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19	BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:
20	SECTION 1. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified
21	in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 3-180 of Title 70, unless there
22	is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:
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A. The State Department of Education shall establish and
 maintain the Oklahoma High Dosage Tutoring Program for grades
 kindergarten through eight.

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B. For the purposes of this section:

1. "Cohort" means a student or group of students of no more
 than five who receive subject-specific high dosage tutoring in
 mathematics or English language arts (ELA) and are at least one-half
 grade level behind in mathematics or ELA prior to participating in
 the Oklahoma High Dosage Tutoring Program; and

10 2. "High dosage tutoring" means in-person, subject-specific 11 tutoring conducted by an individual employed by or contracted with a 12 school district participating in the Oklahoma High Dosage Tutoring 13 Program after school hours for a minimum of three one-hour sessions 14 per week per cohort. Tutoring shall be conducted during a minimum 15 of ten (10) weeks in the fall semester and a minimum of twelve (12) 16 weeks in the spring semester.

C. 1. Participating school districts shall assess kindergarten 17 through third grade students participating in high dosage ELA 18 tutoring using the screening instrument required by Section 19 1210.508C of Title 70 of the Oklahoma Statutes to track ELA academic 20 growth. Fourth-through eighth-grade students participating in high 21 dosage ELA tutoring shall be assessed using an assessment chosen by 22 the district to determine academic readiness for the next grade 23 level. 24

2. Participating school districts shall assess students
 2 participating in high dosage mathematics tutoring using an
 3 assessment chosen by the district to determine academic readiness
 4 for the next grade level.

3. Results of screening instruments and assessments
administered pursuant to this subsection shall be electronically
reported to the State Department of Education three times a year at
intervals determined by the Department.

9 D. The State Department of Education shall give priority for 10 participation in the Oklahoma High Dosage Tutoring Program to school districts federally designated for additional targeted support and 11 12 improvement or comprehensive support and improvement under the 13 Elementary and Secondary Education Act of 1965 as reauthorized by P.L. No. 114-95, also known as the Every Student Succeeds Act. 14 Participation in the program shall be approved on a first-come, 15 first-served basis without any limitation other than the amount of 16 funds available for the program and the number of school districts 17 that apply. 18

E. High dosage tutors employed by or contracted with public
school districts participating in the Oklahoma High Dosage Tutoring
Program shall be awarded bonuses in the following amounts:

One Thousand Six Hundred Dollars (\$1,600.00) for each cohort
 educated by a high dosage tutor per semester; and

2. One Thousand Dollars (\$1,000.00) for each academic grade
 2 level increase in ELA or mathematics that each student within a
 3 cohort experiences within one (1) academic year.

F. 1. If the students in a high dosage tutor's cohort do not
improve by at least half a grade level in their tutored subject
within the first year of the program, the tutor shall be placed on a
conditional one-year term of participation.

8 2. If the students in a high dosage tutor's cohort fail to
9 achieve half a grade level of growth during the one-year conditional
10 term of participation, the tutor shall lose eligibility to
11 participate in the program. A tutor who loses eligibility pursuant
12 to this paragraph may be reconsidered as a high dosage tutor after
13 two (2) years.

3. If the students in a high dosage tutor's cohort achieve half
a grade level of growth during the one-year conditional term of
participation, the tutor's conditional status shall be lifted.

17 G. High dosage tutors shall be provided the necessary 18 information for each student's subject-specific academic performance 19 level, as determined by the student's current teacher of the tutored 20 subject.

H. 1. School districts participating in the Oklahoma High
Dosage Tutoring Program shall obtain written consent from a
student's parent or legal guardian prior to allowing the student to
participate in high dosage tutoring.

2. If a student participating in high dosage tutoring fails to
 attend a tutoring session, the tutor shall notify the student's
 school district, and the school district shall notify the student's
 parent or legal guardian.

