admission standards,

- 5 e. has secured admission to, and enrolled in, an institution which is a member of The Oklahoma State 6 7 System of Higher Education, a postsecondary vocational-technical program offered by a technology 8 9 center school that meets the requirements to be 10 eligible for federal student financial aid, or a 11 private institution of higher learning located within 12 this state and accredited pursuant to Section 4103 of 13 this title, and
- 14 f. executes an agreement pursuant to subsection C of
  15 Section 2605 of this title.

16 2. A student who is eligible to participate in the program
17 pursuant to this subsection shall not be required to meet the
18 eligibility requirements set forth in subsection A of this section.

19 C. To retain eligibility while pursuing the program of higher 20 learning in which enrolled, the student shall:

Meet the requirements for retention and degree completion as
 established by the institution in which the student is enrolled;
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2. Maintain good academic standing and satisfactory academic
 progress according to standards of the Oklahoma State Regents for
 Higher Education;

3. Maintain satisfactory academic progress as required for
eligibility for federal Title IV student financial aid programs.
The provisions of this paragraph shall become effective for the
2012-2013 school year;

8 4. Comply with the standards related to maintenance of
9 eligibility as promulgated by the Oklahoma State Regents for Higher
10 Education; and

5. Refrain from conduct that leads to expulsion or suspension
 of more than one semester from an institution of higher education.
 A student who violates the provisions of this paragraph shall
 permanently lose eligibility for program benefits. The provisions
 of this paragraph shall become effective January 1, 2008.

D. The Oklahoma State Regents for Higher Education and the
State Board of Career and Technology Education shall promulgate
rules relating to maintenance of eligibility under the Oklahoma
Higher Learning Access Act by a student.

E. It is the intent of the Legislature that students in the ninth grade for the 1992-93 school year who are determined to be eligible Oklahoma Higher Learning Access students pursuant to the Oklahoma Higher Learning Access Act shall be the first students

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eligible for benefits from the Oklahoma Higher Learning Access Trust
 Fund.

F. The Oklahoma State Regents for Higher Education are authorized to study, develop, and propose criteria for determining award eligibility based upon the completion of seven semesters of high school coursework by a student.

SECTION 2. AMENDATORY 70 O.S. 2021, Section 2605, as
last amended by Section 2, Chapter 274, O.S.L. 2024 (70 O.S. Supp.
2024, Section 2605), is amended to read as follows:

10 Section 2605. A. Each school year, every fifth- through 11 eleventh-grade student in the public and private schools of this 12 state and students who are educated by other means and are in the 13 equivalent of the fifth through eleventh grade shall be apprised, 14 together with the parent, custodial parent, or guardian of the 15 student, of the opportunity for access to higher learning under the 16 Oklahoma Higher Learning Access Program. The Oklahoma State Regents 17 for Higher Education and the State Board of Education shall develop, 18 promote, and coordinate a public awareness program to be utilized in 19 making students and parents aware of the Oklahoma Higher Learning 20 Access Program.

B. On a form provided by the Oklahoma State Regents for Higher
Education, every public school district shall designate at least one
Oklahoma Higher Learning Access Program contact person, who shall be
a counselor or teacher, at each public school site in this state in

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which eighth-, ninth-, tenth-, or eleventh-grade classes are taught.
When requested by the State Regents, the State Board of Education
shall assist the State Regents to ensure the designation of contact
persons. Private schools shall also designate at least one school
official as a contact person. For students who are educated by
other means, a parent or guardian or other person approved by the
State Regents shall be designated the contact person.

