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15	BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:
16	SECTION 1. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified
17	in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 6-189.3 of Title 70, unless
18	there is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:
19	A. For this section, "special education administrator" means
20	the director and assistant director of a special education program
21	for a school district.
22	B. Beginning July 1, 2025, no school district shall employ a
23	special education administrator unless the individual:
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Holds a valid standard teaching certificate issued by the
 State Board of Education; and

2. Except as provided for in subsection D of this section,
obtains an acknowledgment of competency within one (1) year of being
employed as a special education administrator.

C. The State Board of Education shall issue an acknowledgement
of competency in the area of mild-moderate disabilities, severeprofound disabilities, or comprehensive special education to a
special education administrator who has:

Satisfactorily completed a one-hundred-fifty-clock-hour
 special education program prescribed by the State Board of Education
 which shall include training on the rules and regulations for the
 Individuals with Disabilities Act (IDEA); and

14 2. Achieved at least a seventy percent (70%) on a competency 15 examination in the area of mild-moderate disabilities, severe-16 profound disabilities, or comprehensive special education 17 administered by the State Department of Education.

D. An individual who has a valid Special Education Teaching
Certificate as provided for in Sections 6-122.7, 6-122.8, or 6-122.9
of Title 70 of the Oklahoma Statutes shall not be required to obtain
an acknowledgement of competency.

SECTION 2. This act shall become effective July 1, 2025.
 SECTION 3. It being immediately necessary for the preservation
 of the public peace, health or safety, an emergency is hereby
