8	AS INTRODUCED
9	An Act relating to fire departments; amending 11 O.S.
10	2021, Section 29-102, which relates to activity reports from city fire departments; directing that
11	reports utilize the National Emergency Response Information System; directing reports to be completed within farty sight bound of insident, directing
12	within forty-eight hours of incident; directing certain charitable organizations to submit reports utilizing the National Emergency Decrease Information
13	utilizing the National Emergency Response Information System; providing report contents; requiring reports
14	to be submitted within forty-eight hours of incident; amending 19 O.S. 2021, Section 901.7a, which relates
15	to activity reports from fire protection districts; directing fire chief to utilize the National
16	Emergency Response Information System; requiring reports be completed within forty-eight hours of
17	incident; providing for codification; and providing an effective date.

20	BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:
21	SECTION 1. AMENDATORY 11 O.S. 2021, Section 29-102, is
22	amended to read as follows:
23	Section 29-102. All cities having a paid fire department shall
24	have one full-time fire chief who shall supervise and administer the

1 fire department in accordance with the policies and procedures 2 prescribed by the governing body or by the city manager. The fire department shall be under the direction and control of the fire 3 chief who shall not serve as fire chief and also as police chief, 4 5 city manager, mayor or any other position that impairs the ability 6 to perform the duties of a fire chief. The fire chief, whether 7 permanent or interim, of any paid municipal fire department shall 8 have had at least three (3) years' actual experience as a paid fire 9 fighter before assuming the position of fire chief. It shall be the 10 duty of the fire chief to file the appropriate activity report forms 11 reports utilizing the National Emergency Response Information System 12 (NERIS) with the Office of the State Fire Marshal in Oklahoma City 13 on an annual basis. The activity report forms shall be designed by 14 the State Fire Marshal and shall include, but not be limited to, the 15 amount of property and vehicle fire loss, types of fires, 16 inspections and investigations that occurred. The report shall 17 include notification of all fire-related civilian deaths and 18 injuries in the respective jurisdiction and of fire fighter deaths 19 in the line of duty and of fire fighter injuries in the line of duty 20 requiring the services of a hospital or physician or both and these 21 fire-related burn injuries and death reports will be completed 22 within forty-eight (48) hours of the incident.

SECTION 2. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified
 in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 595 of Title 18, unless there is
 created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:

4 Any charitable corporation formed in an unincorporated area for 5 the purpose of providing either a volunteer or a full-time fire department, such as mentioned in Section 592 of Title 18 of the 6 7 Oklahoma Statutes, shall be required to file the appropriate activity reports utilizing the National Emergency Response 8 9 Information System (NERIS) with the Office of the State Fire Marshal 10 in Oklahoma City. The activity report forms shall include, but not 11 be limited to, the amount of property and vehicle fire loss, types 12 of fires, inspections and investigations. The report shall include 13 notification of all fire-related civilian deaths and injuries in the 14 respective jurisdiction and of firefighter deaths in the line of 15 duty and of firefighter injuries in the line of duty requiring the 16 services of a hospital or physician or both and these fire-related 17 burn injuries and death reports will be completed within forty-eight 18 (48) hours of the incident.

19SECTION 3.AMENDATORY19 O.S. 2021, Section 901.7a, is20amended to read as follows:

21 Section 901.7a. All Fire Protection Districts having more than 22 two full-time paid firefighters shall have one full-time fire chief 23 who shall supervise and administer the fire protection district in 24 accordance with the policies and procedures prescribed by the board

of directors. The fire protection district shall be under the 1 2 direction and control of the fire chief. The fire chief, whether permanent or interim, of any paid or combination fire protection 3 4 district shall have had at least three (3) years actual experience 5 as a paid firefighter before assuming the position of fire chief. During the initial transition from a volunteer fire protection 6 7 district to one having more than two full-time firefighters, the paid fire chief shall have had at least three (3) years of 8 9 experience as a paid firefighter or at least five (5) years of 10 experience as a volunteer fire chief officer with that department 11 before assuming the position of paid fire chief. The board may add 12 additional requirements to the position as necessary.

13 1. The fire chief:

a. shall be at the head of the department, subject to the
laws of the State of Oklahoma, rules of the board of
directors and the rules and regulations herein
adopted,

b. shall be held responsible for the general condition
and efficient operation of the department, the
training of members and the performance of all other
duties imposed upon him or her by law or the board of
directors,

- c. may inspect or cause to be inspected by members of the
   department, the fire hydrants, cisterns and other
   sources of water supply at least twice a year,
- d. shall maintain a library or file of publications on
  fire prevention and fire protection and shall make use
  of the library or file to the best advantage of all
  members,
- 8 e. shall make every effort to attend all fires and direct
  9 the officers and members of the fire department in the
  10 performance of their duties,
- 11 f. shall see that the citizens are kept informed on fire 12 hazards within the boundaries of the department and on 13 the activities of the department,
- 14g.shall see that each fire is carefully investigated to15determine its cause, and in the case of suspicion of16incendiarism shall notify proper authorities. The17fire chief shall secure and preserve all possible18evidence for future use in the case of a suspicious19incendiarism, and
- h. shall file the appropriate activity report forms
  reports utilizing the National Emergency Response
  <u>Information System (NERIS)</u> with the Office of the
  State Fire Marshal in Oklahoma City on an annual
  basis. The activity report forms shall be designed by

1 the State Fire Marshal and shall include, but not be 2 limited to, the amount of property and vehicle fire loss, types of fires, inspections and investigations. 3 4 The report shall include notification of all fire-5 related civilian deaths and injuries in the respective jurisdiction and of firefighter deaths in the line of 6 7 duty and of firefighter injuries in the line of duty requiring the services of a hospital or physician or 8 9 both and these fire-related burn injuries and death 10 reports will be completed within forty-eight (48) 11 hours of the incident.

12 2. Assistant fire chief. In the absence of the fire chief, the 13 assistant fire chief on duty shall command the department and be 14 held responsible therefore in all respects with the full powers and 15 responsibilities of the fire chief.

16 3. Company officers. The company officers shall be selected 17 upon their ability to meet the following requirements:

- 18
- a. knowledge of firefighting,
- 19
- b. leadership ability, and

20 c. knowledge of firefighting equipment.

21 SECTION 4. This act shall become effective November 1, 2025.
