NEW LAW 20 in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 307.2 of Title 25, unless there 21 is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows: 22 A member of a public body may participate in a public 23 meeting via videoconference or teleconference from the private 24 residence of the member, and shall not be required to disclose the

- address of the private residence on the meeting notice or agenda, provided the following conditions are met:
  - 1. The member identifies the location as the "private residence" on the meeting notice and agenda, without further detail;
  - 2. The videoconference or teleconference technology used allows the public to see and hear the member during the meeting; and
  - 3. The member's participation from his or her private residence does not restrict or limit public access to the meeting or the member's contributions to the meeting.
  - B. This section does not apply when a public body holds a meeting entirely or primarily at a member's private residence, or when two or more members are present at a member's private residence. In such cases, full disclosure of the meeting location is required under the existing provisions of the Oklahoma Open Meeting Act.
  - C. For purposes of this section, "private residence" means any home, apartment, or other personal living space that is not used as a public or commercial meeting site.
  - D. Public bodies shall ensure compliance with all other provisions of the Oklahoma Open Meeting Act, including transparency, accessibility, and notice requirements, when implementing this section.
- E. It is the Legislature's intent to balance the principles of open governance with the privacy and security of individuals

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1	participating in public meetings from private residences. This
2	section ensures compliance with transparency requirements while
3	protecting personal addresses from public disclosure.
4	SECTION 2. This act shall become effective November 1, 2025.