C. 1. Students who qualify on the basis of financial need 8 9 according to subsection D or E of this section or who meet the 10 eligibility qualification set forth in subparagraph a of paragraph 1 11 of subsection B of Section 2603 of this title prior to entering the 12 eleventh grade no later than December 31 of their twelfth-grade year 13 or prior to reaching the age of sixteen (16) seventeen (17) and who 14 qualify on the basis of the standards and provisions promulgated by 15 the Oklahoma State Regents for Higher Education shall be given the 16 opportunity throughout the eighth-, ninth-, tenth-, and eleventh-17 grade years  $\tau$  and no later than December 31 of the twelfth-grade 18 year, for students enrolled in a public or private school, or 19 between the ages of thirteen (13) and sixteen (16) seventeen (17), 20 for students who are educated by other means, to enter into 21 participation in the program by agreeing to, throughout the 22 remainder of their school years or educational program: 23 attend school or an educational program regularly and a.

do homework regularly,

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- b. refrain from substance abuse,

c. refrain from commission of crimes or delinquent acts,
d. have school work and school records reviewed by
mentors designated pursuant to the program,
e. provide information requested by the Oklahoma State
Regents for Higher Education or the State Board of

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f. participate in program activities.

Education, and

9 2. Students who meet the eligibility qualification set forth in subparagraph a of paragraph 1 of subsection B of Section 2603 of 10 11 this title after completing the eleventh grade December 31 of their 12 twelfth-grade year or after reaching the age of seventeen (17) 13 eighteen (18) shall be given the opportunity prior to reaching the 14 age of twenty-one (21) to enter into participation in the program 15 and shall execute an agreement with provisions as determined by the 16 Oklahoma State Regents for Higher Education.

17 3. The contact person shall maintain the agreements, which 18 shall be executed on forms provided by the Oklahoma State Regents 19 for Higher Education and managed according to regulations 20 promulgated by the Oklahoma State Regents for Higher Education, and 21 the contact person shall monitor compliance of the student with the 22 terms of the agreement. The Oklahoma State Regents for Higher 23 Education are authorized to process student agreements and verify 24 compliance with the agreements. Students failing to comply with the 1 terms of the agreement shall not be eligible for the awards provided 2 in Section 2604 of this title.

<u>4. The Oklahoma State Regents for Higher Education may provide</u>
<u>an exception to the age limits provided for in paragraphs 1 and 2 of</u>
this subsection pursuant to subsection L of this section.

5. Notwithstanding the provisions of Sections 5-132 and 5-132.1
of this title, a student who is age twenty-one (21) or older shall
not be eligible to enter into participation in the program.

9 D. Except as otherwise provided for in subsection E of this
10 section and except for students who qualify pursuant to subsection B
11 of Section 2603 of this title, a student shall not be found to be in
12 financial need for purposes of the Oklahoma Higher Learning Access
13 Program if:

14 1. Beginning with eighth-, ninth-, or tenth-grade students who 15 are enrolled in a public or private school or students between the 16 ages of thirteen (13) and fifteen (15) who are educated by other 17 means who apply for participation in the program in the 2017-2018 18 school year, the federal adjusted gross income of the student's 19 parent(s) exceeds Fifty-five Thousand Dollars (\$55,000.00) per year;

20 2. Beginning with eighth-, ninth-, tenth-, or eleventh-grade 21 students who are enrolled in a public or private school or students 22 between the ages of thirteen (13) and sixteen (16) who are educated 23 by other means who apply for participation in the program in the 24 2021-2022 school year, the federal adjusted gross income of the

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1 student's parent(s) exceeds Sixty Thousand Dollars (\$60,000.00) per
2 year;

3 3. Beginning with eighth-, ninth-, tenth-, or eleventh-grade 4 students who are enrolled in a public or private school or students 5 between the ages of thirteen (13) and sixteen (16) who are educated 6 by other means who apply for participation in the program in the 7 2022-2023 school year:

the federal adjusted gross income of the student's 8 a. 9 parent(s), who have two or fewer dependent children, exceeds Sixty Thousand Dollars (\$60,000.00) per year, 10 11 the federal adjusted gross income of the student's b. 12 parent(s), who have three or four dependent children, 13 exceeds Seventy Thousand Dollars (\$70,000.00) per 14 year, or

15 the federal adjusted gross income of the student's с. 16 parent(s), who have five or more dependent children, 17 exceeds Eighty Thousand Dollars (\$80,000.00) per year; 18 Beginning with eighth-, ninth-, tenth-, or eleventh-grade 4. 19 students or twelfth-grade students no later than December 31 of 20 their twelfth-grade year who are enrolled in a public or private 21 school or students between the ages of thirteen (13) and seventeen 22 (17) who are educated by other means who apply for participation in 23 the program in the 2025-2026 school year:

