8	as the 26th Annual Oklahoma 4-H Day at the Capitol.

10	WHEREAS, the youth of Oklahoma and the nation represent the
11	future, and their development is paramount to the well-being and
12	prosperity of communities across the country; and
13	WHEREAS, for a quarter of a century, this annual celebration of
14	4-H Day at the Capitol has provided an opportunity for club members
15	to share their 4-H stories with state leaders; and
16	WHEREAS, 4-H is the youth development component of the Oklahoma
17	State University and Langston University Extension programs geared
18	toward young people ages 5 to 19; and
19	WHEREAS, for nearly 120 years, 4-H has helped thousands of club
20	members develop life skills such as leadership, decision-making,
21	time management, and civic engagement; and
22	WHEREAS, programming in 4-H is changing continually to meet the
23	needs of today's youth; and

1 WHEREAS, the Oklahoma 4-H Youth Development Program reinforces 2 the learn-by-doing philosophy through hands-on, experiential learning opportunities; and 3 WHEREAS, 4-H reaches more than 180,000 participants each year 4 5 through membership, project clubs, and school enrichment; and WHEREAS, Oklahoma State University Extension and Langston 6 University 4-H'ers participate in STEM, civic engagement, healthy 7 living, leisure sciences, natural resources, and agriculture 8 9 programs; and WHEREAS, dedicated and committed volunteers, mentors, and 10 supporters play a pivotal role in the success of the organization; 11 12 and WHEREAS, youth who participate in 4-H are four times more likely 13 to make contributions to their communities; and 14 WHEREAS, there are nearly 1,200 adult volunteer leaders who 15 serve as mentors and provide leadership while fostering positive 16 adult/youth partnerships; and 17 WHEREAS, youth volunteers develop life skills by serving as 18 mentors/role models and provide leadership to club members; and 19 WHEREAS, 4-H provides programming beyond traditional 20 agricultural projects, including food and nutrition, horticulture, 21 photography, robotics, community development, companion animals, and 22 more; and 23

1 WHEREAS, youth participating in 4-H are encouraged to share with state leaders how 4-H is making communities better through project 2 work and service learning activities; and 3 WHEREAS, adult volunteer leaders and club members combined 4 5 annually contribute more than 100,000 volunteer hours to the betterment of Oklahoma; and 6 WHEREAS, 4-H members continue to work together and follow the 7 motto "To Make the Best Better" in all that they do; and 9 WHEREAS, the annual Oklahoma 4-H Day at the Capitol provides an 10 opportunity to share with state leaders the positive impact they have on their communities, counties, and state. 11 12 NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE SENATE OF THE 1ST SESSION 13 OF THE 60TH OKLAHOMA LEGISLATURE, THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES CONCURRING THEREIN: 14 THAT the Oklahoma Legislature hereby proclaims April 23, 2025, 15 as the 26th Annual Oklahoma 4-H Day at the Capitol, celebrating 16 youth who have made an impact on the community and who are stepping 17 up to the challenges of a complex and changing world, and continuing 18 to share the positive impact Oklahoma 4-H has on our youth, our 19 communities, and our state because "We Are Oklahoma 4-H." 20 21 22 23
