17	SECTION 1. NEW LAW A new	sect	tion of law to be codified	
18	in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section	3251	of Title 70, unless there

20	A. No institution of higher edu	catio	on within The Oklahoma State

B. After the effective date of this act, institutions of higher
education within The Oklahoma State System of Higher Education shall
initiate a review of diversity, equity, and inclusion positions,
departments, activities, procedures, and programs and, if deemed
necessary, restructure or eliminate functions that are not necessary

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for compliance, accreditation, or student or employee support
 services intended to broadly support success.

C. Nothing in this section shall be construed to limit or 3 prohibit institutions of higher education within The Oklahoma State 4 5 System of Higher Education, including any agency of the executive branch supporting those institutions' work, from applying for a 6 grant or complying with the accreditation requirements of an 7 accrediting or licensing agency including, but not limited to, 8 9 submitting to the grantor or accreditation agency a statement that: 1. Highlights the institution's or agency's work in supporting: 10 first-generation college students, 11 a. students from low-income families, 12 b. 13 с. students with unique abilities, or underserved student populations; or d. 14 2. Certifies compliance with applicable anti-discrimination 15 laws, rules, and regulations. 16 The provisions of this section shall not be construed to 17 D. apply to institutions of higher education within The Oklahoma State 18 System of Higher Education with respect to: 19 1. A policy, practice, procedure, program, class, or activity 20 required for compliance with state or federal laws, rules, or 21 regulations for obtaining or retaining institutional, academic, or 22 discipline-specific accreditation or licensure; 23 24

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2. The academic freedom of any individual faculty member to
 direct the instruction within his or her own course;

3 3. Scholarly research or creative work by an institution of
4 higher education's students, faculty, or other research personnel or
5 the dissemination of such research or work;

6 4. An activity of a student organization registered with or7 recognized by an institution of higher education;

5. Guest speakers or performances on short-term engagements;
6. Academic support, tutoring, and career services and student
success centers, so long as the programming is designed and
implemented without regard to race, sex, color, national origin, or
ethnicity;

8. Access programs for military, veterans, Pell Grant
recipients, first-generation college students, students from lowincome families, students with unique abilities, or underserved
student populations.

E. By July 1, 2026, and each July 1 thereafter, institutions of higher education within The Oklahoma State System of Higher Education shall electronically submit to the Governor, the President Pro Tempore of the Senate, and the Speaker of the House of Representatives a certificate of compliance with the provisions of this section.

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1	F. Nothing in this section shall be construed to prohibit the	
2	promotion of civil discourse, debate, or speech that is protected by	
3	the First Amendment to the United States Constitution.	
4	G. The Oklahoma State Regents for Higher Education may	
5	promulgate rules to implement the provisions of this section.	
6	SECTION 2. This act shall become effective July 1, 2025.	
7	SECTION 3. It being immediately necessary for the preservation	
8	of the public peace, health, or safety, an emergency is hereby	
9	declared to exist, by reason whereof this act shall take effect and	
10	be in full force from and after its passage and approval.
