6 An Act relating to child sexual abuse material;
7 amending Section 1, Chapter 181, O.S.L. 2024 (15 O.S.
8 Supp. 2024, Section 791), which relates to
9 definitions; modifying term; 21 O.S. 2021, Section
10 843.5, as amended by Section 2, Chapter 151, O.S.L.
11 2024 (21 O.S. Supp. 2024, Section 843.5), which
12 relates to child abuse; modifying term; amending 21
13 O.S. 2021, Section 1040.12a, as amended by Section 3,
14 Chapter 103, O.S.L. 2024 (21 O.S. Supp. 2024, Section
15 1040.12a), which relates to possession of child
16 sexual abuse material; modifying term; amending 21
17 O.S. 2021, Section 1024.1, as amended by Section 2,
18 Chapter 103, O.S.L. 2024 (21 O.S. Supp. 2024, Section
19 1024.1), which relates to definitions; modifying
20 term; updating statutory language; and providing an
21 effective date.

22 BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:

23 SECTION 1. AMENDATORY Section 1, Chapter 181, O.S.L.
24 2024 (15 O.S. Supp. 2024, Section 791), is amended to read as
25 follows:

26 Section 791. As used in this act:

- 27 1. "Child ~~pornography~~ sexual abuse material" means the same as
28 used in Section 1024.1 of Title 21 of the Oklahoma Statutes;
29 2. "Child sexual exploitation" means the same as used in
30 Section 843.5 of Title 21 of the Oklahoma Statutes;

1 3. "Commercial entity" means a corporation, limited liability
2 company, partnership, limited partnership, sole proprietorship, or
3 other legally recognized entity;

4 4. "Digitized identification card" means a data file available
5 on any mobile device, which has connectivity to the Internet,
6 through a state-approved application that allows the mobile device
7 to download the data file from a state agency or any authorized
8 agent of a state agency that contains all of the data elements
9 visible on the face and back of a license or identification card and
10 displays the current state of the licensed or identification card;

11 5. "Distribute" means to issue, sell, give, provide, deliver,
12 transfer, transmit, circulate, or disseminate by any means;

13 6. "Harmful to minors" means the same as ~~terms~~ defined in
14 ~~Sections~~ Section 1040.75 ~~through 1040.77~~ of Title 21 of the Oklahoma
15 Statutes;

16 7. "Internet" means the international computer network of both
17 federal and nonfederal interoperable packet switched data networks;

18 8. "Minor" means any person eighteen (18) years of age or
19 younger;

20 9. "News-gathering organization" means any of the following:

- 21 a. an employee of a newspaper, news publication, or news
22 source, printed or on an online or mobile platform, of
23 current news and public interest, while operating as
24 an employee as provided in this subsection, who can

1 provide documentation of such employment with the
2 newspaper, news publication, or news source, or
3 b. an employee of a radio broadcast station, television
4 broadcast station, cable television operator, or wire
5 service while operating as an employee as provided in
6 this subsection, who can provide documentation of such
7 employment;

8 10. ~~"Obscene material"~~ "Obscene" means the same as used in
9 Section 1024.1 of Title 21 of the Oklahoma Statutes;

10 11. "Publish" means to communicate or make information
11 available to another person or entity on a publicly available
12 Internet website;

13 12. "Reasonable age verification methods" means verifying that
14 the person seeking access to the available material is eighteen (18)
15 years of age or older by using the following methods:

- 16 a. use of a digitized identification card as defined in
17 this section,
18 b. verification through an independent, third-party age
19 verification service that compares the personal
20 information entered by the individual who is seeking
21 access to the material that is available from a
22 commercially available database, or aggregate of
23 databases, that is regularly used by government
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1 agencies and businesses for purpose of age and
2 identity verification, or

3 c. any commercially reasonable method that relies on
4 public or private transactional data to verify the age
5 of the person attempting to access the material;

6 13. "Substantial portion" means when more than a third of the
7 total material available on the website meets the definition of
8 material harmful to minors as defined in this section; and

9 14. "Transactional data" means a sequence of information that
10 documents as exchange, agreement, or transfer between an individual,
11 commercial entity, or a third party used for the purpose of
12 satisfying a request or event. Transactional data may include, but
13 not be limited to, records from mortgage, education, and employment
14 entities.

