11 An Act relating to food truck fire suppression;  
12 amending Section 1, Chapter 106, O.S.L. 2024, as  
13 amended by Section 1, Chapter 342, O.S.L. 2025 (74  
14 O.S. Supp. 2025, Section 325.20), which relates to  
15 mobile food establishments, fire and life safety code  
16 compliance, permit, inspection, rules; modifying  
17 mandate for automatic fire extinguishing system in  
18 food trucks; removing expiration date; and providing  
19 an effective date.

20 BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:

21 SECTION 1. AMENDATORY Section 1, Chapter 106, O.S.L.  
22 2024, as amended by Section 1, Chapter 342, O.S.L. 2025 (74 O.S.  
23 Supp. 2025, Section 325.20), is amended to read as follows:

24 Section 325.20. A. All mobile food preparation vehicles  
operating within this state ~~prior to July 1, 2024,~~ that are capable  
of producing smoke or grease-laden vapors shall be in compliance  
with the most current adopted fire code. ~~With the exception~~ In lieu

1 of an automatic fire extinguishing system, an equivalent alternative  
2 shall be permitted, whereby such system shall be optional if the  
3 mobile food preparation vehicle is equipped with at least two  
4 portable fire extinguishers meeting National Fire Protection  
5 Association (NFPA) 10 standards and all employees receive documented  
6 annual fire safety training approved by the State Fire Marshal.  
7 ~~such~~ Such requirement shall apply to vehicles including, but not  
8 limited to, vehicles utilizing electric energy, liquefied petroleum  
9 gas, compressed natural gas, or a combination thereof for cooking,  
10 provided that portable fire extinguishers are installed and  
11 maintained in accordance with the most current version of NFPA 10:  
12 Standard for Portable Fire Extinguishers. A six-liter Class K-  
13 rated, portable fire extinguisher is required for all cooking  
14 equipment involving solid fuels, vegetable or animal oils and fats,  
15 or a combination thereof. All portable fire extinguishers shall be  
16 in clear view and immediately available for use.

17 B. All mobile food preparation vehicles utilizing, handling, or  
18 transporting liquefied petroleum gas or any liquefied petroleum gas  
19 system, equipment, container, apparatus, or appliance shall receive  
20 and maintain a permit from, and be inspected annually by~~r~~ the  
21 Oklahoma Liquefied Petroleum Gas Administration or its employees, in  
22 conjunction with the State Fire Marshal issuing an annual operation  
23 permit decal to mobile food preparation vehicles.

1       C. ~~The provisions in subsection A of this section shall expire~~  
2 ~~on January 1, 2026, and all mobile food preparation vehicles shall~~  
3 ~~comply with the most current adopted fire codes set forth by this~~  
4 ~~state.~~

5       ~~D.~~ Mobile food preparation vehicles shall be under the  
6 jurisdiction of the State Fire Marshal for fire and life safety code  
7 compliance and shall be inspected annually by the State Fire Marshal  
8 to ensure compliance with the latest version of the state-adopted  
9 minimum codes for fire and life safety as adopted by the Oklahoma  
10 Uniform Building Code Commission. The State Fire Marshal shall  
11 coordinate, at minimum, annual inspections conducted:

- 12       1. Within each of the four quadrants of this state; and
- 13       2. Twice within each county with a population exceeding four  
14 hundred thousand (400,000) according to the latest Federal Decennial  
15 Census.

16       ~~E.~~ D. Upon approval, the State Fire Marshal shall issue an  
17 operational permit decal indicating that the vehicle meets the  
18 minimum fire and life code requirements adopted at the time of  
19 inspection.

20       ~~F.~~ E. Nothing in this section shall prevent:

- 21       1. The State Fire Marshal from enforcing the minimum fire code  
22 requirements as allowed by law and revoking the operations of a  
23 mobile food preparation vehicle for cause when such vehicle is  
24

1 determined to be inherently dangerous to the health, safety, or  
2 welfare of persons within this state;

3 2. A political subdivision from enforcing the event permits,  
4 operational fees, land use regulations, zoning, or other ordinances  
5 in relation to the operation of a mobile food preparation vehicle  
6 within the boundaries of the political subdivision; or

7 3. The State Department of Health from licensing and regulating  
8 mobile food preparation vehicles as provided by the provisions of  
9 Title 63 of the Oklahoma Statutes and rules promulgated by the State  
10 Commissioner of Health.

11 ~~G.~~ F. The State Fire Marshal may promulgate rules necessary to  
12 implement the provisions of this section. Such rules shall have  
13 uniform force and effect throughout this state and no political  
14 subdivision or other agency shall enact or enforce any fire or life  
15 safety code-related ordinances, rules, or other requirements for  
16 mobile food preparation vehicles, except in a county with a  
17 population exceeding four hundred thousand (400,000) according to  
18 the latest Federal Decennial Census.

19 SECTION 2. This act shall become effective November 1, 2026.
