10	An Act relating to the Alzheimer's Dementia and Other Forms of Dementia Special Care Disclosure Act;
11	amending 63 O.S. 2021, Section 1-879.2c, which relates to disclosure of care; imposing certain duty
12	on referral agencies; broadening applicability of certain penalties; requiring certain facilities to
13	post specified information; updating statutory language; updating statutory references; and
14	providing an effective date.
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17	BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:
18	SECTION 1. AMENDATORY 63 O.S. 2021, Section 1-879.2c, is
19	amended to read as follows:
20	Section 1-879.2c. A. 1. Pursuant to rules promulgated under
21	the provisions of the Alzheimer's Dementia and Other Forms of
22	Dementia Special Care Disclosure Act, any nursing facility,
23	residential care facility, assisted living facility, adult day care
24	center, continuum of care facility, or special care facility that

1 publicly advertises, intentionally markets, or otherwise engages in promotional campaigns for the purpose of communicating that said 2 such facility offers care, memory care, or treatment methods within 3 the facility that distinguish it as being especially applicable to 4 5 or suitable to persons with Alzheimer's dementia or other forms of dementia diagnoses shall disclose the type of care, memory care, or 6 treatment provided that distinguishes it as being especially 7 applicable to or suitable for such persons. 8

9 2. The disclosure shall be made using a form developed by the10 State Department of Health and shall be made to:

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the Department,

a.

b. any representative of a person with Alzheimer's
dementia or other form of dementia who is considering
placement within a special care unit, program, or
facility, and

16 c. the State Long-Term Care Ombudsman.

17 3. <u>A referral agency</u>, when disclosing documents pursuant to

18 Section 1-866.2 of this title, shall provide any representative of a

19 person with Alzheimer's dementia or other form of dementia who is

20 considering placement within a special care unit, program, or

21 facility notice that the representative is entitled to request from

22 the unit, program, or facility the disclosure form for each facility

23 the referral agency recommends.

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<u>4.</u> The facility shall submit the disclosure form to the
 Department prior to entering into any agreement to provide care or
 services.

4 4. 5. The Department shall examine each disclosure for
5 completeness and accuracy at the time the disclosure is submitted to
6 the Department.

5. <u>6.</u> The Department shall review the most recent disclosure in
the Department's records during the facility's regular inspection to
verify that the disclosure is current and that the services
described in the disclosure are provided to residents as described
in the disclosure.

B. The information disclosed as required by this section shallinclude the following areas:

A written description of the special care unit, program, or
 facility's overall philosophy and mission as it relates to the needs
 of residents with Alzheimer's dementia or other forms of dementia;

The process and criteria for placement in, or transfer or
 discharge from, the unit, program, or facility;

19 3. The process used for assessment, establishment, and 20 implementation of a resident plan of care, as it relates to 21 Alzheimer's dementia and other forms of dementia, including the 22 method by which the plan evolves, the frequency of assessment, and 23 how the facility will respond to changes in the condition of the 24 resident;

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4. Staff-to-resident ratios, staff training and continuing
 education that are in addition to all regularly prescribed training
 and are commensurate with the need for increased care and
 supervision for residents with Alzheimer's dementia and or other
 forms of dementia;

5. The physical environment and design features appropriate to7 support the functioning of cognitively impaired residents;

8 6. The types and frequency of resident activities designed for 9 residents with Alzheimer's dementia or other forms of dementia and 10 descriptions of those therapeutic activities designed to address 11 cognitive function and engage residents with varying stages of 12 dementia;

7. The involvement of families in care planning and other
aspects of care, and the availability of family support programs;
8. The fees for care and any additional fees; and
9. Any accreditations or certifications issued to the facility
related to the care and services provided to residents with
Alzheimer's dementia or other forms of dementia.

19 C. The Department, with input from the Alzheimer-Dementia 20 Disclosure Act Advisory Council, shall develop a standardized 21 disclosure form. Any change in the information initially submitted 22 by the facility or other entity shall be reported to the Department 23 at the time the change is made.

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D. The provisions of this section shall not be construed to
 preclude a facility without a special care unit or program from
 admitting a person with Alzheimer's dementia or other forms of
 dementia.

E. The State Commissioner of Health, with input from the
Alzheimer-Dementia Disclosure Act Advisory Council, shall promulgate
rules to effectuate the provisions of the Alzheimer's Dementia and
Other Forms of Dementia Special Care Disclosure Act.

9 F. There is hereby created the Alzheimer-Dementia Disclosure 10 Act Advisory Council. The Council shall make recommendations to the 11 State Commissioner of Health regarding the disclosure form and rules 12 promulgated pursuant to the Alzheimer's Dementia and Other Forms of 13 Dementia Special Care Disclosure Act.

The Council shall consist of nine (9) members to be 1. 14 appointed by the State Commissioner of Health for such terms as he 15 or she chooses. The members shall be individuals who have knowledge 16 and expertise in the field of memory care or individuals who are 17 consumer representatives directly impacted by memory-care services, 18 provided that neither the members with knowledge and expertise in 19 the field nor the members who are consumer representatives shall 20 comprise more than two-thirds (2/3) of the total membership. The 21 members who are consumer representatives shall be individuals with 22 immediate family members who have received or are currently 23 receiving memory-care services in Oklahoma and shall not be 24

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employees or board members of any facilities or entities subject to
 the Alzheimer's Dementia and Other Forms of Dementia Special Care
 Disclosure Act.

2. The members of the Council shall serve without compensation.
3. The Council shall conduct an organizational meeting at a
date and location to be chosen by the Commissioner and as frequently
thereafter as necessary to perform the duties imposed upon it. A
majority of the members present shall constitute a quorum.

9 4. Staff assistance for the Council shall be provided by the10 staff of the State Department of Health.

G. Violation of If a facility described in paragraph 1 of 11 subsection A of this section, or any individual employed or 12 contracted by such facility, violates any of the provisions of this 13 act the Alzheimer's Dementia and Other Forms of Dementia Special 14 Care Disclosure Act or the rules issued pursuant to this act 15 promulgated pursuant thereto, the facility shall be subject the 16 offending facility to the notice and enforcement provisions 17 established for the facility's license by the Department. 18

H. Any facility that offers specialized memory or dementia care
through a specific unit or program shall post the:

21 <u>1. The</u> disclosure form, including the information required to 22 be included by this section, on the facility's website<u>; and</u>

23 <u>2. A poster, in a conspicuous location in the special care</u>
 24 unit, program, or facility where care is provided for persons with

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1	Alzheimer's dementia or other forms of dementia, stating that if
2	such persons or their representatives were not given a copy of the
3	disclosure form, they may file a complaint with the Consumer
4	Protection Unit of the Office of the Attorney General.
5	I. The Department shall establish a website with a list of
6	those facilities that have filed a disclosure form pursuant to this
7	act the Alzheimer's Dementia and Other Forms of Dementia Special
8	Care Disclosure Act. The website shall contain a link to the
9	submitted disclosure form and a table containing items from the
10	disclosure form, including staffing ratios, staff training, special
11	programming and activities, and accreditations or certifications.
12	SECTION 2. This act shall become effective November 1, 2025.
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