15 SECTION 2. AMENDATORY 21 O.S. 2021, Section 843.5, as
16 amended by Section 2, Chapter 151, O.S.L. 2024 (21 O.S. Supp. 2024,
17 Section 843.5), is amended to read as follows:

18 Section 843.5. A. Any person who shall willfully or
19 maliciously engage in child abuse, as defined in this section,
20 shall, upon conviction, be guilty of a felony punishable by
21 imprisonment in the custody of the Department of Corrections not
22 exceeding life imprisonment, or by imprisonment in a county jail not
23 exceeding one (1) year, or by a fine ~~of~~ not less than Five Hundred
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1 Dollars (\$500.00) nor more than Five Thousand Dollars (\$5,000.00),
2 or both such fine and imprisonment.

3 B. Any person responsible for the health, safety, or welfare of
4 a child who shall willfully or maliciously engage in enabling child
5 abuse, as defined in this section, shall, upon conviction, be
6 punished by imprisonment in the custody of the Department of
7 Corrections not exceeding life imprisonment, or by imprisonment in a
8 county jail not exceeding one (1) year, or by a fine ~~of~~ not less
9 than Five Hundred Dollars (\$500.00) nor more than Five Thousand
10 Dollars (\$5,000.00), or both such fine and imprisonment.

11 C. Any person responsible for the health, safety, or welfare of
12 a child who shall willfully or maliciously engage in child neglect,
13 as defined in this section, shall, upon conviction, be punished by
14 imprisonment in the custody of the Department of Corrections not
15 exceeding life imprisonment, or by imprisonment in a county jail not
16 exceeding one (1) year, or by a fine ~~of~~ not less than Five Hundred
17 Dollars (\$500.00) nor more than Five Thousand Dollars (\$5,000.00),
18 or both such fine and imprisonment.

19 D. Any parent or other person who shall willfully or
20 maliciously engage in enabling child neglect shall, upon conviction,
21 be punished by imprisonment in the custody of the Department of
22 Corrections not exceeding life imprisonment, or by imprisonment in a
23 county jail not exceeding one (1) year, or by a fine ~~of~~ not less
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1 than Five Hundred Dollars (\$500.00) nor more than Five Thousand
2 Dollars (\$5,000.00), or both such fine and imprisonment.

3 E. Any person responsible for the health, safety, or welfare of
4 a child who shall willfully or maliciously engage in child sexual
5 abuse, as defined in this section, shall, upon conviction, be
6 punished by imprisonment in the custody of the Department of
7 Corrections not exceeding life imprisonment, or by imprisonment in a
8 county jail not exceeding one (1) year, or by a fine of not less
9 than Five Hundred Dollars (\$500.00) nor more than Five Thousand
10 Dollars (\$5,000.00), or both such fine and imprisonment, except as
11 provided in Section 51.1a of this title or as otherwise provided in
12 subsection F of this section for a child victim under twelve (12)
13 years of age. Except for persons sentenced to life or life without
14 parole, any person sentenced to imprisonment for two (2) years or
15 more for a violation of this subsection shall be required to serve a
16 term of post-imprisonment supervision pursuant to subparagraph f of
17 paragraph 1 of subsection A of Section 991a of Title 22 of the
18 Oklahoma Statutes under conditions determined by the Department of
19 Corrections. The jury shall be advised that the mandatory post-
20 imprisonment supervision shall be in addition to the actual
21 imprisonment.

22 F. Any person responsible for the health, safety, or welfare of
23 a child who shall willfully or maliciously engage in child sexual
24 abuse, as defined in this section, to a child under twelve (12)

1 years of age shall, upon conviction, be punished by imprisonment in
2 the custody of the Department of Corrections for not less than
3 twenty-five (25) years nor more than life imprisonment, and by a
4 fine ~~of~~ not less than Five Hundred Dollars (\$500.00) nor more than
5 Five Thousand Dollars (\$5,000.00).

6 G. Any parent or other person who shall willfully or
7 maliciously engage in enabling child sexual abuse shall, upon
8 conviction, be punished by imprisonment in the custody of the
9 Department of Corrections not exceeding life imprisonment, or by
10 imprisonment in a county jail not exceeding one (1) year, or by a
11 fine ~~of~~ not less than Five Hundred Dollars (\$500.00) nor more than
12 Five Thousand Dollars (\$5,000.00), or both such fine and
13 imprisonment.