Beginning with the 2018-2019 academic year, prior to receiving any Oklahoma Higher Learning Access Program benefit award 12 13 for any year during which the student is enrolled in an institution 14 which is a member of The Oklahoma State System of Higher Education, 15 a postsecondary vocational-technical program offered by a technology 16 center school that meets the requirements to be eligible for federal 17 student financial aid, or a private institution of higher learning 18 located within this state and accredited pursuant to Section 4103 of 19 this title, the federal adjusted gross income of the student's 20 parent(s) exceeds One Hundred Thousand Dollars (\$100,000.00) per 21 year.

The determination of financial qualification as set forth in this paragraph shall be based on the income of the student, not the income of the parent(s), if a student:

- a. is determined to be independent of the student's
  parents for federal financial aid purposes,
  b. was in the permanent custody of the Department of
  Human Services at the time the student enrolled in the
  program, or
- c. was in the court-ordered custody of a federally
  recognized Indian tribe, as defined by the federal
  Indian Child Welfare Act of 1978, at the time the
  student enrolled in the program.

10 The provisions of this paragraph shall apply to any student who 11 has received an Oklahoma Higher Learning Access Program benefit 12 award after the 2017-2018 school year; and

13 5. 6. The Oklahoma State Regents for Higher Education shall 14 review the determination of financial qualification as set forth in 15 paragraphs 1, 2, and 3, and 4 of this subsection if the income from 16 taxable and nontaxable sources of the student's parent(s) includes 17 income received from nontaxable military benefits or income received 18 from the federal Social Security Administration due to the death or 19 disability of the student's parent(s). If the income from taxable 20 and nontaxable sources of the student's parent(s), excluding income 21 received from nontaxable military benefits or income received from 22 the federal Social Security Administration due to the death or 23 disability of the student's parent(s), does not exceed the 24 limitations set forth by paragraphs 1, 2, and 3, and 4 of this

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1 subsection, the student shall be determined to have met the 2 financial qualification set forth in paragraphs 1, 2, and 3, and 4 3 of this subsection.

4 A student who was adopted between birth and twelve (12) Ε. 1. 5 years of age while in the permanent custody of the Department of Human Services, in the court-ordered custody of a licensed private 6 7 nonprofit child-placing agency, or federally recognized Indian tribe, as defined by the federal Indian Child Welfare Act of 1978, 8 shall not be found to be in financial need for purposes of the 9 10 Oklahoma Higher Learning Access Program if at the time the student 11 begins postsecondary education and prior to receiving any Oklahoma 12 Higher Learning Access Program benefit award, the federal adjusted 13 gross income of the student's parent(s) exceeds One Hundred Fifty 14 Thousand Dollars (\$150,000.00) per year. The provisions of this 15 paragraph shall not apply to any student who has received an 16 Oklahoma Higher Learning Access Program benefit award prior to the 17 2012-2013 school year.

18 2. A student who was adopted between thirteen (13) and 19 seventeen (17) years of age while in the permanent custody of the 20 Department of Human Services, in the court-ordered custody of a 21 licensed private nonprofit child-placing agency, or federally 22 recognized Indian tribe, as defined by the federal Indian Child 23 Welfare Act of 1978, shall not be found to be in financial need for 24 purposes of the Oklahoma Higher Learning Access Program if at the

time the student begins postsecondary education and prior to receiving any Oklahoma Higher Learning Access Program benefit award, the federal adjusted gross income of the student's parent(s) exceeds Two Hundred Thousand Dollars (\$200,000.00) per year. The provisions of this paragraph shall not apply to any student who has received an Oklahoma Higher Learning Access Program benefit award prior to the 2012-2013 school year.

