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| 20 | BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:  |
| 21 | SECTION 1. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified   |
| 22 | in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 2904 of Title 74, unless there   |
| 23 | is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:   |
| 24 | As used in this act:   |

1. "Extremely low-income household" means a household that has
 an income not in excess of thirty percent (30%) of the area median
 income, adjusted for the size of the household, as determined by the
 United States Department of Housing and Urban Development;

2. "Very low-income household" means a household that has an
income of more than thirty percent (30%) of the area median income
but no more than fifty percent (50%) of the area median income,
adjusted for the size of the household, as determined by the United
States Department of Housing and Urban Development;

3. "Low-income household" means a household that has an income of more than fifty percent (50%) of the area median income but no more than eighty percent (80%) of the area median income, adjusted for the size of the household, as determined by the United States Department of Housing and Urban Development;

4. "Moderate-income household" means a household that has an income of more than eighty percent (80%) of the area median income but no more than one hundred twenty percent (120%) of the area median income, adjusted for the size of the household, as determined by the United States Department of Housing and Urban Development; and

5. "Middle-income household" means a household that has an income of more than one hundred twenty percent (120%) of the area median income but no more than one hundred sixty percent (160%) of the area median income, adjusted for the size of the household, as

determined by the United States Department of Housing and Urban
 Development.

SECTION 2. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified 3 in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 2904.1 of Title 74, unless there 4 5 is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows: 6 There is hereby created until November 1, 2028, the Oklahoma Α. 7 Workforce Housing Commission. The Commission shall be composed of fifteen (15) members. The members shall serve as follows: 8 9 1. Five members shall be appointed by the Governor: one shall be a person living in an urban area with a 10 a. 11 population more than one hundred thousand (100,000) 12 persons according to the latest Federal Decennial 13 Census, 14 b. one shall be a person living in a rural community in a 15 county with a population less than seventy-five 16 thousand (75,000) persons according to the latest 17 Federal Decennial Census, 18 one shall be an official serving in a city, town, or с. 19 political subdivision in a county with a population 20 less than seventy-five thousand (75,000) persons 21 according to the latest Federal Decennial Census, 22 d. one shall represent an organization that assists 23 special populations, including, but not limited to, 24 the elderly, the disabled, veterans, and children

Oklahoma that provides affordable housing in rural 4 5 areas, d. one shall be a representative from a community housing 6 7 development organization, as determined by the United States Department of Housing and Urban Development, 8 9 and one shall represent a not-for-profit organization that 10 e. 11 serves low-income Oklahomans experiencing difficulty 12 in obtaining affordable housing; and 13 4. The following shall be ex officio members: 14 one shall be a representative from the Oklahoma a. 15 Department of Commerce representing community 16 development, 17 b. one shall be an Oklahoma representative of the United 18 States Department of Agriculture, and 19 the Executive Director of the Oklahoma Housing Finance с. 20 Agency, or his or her designee. 21 Β. No member of the Commission shall receive a salary or 22 reimbursement for duties performed as a member of the Commission; 23 however, members may be eligible to receive travel reimbursement as 24 provided in the State Travel Reimbursement Act.

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C. The meetings of the Commission shall be subject to the
 Oklahoma Open Meeting Act.

D. The Commission shall utilize the resources available to
address the needs of extremely low-income households, very lowincome households, low-income households, moderate-income
households, and middle-income households in order to promote a
condition in which suitable housing is available to as many persons
as possible pursuant to rules promulgated by the Oklahoma Housing
Finance Agency pursuant to Section 3 of this act.

E. The Commission shall submit a comprehensive annual report to
the Oklahoma Legislature, the Speaker of the Oklahoma House of
Representatives, the President Pro Tempore of the Oklahoma State
Senate, and all legislative members of the Commission beginning
December 1, 2026.

SECTION 3. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified
in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 2904.2 of Title 74, unless there
is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:
The Oklahoma Housing Finance Agency shall promulgate rules

20 1. An initial comprehensive Oklahoma workforce housing
21 environmental scan and needs assessment;

22 2. A comprehensive Oklahoma affordable housing annual report
23 and action plan to be submitted electronically to the Governor and
24 the Legislature;

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3. A state plan for long-term expansion of workforce and
 affordable housing across the state;

4. An update on the implementation and outcomes of the
investment in the Oklahoma Housing Stability Program created in
Section 2903 et seq. of Title 74 of the Oklahoma Statutes;

5. An evaluation to make recommendations to the Legislature on
policies and incentives to increase the development, inventory, and
diversification of affordable housing; and

9 6. Any other rules necessary to carry out the purpose and
10 mission of the Oklahoma Workforce Housing Commission pursuant to
11 Section 2 of this act.

12 SECTION 4. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified 13 in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 2904.3 of Title 74, unless there 14 is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:

15 There is hereby created in the State Treasury a revolving Α. 16 fund to be designated as the "Oklahoma Workforce Housing Commission 17 Revolving Fund", which shall consist of all monies appropriated, 18 transferred, or otherwise designated to the fund by law. The 19 revolving fund shall be a continuing fund, not subject to fiscal 20 year limitations, and shall be under the administration of the 21 Oklahoma Workforce Housing Commission and shall be budgeted and 22 expended in accordance with the provisions of subsection B of this 23 section for the purpose of improving the stock and affordability of 24 Oklahoma housing.

| 3  | or prior to the approval by the Legislature of promulgated permanent |

| 6  | SECTION 5. This act shall become effective November 1, 2025.         |
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
