In any civil action to recover damages arising from claimed bodily injury, after the trier of fact makes the findings required 2 by subsection D of this section, the court shall enter judgment in 3 favor of the plaintiff for economic damages in the amount determined 4 5 pursuant to paragraph 2 of subsection D of this section, and subject to paragraph 4 of subsection D of this section, the court shall 6 enter a judgment in favor of the plaintiff for noneconomic damages. 7 Except as provided in subsection C of this section, in no event 8 9 shall a judgment for noneconomic damages exceed the maximum recoverable amounts set forth in subsection B of this section. 10 Subsection B of this section shall be applied in a jury trial only 11 after the trier of fact has made its factual findings and 12 13 determinations as to the amount of the plaintiff's damages.

2. "Economic damages" means any type of pecuniary harm

all wages, salaries or other compensation lost as a 3 a. result of a bodily injury that is the subject of a 4 5 civil action, all costs incurred for medical care or treatment, 6 b. rehabilitation services, or other care, treatment, 7 services, products or accommodations as a result of a 8 9 bodily injury that is the subject of a civil action, or 10 any other costs incurred as a result of a bodily 11 с. injury that is the subject of a civil action; 12 3. "Fraudulent" or "fraud" means "actual fraud" as defined 13 pursuant to Section 58 of Title 15 of the Oklahoma Statutes; 14 4. "Gross negligence" means the want of slight care and 15 diligence; 16 5. "Malice" involves hatred, spite or ill will, or the doing of 17 a wrongful act intentionally without just cause or excuse; 18 6. "Noneconomic damages" means nonpecuniary harm that arises 19 from a bodily injury that is the subject of a civil action, 20 including damages for pain and suffering, loss of society, 21 consortium, companionship, care, assistance, attention, protection, 22 advice, guidance, counsel, instruction, training, education, 23 disfigurement, mental anguish and any other intangible loss; and 24