14 H. Any person who shall willfully or maliciously engage in
15 child sexual exploitation, as defined in this section, shall, upon
16 conviction, be punished by imprisonment in the custody of the
17 Department of Corrections not exceeding life imprisonment, or by
18 imprisonment in a county jail not exceeding one (1) year, or by a
19 fine ~~of~~ not less than Five Hundred Dollars (\$500.00) nor more than
20 Five Thousand Dollars (\$5,000.00), or both such fine and
21 imprisonment, except as provided in subsection I of this section for
22 a child victim under twelve (12) years of age. Except for persons
23 sentenced to life or life without parole, any person sentenced to
24 imprisonment for two (2) years or more for a violation of this

1 subsection shall be required to serve a term of post-imprisonment
2 supervision pursuant to subparagraph f of paragraph 1 of subsection
3 A of Section 991a of Title 22 of the Oklahoma Statutes under
4 conditions determined by the Department of Corrections. The jury
5 shall be advised that the mandatory post-imprisonment supervision
6 shall be in addition to the actual imprisonment.

7 I. Any person who shall willfully or maliciously engage in
8 child sexual exploitation, as defined in this section, of a child
9 under twelve (12) years of age shall, upon conviction, be punished
10 by imprisonment in the custody of the Department of Corrections for
11 not less than twenty-five (25) years nor more than life
12 imprisonment, and by a fine ~~of~~ not less than Five Hundred Dollars
13 (\$500.00) nor more than Five Thousand Dollars (\$5,000.00).

14 J. Any person responsible for the health, safety, or welfare of
15 a child who shall willfully or maliciously engage in enabling child
16 sexual exploitation, as defined in this section, shall, upon
17 conviction, be punished by imprisonment in the custody of the
18 Department of Corrections not exceeding life imprisonment, or by
19 imprisonment in a county jail not exceeding one (1) year, or by a
20 fine ~~of~~ not less than Five Hundred Dollars (\$500.00) nor more than
21 Five Thousand Dollars (\$5,000.00), or both such fine and
22 imprisonment.

23 K. Notwithstanding any other provision of law, any person
24 convicted of forcible anal or oral sodomy, rape, rape by

1 instrumentation, or lewd molestation of a child under fourteen (14)
2 years of age subsequent to a previous conviction for any offense of
3 forcible anal or oral sodomy, rape, rape by instrumentation, or lewd
4 molestation of a child under fourteen (14) years of age shall be
5 punished by death or by imprisonment for life without parole.

6 L. Provided, however, that nothing contained in this section
7 shall prohibit any parent or guardian from using reasonable and
8 ordinary force pursuant to Section 844 of this title.

9 M. Consent shall not be a defense for any violation provided
10 for in this section.

11 N. Notwithstanding the age requirements of other statutes
12 referenced within this section, this section shall apply to any
13 child under eighteen (18) years of age.

14 O. As used in this section:

15 1. "Child abuse" means:

- 16 a. the willful or malicious harm or threatened harm or
17 failure to protect from harm or threatened harm to the
18 health, safety, or welfare of a child under eighteen
19 (18) years of age by a person responsible for a
20 child's health, safety, or welfare, or
21 b. the act of willfully or maliciously injuring,
22 torturing, or maiming a child under eighteen (18)
23 years of age by any person;

1 2. "Child neglect" means the willful or malicious neglect, as
2 defined by Section 1-1-105 of Title 10A of the Oklahoma Statutes, of
3 a child under eighteen (18) years of age by a person responsible for
4 a child's health, safety, or welfare;

5 3. "Child sexual abuse" means the willful or malicious sexual
6 abuse of a child under eighteen (18) years of age by a person
7 responsible for a child's health, safety, or welfare and includes,
8 but is not limited to:

9 a. sexual intercourse,

10 b. penetration of the vagina or anus, however slight, by
11 an inanimate object or any part of the human body not
12 amounting to sexual intercourse,

13 c. sodomy,

14 d. incest, or

15 e. a lewd act or proposal, as defined in this section;

16 4. "Child sexual exploitation" means the willful or malicious
17 sexual exploitation of a child under eighteen (18) years of age by
18 another and includes, but is not limited to:

19 a. human trafficking, as provided for in Section 748 of
20 this title, if the offense involved child trafficking
21 for commercial sex,

22 b. trafficking in children, as provided for in Section
23 866 of this title, if the offense was committed for
24 the sexual gratification of any person,

