0 BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:

1 SECTION 1. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified
2 in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 6060.3b of Title 36, unless
3 there is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:

4 A. As used in this section:

5 1. "Contraceptive drugs" means all drugs approved by the United
6 States Food and Drug Administration that are used to prevent
7 pregnancy including but not limited to hormonal drugs administered
8 orally, transdermally, and intravaginally; and

9 2. "Health benefit plan" means a health benefit plan as defined
0 pursuant to Section 6060.4 of Title 36 of the Oklahoma Statutes.

1 B. Any health benefit plan that is offered, issued, or renewed
2 on or after the effective date of this act that offers coverage for
3 contraceptive drugs shall provide coverage for an enrollee to
4 obtain:

1 1. A three-month supply of a contraceptive drug at once the
2 first time the enrollee obtains the drug; and

3 2. A six-month supply of the contraceptive drug at once each
4 subsequent time that the enrollee obtains the same drug, regardless
5 of whether the enrollee was enrolled in the health benefit plan the
6 first time that the enrollee obtained the drug.

7 An enrollee may obtain only one six-month supply of a covered
8 prescription drug during each six-month period.

9 C. Nothing in this section shall be construed to prohibit an
0 enrollee of a health benefit plan from requesting a smaller supply
1 or to prohibit a prescribing provider from prescribing a smaller
2 supply if such a prescription is supported by clinical utility and
3 medical appropriateness.

4 D. Nothing in this section shall be construed to require
5 coverage under a health benefit plan for any medications that could
6 be used to terminate an existing pregnancy.

7 SECTION 2. This act shall become effective November 1, 2025.
