8 An Act relating to the Statewide Recovery Fund;
9 making transfers from funds appropriated to the
10 Department of Human Services to the Statewide
11 Recovery Fund; making a transfer from funds
12 appropriated to the Health Care Workforce Development
13 Revolving Fund to the Statewide Recovery Fund; making
14 a transfer from funds appropriated to the Oklahoma
15 State University Medical Authority to the Statewide
16 Recovery Fund; making a transfer from funds
17 appropriated to the State Department of Health to the
18 Statewide Recovery Fund; making a transfer of funds
19 appropriated to the Department of Mental Health and
20 Substance Abuse Services to the Statewide Recovery
21 Fund; making a transfer of funds appropriated to the
22 Oklahoma Water Resources Board to the Statewide
23 Recovery Fund; determining all transfers are
24 consistent with specific joint committee actions;
providing for noncodification; providing an effective
date; and declaring an emergency.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:

SECTION 1. NEW LAW A new section of law not to be
codified in the Oklahoma Statutes reads as follows:

Of the Two Million Eight Hundred Thousand Dollars
(\$2,800,000.00) appropriated from the Statewide Recovery Fund

1 created in Section 255 of Title 62 of the Oklahoma Statutes, to the
2 Department of Human Services by Section 2 of Enrolled House Bill No.
3 2884 of the 1st Regular Session of the 59th Oklahoma Legislature, to
4 provide semi-independent housing, food security, and transitional
5 tools to victims of domestic violence, the sum of One Million Five
6 Hundred Sixty Thousand Eight Hundred Seventy-five Dollars
7 (\$1,560,875.00) shall be transferred to the Statewide Recovery Fund
8 for reappropriation. Such transfer shall be consistent with the
9 recommendations adopted by the Joint Committee on Pandemic Relief
10 Funding on May 12, 2025.

11 SECTION 2. NEW LAW A new section of law not to be
12 codified in the Oklahoma Statutes reads as follows:

13 Of the Twelve Million Eight Hundred Two Thousand Nine Hundred
14 Ninety-three Dollars (\$12,802,993.00) appropriated from the
15 Statewide Recovery Fund created in Section 255 of Title 62 of the
16 Oklahoma Statutes, to the Department of Human Services by Section 1
17 of Enrolled Senate Bill No. 1186 of the 1st Regular Session of the
18 59th Oklahoma Legislature to establish a grant program that provides
19 assistance to food programs which support the availability of and
20 access to affordable and nutritious foods, the sum of One Hundred
21 Sixty-two Thousand Six Hundred Sixty-eight Dollars and eighty-five
22 cents (\$162,668.85) shall be transferred to the Statewide Recovery
23 Fund for reappropriation. Such transfer shall be consistent with

1 the recommendations adopted by the Joint Committee on Pandemic
2 Relief Funding on May 12, 2025.

3 SECTION 3. NEW LAW A new section of law not to be
4 codified in the Oklahoma Statutes reads as follows:

5 Of the Four Million Five Hundred Thirty-seven Thousand Five
6 Hundred Dollars (\$4,537,500.00) appropriated from the Statewide
7 Recovery Fund created in Section 255 of Title 62 of the Oklahoma
8 Statutes, to the Health Care Workforce Development Revolving Fund by
9 Section 7 of Enrolled Senate Bill No. 1458 of the 2nd Regular
10 Session of the 58th Oklahoma Legislature to establish a grant
11 program with Care Providers Oklahoma for the purpose of recruiting,
12 educating, and stabilizing Oklahoma's health care workforce, the sum
13 of One Million Four Hundred Ninety Thousand Six Hundred Seventy-five
14 Dollars and eight cents (\$1,490,675.08) shall be transferred to the
15 Statewide Recovery Fund for reappropriation. Such transfer shall be
16 consistent with the recommendations adopted by the Joint Committee
17 on Pandemic Relief Funding on May 12, 2025.

18 SECTION 4. NEW LAW A new section of law not to be
19 codified in the Oklahoma Statutes reads as follows:

20 Of the Ten Million Dollars (\$10,000,000.00) appropriated from
21 the Statewide Recovery Fund created in Section 255 of Title 62 of
22 the Oklahoma Statutes, to the Oklahoma State University Medical
23 Authority by Section 3 of Enrolled House Bill No. 1012 of the 2nd
24 Extraordinary Session of the 58th Oklahoma Legislature to fund

1 outreach, training, and other allowable expenses associated with the
2 implementation of a rural advanced care pilot program, the sum of
3 Two Million One Hundred Sixty-four Thousand Thirty-nine Dollars
4 (\$2,164,039.00) shall be transferred to the Statewide Recovery Fund
5 for reappropriation. Such transfer shall be consistent with the
6 recommendations adopted by the Joint Committee on Pandemic Relief
7 Funding on May 12, 2025.

8 SECTION 5. NEW LAW A new section of law not to be
9 codified in the Oklahoma Statutes reads as follows:

10 Of the Twenty-five Million Dollars (\$25,000,000.00) appropriated
11 from the Statewide Recovery Fund created in Section 255 of Title 62
12 of the Oklahoma Statutes, to the State Department of Health by
13 Section 3 of Enrolled Senate Bill No. 20 of the 2nd Extraordinary
14 Session of the 58th Oklahoma Legislature for a program providing
15 medical facilities for disproportionately impacted populations, the
16 sum of Five Million Dollars (\$5,000,000.00) shall be transferred to
17 the Statewide Recovery Fund for reappropriation. Such transfer
18 shall be consistent with the recommendations adopted by the Joint
19 Committee on Pandemic Relief Funding on May 12, 2025.

20 SECTION 6. NEW LAW A new section of law not to be
21 codified in the Oklahoma Statutes reads as follows:

22 Of the Eighty-seven Million Dollars (\$87,000,000.00)
23 appropriated from the Statewide Recovery Fund created in Section 255
24 of Title 62 of the Oklahoma Statutes, to the Department of Mental

1 Health and Substance Abuse Services by Section 1 of Enrolled House
2 Bill No. 1013 of the 2nd Extraordinary Session of the 58th Oklahoma
3 Legislature for addressing the ongoing increased demand for mental
4 health services by constructing a replacement facility for Griffin
5 Memorial Hospital; provided, that such construction be confined
6 within a thirty-mile radius of the State Capitol Building, the sum
7 of Twenty Million Five Hundred Thousand Dollars (\$20,500,000.00)
8 shall be transferred to the Statewide Recovery Fund for
9 reappropriation. Such transfer shall be consistent with the
10 recommendations adopted by the Joint Committee on Pandemic Relief
11 Funding on May 12, 2025.

12 SECTION 7. NEW LAW A new section of law not to be
13 codified in the Oklahoma Statutes reads as follows:

14 Of the Eight Million Dollars (\$8,000,000.00) appropriated from
15 the Statewide Recovery Fund created in Section 255 of Title 62 of
16 the Oklahoma Statutes, to the Oklahoma Water Resources Board by
17 Section 9 of Enrolled Senate Bill No. 13 of the 2nd Extraordinary
18 Session of the 58th Oklahoma Legislature, the sum of Three Million
19 Three Hundred Thousand Dollars (\$3,300,000.00) shall be transferred
20 to the Statewide Recovery Fund for reappropriation. Such transfer
21 shall be consistent with the recommendations adopted by the Joint
22 Committee on Pandemic Relief Funding on May 12, 2025.

23 SECTION 8. This act shall become effective July 1, 2025.
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SECTION 9. It being immediately necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health or safety, an emergency is hereby declared to exist, by reason whereof this act shall take effect and be in full force from and after its passage and approval.