5 3. If the parent or legal quardian of a student participating in high dosage tutoring no longer wishes for the student to 6 participate, a student fails to attend nine (9) high dosage tutoring 7 sessions during a semester, or a student's behavior during tutoring 8 9 sessions requires disciplinary action, the student may be removed 10 from the cohort. The performance of a student subject to the provisions of this paragraph shall not count against the high dosage 11 12 tutor.

I. The State Board of Education shall promulgate rules toimplement the provisions of this section.

SECTION 2. A new section of law to be codified 15 NEW LAW in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 3-180.1 of Title 70, unless 16 there is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows: 17 There is hereby created in the State Treasury a revolving fund 18 for the State Department of Education to be designated the "High 19 Dosage Tutoring Revolving Fund". The fund shall be a continuing 20 fund, not subject to fiscal year limitations, and shall consist of 21 all monies received by the State Department of Education from gifts, 22 grants, donations, bequests, federal funds provided for the purpose 23 24 of funding high dosage tutoring, or state appropriations provided

1 for the purpose of implementing the provisions of Section 1 of this 2 act. All monies accruing to the credit of the fund are hereby appropriated and may be budgeted and expended by the State 3 Department of Education for the purpose provided for in this 4 5 section. Expenditures from the fund shall be made upon warrants issued by the State Treasurer against claims filed as prescribed by 6 law with the Director of the Office of Management and Enterprise 7 Services for approval and payment. 8

9 SECTION 3. AMENDATORY 70 O.S. 2021, Section 6-190, as
10 last amended by Section 1, Chapter 122, O.S.L. 2024 (70 O.S. Supp.
11 2024, Section 6-190), is amended to read as follows:

Section 6-190. A. The board of education of each school district shall employ and contract in writing, as required in Section 6-101 of this title, only with persons certified to teach by the State Board of Education in accordance with the Oklahoma Teacher Preparation Act, except as otherwise provided for by Section 6-101 of this title and by other law.

B. The Board shall issue a certificate to teach to any person who:

Has successfully completed the teacher education program
 required by the Commission for Educational Quality and
 Accountability;

23 2. Has graduated from an accredited institution of higher24 education that has approval or accreditation for teacher education;

3. Has met all other requirements as may be established by the
 Board;

4. Has made the necessary application and paid the competency
examination fee in an amount and as prescribed by the Commission;
5. Has successfully completed the competency examination
required in Section 6-187 of this title; and

7 6. Beginning November 1, 2001, has on file with the Board a current Oklahoma criminal history record from the Oklahoma State 8 9 Bureau of Investigation as well as a national criminal history record check as defined in Section 150.9 of Title 74 of the Oklahoma 10 Upon receipt of the Oklahoma criminal history record, the 11 Statutes. 12 Board may issue a temporary certificate which shall be effective 13 until receipt of the national fingerprint-based criminal history The person applying for a certificate shall be responsible 14 record. for the cost of the criminal history records. 15

16 C. The Board shall issue a certificate to teach to any person 17 who:

Holds an out-of-state certificate and meets the requirements
 set forth in subsection G of this section;

Holds certification from the National Board for Professional
 Teaching Standards;

3. Holds an out-of-country certificate and meets the requirements set forth in subsection F of this section; or

4. Has successfully completed a competency examination used in
 the majority of other states or comparable customized exam and meets
 the requirements set forth in subsection H of this section.

Beginning July 1, 2004, any person applying for initial 4 D. 5 Oklahoma certification shall have on file with the Board a current Oklahoma criminal history record from the Oklahoma State Bureau of 6 Investigation as well as a national criminal history record check as 7 defined in Section 150.9 of Title 74 of the Oklahoma Statutes. 8 Upon 9 receipt of the Oklahoma criminal history record, the Board may issue 10 a temporary certificate which shall be effective until receipt of the national fingerprint-based criminal history record. The person 11 12 applying for a certificate shall be responsible for the cost of the 13 criminal history records.

E. Any person holding a valid certificate, issued prior to
January 1, 1997, shall be a certified teacher for purposes of the
Oklahoma Teacher Preparation Act, subject to any professional
development requirements prescribed by the Oklahoma Teacher
Preparation Act or by the State Board of Education.