8 3. A student who was placed in the custody of the Department of 9 Human Services at any time during the eighth, ninth, tenth, or 10 eleventh <u>grades grade</u> and enrolls in the program no later than his 11 or her official date of high school graduation shall not be found to 12 be in financial need for purposes of the Oklahoma Higher Learning 13 Access Program if the federal adjusted gross income of the student 14 exceeds Sixty Thousand Dollars (\$60,000.00) per year.

15 Except for students who qualify pursuant to subsection B of 4. 16 Section 2603 of this title, the determination of financial 17 qualification as set forth in this subsection shall be based on the 18 income of the student, not the income of the parent(s), if the 19 student is determined to be independent of the student's parent(s) 20 for federal financial aid purposes. A determination of financial 21 qualification shall not be required for the student who meets the 22 criteria set forth in this subsection at the time the student 23 applies for participation in the program. The provisions of this 24 paragraph shall not apply to any student who has received an

Oklahoma Higher Learning Access Program benefit award prior to the
 2008-2009 school year.

18		teacher is not required to have been employed by the
19		same public school district for ten (10) consecutive
20		years. Certified classroom teacher does not mean a
21		certified teacher who is employed as a school district
22		superintendent, principal, or any other position
23		within the administration of a public school district
24		when his or her child applies for participation in the

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#### program or prior to his or her child receiving any

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#### Oklahoma Higher Learning Access Program benefit award.

F. The financial qualification of a student as set forth in
subsections D and E of this section shall be certified by the
contact person or by the Oklahoma State Regents for Higher Education
on the agreement form provided by the Oklahoma State Regents for
Higher Education. The form shall be retained in the permanent
record of the student and a copy forwarded to the Oklahoma State
Regents for Higher Education.

10 G. Agreements shall be witnessed by the parent, custodial 11 parent, or guardian of the student, who shall further agree to: 12 1. Assist the student in achieving compliance with the 13 agreements;

14 2. Confer, when requested to do so, with the school contact 15 person, other school personnel, and program mentors;

Provide information requested by the Oklahoma State Regents
 for Higher Education or the State Board of Education; and

Assist the student in completing forms and reports required
 for program participation, making applications to institutions and
 schools of higher learning, and filing applications for student
 grants and scholarships.

H. The Oklahoma State Regents for Higher Education shall
promulgate rules for the determination of student compliance with
agreements made pursuant to this section.

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I. The Oklahoma State Regents for Higher Education shall designate personnel to coordinate tracking of program records for the years when students participating in the program are still in the schools or are being educated by other means, provide staff development for contact persons in the schools, and provide liaison with the State Board of Education and local organizations and individuals participating in the program.

J. The school district where an Oklahoma Higher Learning Access Program student is enrolled when the student begins participation in the program and any subsequent school district where the student enrolls shall forward information regarding participation by the student in the program to a school to which the student transfers upon the request of the school for the records of the student.

14 K. Students participating in the Oklahoma Higher Learning 15 Access Program shall provide their Social Security number or their 16 student identification number used by their school to the Oklahoma 17 State Regents for Higher Education. The <u>State</u> Regents shall keep 18 the numbers confidential and use them only for administrative 19 purposes.

L. The State Regents may provide an exception to the age limits provided for in paragraphs 1 and 2 of subsection C of this section to a student due to hardship circumstances and allow an application to the Oklahoma Higher Learning Access Program for twelfth-grade students enrolled in a public or private school and students who are

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1	educated by other means and are in the equivalent of twelfth grade.
2	Provided, however, the exception due to hardship circumstances shall
3	not apply to:
4	1. A student enrolled in a public or private school after the
5	student's official date of high school graduation;
6	2. A student educated by other means who is age nineteen (19)
7	<u>or older; or</u>
8	3. Any student who is age twenty-one (21) or older.
9	The Oklahoma State Regents for Higher Education shall promulgate
10	rules to implement the provisions of this subsection.
11	SECTION 3. This act shall become effective July 1, 2025.
12	SECTION 4. It being immediately necessary for the preservation
13	of the public peace, health, or safety, an emergency is hereby
14	declared to exist, by reason whereof this act shall take effect and
15	be in full force from and after its passage and approval.
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
