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18	BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:
19	SECTION 1. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified
20	in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 6-189.3 of Title 70, unless
21	there is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:
22	A. For this section, "special education administrator" means
23	the director and assistant director of a special education program
24	for a school district.

B. Beginning July 1, 2025, no school district shall employ a
 special education administrator unless the individual:

3 1. Holds a valid standard teaching certificate issued by the4 State Board of Education; and

5 2. Except as provided for in subsection D of this section,
6 obtains an acknowledgment of competency within one (1) year of being
7 employed as a special education administrator.

8 C. The State Board of Education shall issue an acknowledgement 9 of competency in the area of mild-moderate disabilities, severe-10 profound disabilities, or comprehensive special education to a 11 special education administrator who has:

Satisfactorily completed a one-hundred-fifty-clock-hour
 special education program prescribed by the State Board of Education
 which shall include training on the rules and regulations for the
 Individuals with Disabilities Act (IDEA); and

16 2. Achieved at least a seventy percent (70%) on a competency 17 examination in the area of mild-moderate disabilities, severe-18 profound disabilities, or comprehensive special education 19 administered by the State Department of Education.

D. An individual who has a valid Special Education Teaching Certificate as provided for in Sections 6-122.7, 6-122.8, or 6-122.9 of Title 70 of the Oklahoma Statutes shall not be required to obtain an acknowledgement of competency.

24 SECTION 2. This act shall become effective July 1, 2025.

3	declared to exist, by reason whereof this act shall take effect and
4	be in full force from and after its passage and approval.