- c. procuring or causing the participation of a minor in child ~~pornography~~ sexual abuse material, as provided for in Section 1021.2 of this title,
- d. purchase, procurement, or possession of child ~~pornography~~ sexual abuse material, as provided for in Section 1024.2 of this title,
- e. engaging in or soliciting prostitution, as provided for in Section 1029 of this title, if the offense involved child sex trafficking,
- f. publication, distribution, or participation in the preparation of obscene material, as provided for in Section 1040.8 of this title, if the offense involved child ~~pornography~~ sexual abuse material,
- g. aggravated possession of child ~~pornography~~ sexual abuse material, as provided for in Section 1040.12a of this title,
- h. sale or distribution of obscene material, as provided for in Section 1040.13 of this title,
- i. soliciting sexual conduct or communication with a minor by use of technology, as provided for in Section 1040.13a of this title,
- j. offering or transporting a child for purposes of child sex trafficking, as provided for in Section 1087 of this title, and

k. child sex trafficking, as provided for in Section 1088
of this title;

5. "Enabling child abuse" means the causing, procuring, or
permitting of child abuse by a person responsible for a child's
health, safety, or welfare;

6. "Enabling child neglect" means the causing, procuring, or
permitting of child neglect by a person responsible for a child's
health, safety, or welfare;

7. "Enabling child sexual abuse" means the causing, procuring,
or permitting of child sexual abuse by a person responsible for a
child's health, safety, or welfare;

8. "Enabling child sexual exploitation" means the causing,
procuring, or permitting of child sexual exploitation by a person
responsible for a child's health, safety, or welfare;

9. "Incest" means marrying, committing adultery, or fornicating
with a child by a person responsible for the health, safety, or
welfare of a child;

10. "Lewd act or proposal" means:

a. making any oral, written, or electronic or computer-
generated lewd or indecent proposal to a child for the
child to have unlawful sexual relations or sexual
intercourse with any person,

- 1 b. looking upon, touching, mauling, or feeling the body
2 or private parts of a child in a lewd or lascivious
3 manner or for the purpose of sexual gratification,
4 c. asking, inviting, enticing, or persuading any child to
5 go alone with any person to a secluded, remote, or
6 secret place for a lewd or lascivious purpose,
7 d. urinating or defecating upon a child or causing,
8 forcing, or requiring a child to defecate or urinate
9 upon the body or private parts of another person for
10 the purpose of sexual gratification,
11 e. ejaculating upon or in the presence of a child,
12 f. causing, exposing, forcing, or requiring a child to
13 look upon the body or private parts of another person
14 for the purpose of sexual gratification,
15 g. causing, forcing, or requiring any child to view any
16 obscene materials, child ~~pornography~~ sexual abuse
17 material or materials deemed harmful to minors as such
18 terms are defined in Sections 1024.1 and 1040.75 of
19 this title,
20 h. causing, exposing, forcing, or requiring a child to
21 look upon sexual acts performed in the presence of the
22 child for the purpose of sexual gratification, or
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1 i. causing, forcing, or requiring a child to touch or
2 feel the body or private parts of the child or another
3 person for the purpose of sexual gratification;

4 11. "Permit" means to authorize or allow for the care of a
5 child by an individual when the person authorizing or allowing such
6 care knows or reasonably should know that the child will be placed
7 at risk of the conduct or harm proscribed by this section;

8 12. "Person responsible for a child's health, safety, or
9 welfare" for purposes of this section shall include, but not be
10 limited to:

- 11 a. the parent of the child,
- 12 b. the legal guardian of the child,
- 13 c. the custodian of the child,
- 14 d. the foster parent of the child,
- 15 e. a person eighteen (18) years of age or older with whom
16 the parent of the child cohabitates, who is at least
17 three (3) years older than the child,
- 18 f. any other person eighteen (18) years of age or older
19 residing in the home of the child, who is at least
20 three (3) years older than the child,
- 21 g. an owner, operator, agent, employee, or volunteer of a
22 public or private residential home, institution,
23 facility, or day treatment program, as defined in
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1 Section 175.20 of Title 10 of the Oklahoma Statutes,
2 that the child attended,

3 h. an owner, operator, agent, employee, or volunteer of a
4 child care facility, as defined in Section 402 of
5 Title 10 of the Oklahoma Statutes, that the child
6 attended,

7 i. an intimate partner of the parent of the child, as
8 defined in Section 60.1 of Title 22 of the Oklahoma
9 Statutes, or

10 j. a person who has voluntarily accepted responsibility
11 for the care or supervision of a child;

12 13. "Sexual intercourse" means the actual penetration, however
13 slight, of the vagina or anus by the penis; and

14 14. "Sodomy" means:

15 a. penetration, however slight, of the mouth of the child
16 by a penis,

17 b. penetration, however slight, of the vagina of a person
18 responsible for a child's health, safety, or welfare,
19 by the mouth of a child,

20 c. penetration, however slight, of the mouth of the
21 person responsible for a child's health, safety, or
22 welfare by the penis of the child, or

1 d. penetration, however slight, of the vagina of the
2 child by the mouth of the person responsible for a
3 child's health, safety, or welfare.

