9	An Act relating to agriculture; requiring persons entering certain areas to maintain position of the
10	gate at use; prescribing penalties for violation; providing for promulgation of rules; providing for
11	codification; and providing an effective date.

13	BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:
14	SECTION 1. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified
15	in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 2-34 of Title 2, unless there is
16	created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:
17	A. Any individual entering through gates used for ingress or
18	egress to a property designated as an easement shall maintain the
19	position of the gate upon use.
20	B. 1. Any individual who violates the provisions of subsection
21	A of this section shall, upon conviction, be guilty of a misdemeanor
22	punishable by a fine not more than Five Hundred Dollars (\$500.00),
23	by imprisonment in a county jail for not more than ninety (90) days,
24	or by both such fine and imprisonment.

2. Any individual convicted of a second offense shall, upon
 conviction, be guilty of a misdemeanor punishable by a fine not more
 than One Thousand Dollars (\$1,000.00), by imprisonment in a county
 jail for not more than one hundred eighty (180) days, or by both
 such fine and imprisonment.

3. Any individual convicted of a third or subsequent offense
shall, upon conviction, be punished by a fine not more than One
Thousand Five Hundred Dollars (\$1,500.00), by imprisonment in a
county jail for not more than one (1) year, or by both such fine and
imprisonment.

4. Any individual convicted pursuant to the provisions of this
 subsection shall also be liable for damages.

C. The Oklahoma Department of Agriculture, Food, and Forestry shall promulgate rules necessary to implement the provisions of this act.

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 SECTION 2. This act shall become effective November 1, 2025.

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
