WHEREAS, a wide diversity of birds in Oklahoma indicates a healthy environment; and

WHEREAS, Oklahoma is part of the Central Flyway through which approximately 400 different species of birds migrate during the spring and fall; and

WHEREAS, the Oklahoma state bird, the scissor-tailed flycatcher, is one of the many species of birds that migrate to our state to nest and rear their young; and

WHEREAS, most birds migrate at night, navigate by using the stars and moon, and can become disoriented by bright artificial light and sky glow, resulting in exhaustion and deadly collisions with buildings, glass, power lines, and vehicles; and

WHEREAS, collisions with buildings is one of the top causes of mortality of birds in the United States; and

WHEREAS, the Lights Out Oklahoma program strategy is aimed to persuade building owners and managers and homeowners to turn off exterior lighting on all buildings at night during the high migration intensity months of April, May, September, and October; and

WHEREAS, these measures save energy and money and protect birds migrating to nesting grounds in the spring and wintering grounds in the fall; and