4 SECTION 3. AMENDATORY 21 O.S. 2021, Section 1040.12a, as
5 amended by Section 3, Chapter 103, O.S.L. 2024 (21 O.S. Supp. 2024,
6 Section 1040.12a), is amended to read as follows:

7 Section 1040.12a. A. Any person who, with knowledge of its
8 contents, possesses one hundred (100) or more separate visual
9 depictions of child ~~pornography~~ sexual abuse material shall, upon
10 conviction, be guilty of aggravated possession of child ~~pornography~~
11 sexual abuse material. The violator shall be punished by
12 imprisonment in the custody of the Department of Corrections for a
13 term not exceeding life imprisonment and by a fine ~~in an amount of~~
14 not more than Ten Thousand Dollars (\$10,000.00). The violator, upon
15 conviction, shall be required to register as a sex offender under
16 the Sex Offenders Registration Act.

17 B. For purposes of this section:

18 1. Multiple copies of the same identical material shall each be
19 counted as a separate item; and

20 2. The terms "child ~~pornography~~" sexual abuse material" and
21 "visual depictions" mean the same definitions provided by Section
22 1024.1 of this title.

SECTION 4. AMENDATORY 21 O.S. 2021, Section 1024.1, as amended by Section 2, Chapter 103, O.S.L. 2024 (21 O.S. Supp. 2024, Section 1024.1), is amended to read as follows:

Section 1024.1. A. As used in Sections 1021, 1021.1 through 1021.4, Sections 1022, 1023, and Sections 1040.8 through 1040.24 of this title, "child ~~pornography~~" sexual abuse material" means:

1. Any visual depiction of a child engaged in any act of sexually explicit conduct;

2. Any visual depiction of a child that has been adapted, altered, or modified so that the child depicted appears to be engaged in any act of sexually explicit conduct; or

3. Any visual depiction that appears to be a child, regardless of whether the image is a depiction of an actual child, a computer-generated image, or an image altered to appear to be a child, engaged in any act of sexually explicit conduct, and such visual depiction is obscene.

B. Each visual depiction or individual image of child pornography shall constitute a separate item and act.

C. As used in Sections 1021 through 1024.4 and Sections 1040.8 through 1040.24 of this title:

1. "Child" means a person under eighteen (18) years of age;

2. "Obscene" means any performance or depiction, in any form or on any medium, if ~~said~~ the material when taken as a whole:

- a. appeals to the prurient interest in sex as determined by the average person applying the contemporary standards of their community,
- b. depicts, represents, or displays sexually explicit conduct in a patently offensive way, and
- c. a reasonable person would find the material or performance lacks serious literary, artistic, educational, political, or scientific value;

3. "Performance" means any display, live, recorded, or transmitted, in any form or medium;

4. "Sexually explicit conduct" means any of the following whether actual or simulated:

- a. acts of sexual intercourse,
- b. acts of oral and anal sodomy,
- c. acts of masturbation,
- d. acts of sexual activity with an animal,
- e. acts of sadomasochism including:
 - (1) flagellation or torture by or upon any person who is nude or clad in undergarments or in a costume which is of a revealing nature, or
 - (2) the condition of being fettered, bound, or otherwise physically restrained on the part of one who is nude or so clothed,
- f. acts of excretion in a sexual context, or

g. exhibiting genitalia, breast, or pubic area for the purpose of the sexual stimulation of the viewer;

5. "Explicit child ~~pornography~~ sexual abuse material" means material which a law enforcement officer can immediately identify as child ~~pornography~~ sexual abuse material; and

6. "Visual depiction" means any depiction, picture, movie, performance, or image displayed, stored, shared, or transmitted in any format and on any medium including data that is capable of being converted into a depiction, picture, movie, performance, or image.

SECTION 5. This act shall become effective November 1, 2025.
