7 An Act relating to the Oklahoma Opioid Abatement  
8 Revolving Fund; making appropriations to the fund;  
9 specifying amounts and source; stating purposes;  
10 providing for noncodification; providing an effective  
11 date; and declaring an emergency.

12 BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:

13 SECTION 1. NEW LAW A new section of law not to be  
14 codified in the Oklahoma Statutes reads as follows:

15 There is hereby appropriated to the Oklahoma Opioid Abatement  
16 Revolving Fund created pursuant to Section 30.6 of Title 74 of the  
17 Oklahoma Statutes, from any monies not otherwise appropriated from  
18 the Opioid Lawsuit Settlement Fund (Fund 383) of the State Treasury,  
19 the sum of Twenty Million Dollars (\$20,000,000.00) to be budgeted  
20 and expended in accordance with law.

21 SECTION 2. NEW LAW A new section of law not to be  
22 codified in the Oklahoma Statutes reads as follows:

23 There is hereby appropriated to the Oklahoma Opioid Abatement  
24 Revolving Fund created pursuant to Section 30.6 of Title 74 of the  
Oklahoma Statutes, from any monies not otherwise appropriated from

1 the Opioid Lawsuit Settlement Fund (Fund 383) of the State Treasury,  
2 the sum of One Million Two Hundred Fifty-three Thousand Six Hundred  
3 Fifty-eight Dollars (\$1,253,658.00) to be distributed to non-  
4 litigating subdivisions.

5 SECTION 3. This act shall become effective July 1, 2025.

6 SECTION 4. It being immediately necessary for the preservation  
7 of the public peace, health or safety, an emergency is hereby  
8 declared to exist, by reason whereof this act shall take effect and  
9 be in full force from and after its passage and approval.
