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13	BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:		
14	SECTION 1. AMENDATORY 68 O.S. 2021, Section 4503, is		
15	amended to read as follows:		
16	Section 4503. A. As used in the Oklahoma Remote Quality Jobs		
17	Incentive Act:		
18	1. "Basic industry" means an establishment that attracts remote		
19	workers to the state whose purpose is to increase the state's		
20	population and who may receive rebates on the remote workers		
21	provided that the remote workers meet the wage and health insurance		
22	requirements in state and provide evidence of such to the proxy		
23	establishment;		
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1 2. "New direct job" shall include full-time-equivalent 2 employment in this state of remote workers who are employed by an 3 establishment other than the proxy establishment which has qualified to receive incentive payments for attracting remote workers to the 4 5 state. Such jobs held by remote workers did not exist in this state 6 prior to the date of approval by the Oklahoma Department of Commerce 7 of the application of the proxy establishment. A job shall be 8 deemed to exist in this state prior to approval of an application if 9 the activities and functions for which the particular job exists 10 have been ongoing at any time within six (6) months prior to such 11 approval;

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- 3. "Proxy establishment" means:
- 13 a. a public trust which:

14	(1)	is organized and existing under Section 176 of
15		Title 60 of the Oklahoma Statutes for the benefit
16		of a geographic area which includes a city or
17		county or some combination thereof, and
18	(2)	benefits a geographic area where new direct jobs
19		which meet the requirements of the Oklahoma
20		Remote Quality Jobs Incentive Act are created by
21		an establishment, other than the proxy
22		establishment, or
23	b. an e	establishment which facilitates the attraction of

remote workers to the State of Oklahoma;

1 4. "Remote worker" refers to a work flexibility arrangement 2 under which an employee performs the duties and responsibilities of such employee's position, and other authorized activities, from an 3 4 approved work site other than the location from which the employee 5 would otherwise work, which shall not be located within the physical boundaries of the State of Oklahoma. The remote worker should not 6 7 have lived in the State of Oklahoma in the previous twelve (12) months; 8

9 5. "Estimated direct state benefits" means the tax revenues 10 projected by the Department to accrue to the state as a result of 11 new direct jobs;

12 6. "Estimated direct state costs" means the costs projected by
13 the Department to accrue to the state as a result of new direct
14 jobs. Such costs shall include, but not be limited to:

a. the costs of education of new state resident children,
b. the costs of public health, public safety and
transportation services to be provided to new state
residents,

19 c. the costs of other state services to be provided to20 new state residents, and

21 d. the costs of other state services;

7. "Estimated net direct state benefits" means the estimated
direct state benefits less the estimated direct state costs; and

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8. "Net benefit rate" means the estimated net direct state
 benefits computed as a percentage of gross payroll, and shall not
 exceed five percent (5%).

4 A proxy establishment shall be required to obtain from Β. 5 remote workers proof of basic health benefits plans for the individuals it includes in an application. The proxy establishment 6 7 shall submit the information to the Oklahoma Department of Commerce 8 and shall ensure that the basic health benefits plans consist of the 9 following elements or elements substantially equivalent thereto: 10 1. Not more than fifty percent (50%) of the premium shall be 11 paid by the employee; 12 2. Coverage for basic hospital care; 13 3. Coverage for physician care; 14 4. Coverage for mental health care; 15 5. Coverage for substance abuse treatment; 16 6. Coverage for prescription drugs; and 17 7. Coverage for prenatal care. 18 provide coverage where not more than fifty percent (50%) of the 19 premium shall be paid by the employee; however, services provided by 20 an Employee Assistance Plan (EAP) are not sufficient to meet this 21 definition. 22 SECTION 2.