F. 1. The Board shall issue a certificate to teach to a person who holds a valid out-of-country certificate and meets any requirements established by the Board. The certificate to teach shall only be for those subject areas and grade levels most closely aligned to the subject areas and grade levels recognized on the outof-country certificate.

2. A person who meets the requirements of paragraph 1 of this
 subsection shall not be required to take any competency examinations
 in those subject areas and grade levels most closely aligned to the
 subject areas and grade levels recognized on the out-of-country
 certificate.

3. A person who meets the requirements of paragraph 1 of this 6 subsection shall have on file with the Board a current Oklahoma 7 criminal history record check from the Oklahoma State Bureau of 8 9 Investigation as well as a national criminal history record check as defined in Section 150.9 of Title 74 of the Oklahoma Statutes. 10 Upon receipt of the Oklahoma criminal history record check, the Board may 11 12 issue a temporary certificate which shall be effective until receipt 13 of the national fingerprint-based criminal history record check. The person applying for a certificate shall be responsible for the 14 cost of the criminal history record checks. 15

4. The Board shall promulgate rules establishing a process by
which out-of-country certificates will be reviewed and evaluated for
purposes of awarding a certificate to teach pursuant to this
subsection.

G. 1. The Board shall issue a certificate to teach to a person who holds a valid out-of-state certificate. The certificate to teach shall only be for those subject areas and grade levels most closely aligned to the subject areas and grade levels recognized on the out-of-state certificate. 2. A person who meets the requirements of paragraph 1 of this
 subsection shall not be required to take any competency examinations
 in those subject areas and grade levels most closely aligned to the
 subject areas and grade levels recognized on the out-of-state
 certificate.

3. A person who meets the requirements of this subsection shall 6 have on file with the Board a current Oklahoma criminal history 7 record check from the Oklahoma State Bureau of Investigation as well 8 9 as a national criminal history record check as defined in Section 10 150.9 of Title 74 of the Oklahoma Statutes. Upon receipt of the Oklahoma criminal history record check, the Board may issue a 11 12 temporary certificate which shall be effective until receipt of the national fingerprint-based criminal history record check. 13 The person applying for a certificate shall be responsible for the cost 14 of the criminal history record checks. 15

H. 1. The Board shall issue a certificate to teach to a person who has successfully completed a competency exam used in a majority of the other states. The certificate to teach shall only be for those subject areas and grade levels that correspond with a certification area used in Oklahoma.

2. A person who meets the requirements of paragraph 1 of this
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2. Subsection shall have on file with the Board a current Oklahoma
2. Criminal history record check from the Oklahoma State Bureau of
2. Investigation as well as a national criminal history record check as

defined in Section 150.9 of Title 74 of the Oklahoma Statutes. Upon receipt of the Oklahoma criminal history record check, the Board may issue a temporary certificate which shall be effective until receipt of the national fingerprint-based criminal history record check. The person applying for a certificate shall be responsible for the cost of the criminal history record checks.

The Board may establish new levels of teacher 7 I. 1. certificates: advanced, lead, and master. Each level shall have a 8 9 salary increase requirement stipend paid with state dollars from the 10 lottery funds as provided in Section 713 of Title 3A of the Oklahoma Statutes. The advanced certificate shall include a salary increase 11 12 stipend of Three Thousand Dollars (\$3,000.00), the lead certificate shall include a salary increase stipend of Five Thousand Dollars 13 (\$5,000.00), and the master certificate shall include a salary 14 increase stipend of Ten Thousand Dollars (\$10,000.00). 15

16 2. A teacher who works in a school with an enrollment of forty 17 percent (40%) or more of students who are economically disadvantaged 18 as defined in Section 18-109.5 of this title or a school district 19 with an enrollment of fewer than one thousand students shall be paid 20 a one-time award in addition to the salary increases <u>stipends</u> 21 provided in paragraph 1 of this subsection:

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 One Thousand Five Hundred Dollars (\$1,500.00) for an advanced certificate,

- b. Two Thousand Five Hundred Dollars (\$2,500.00) for a
   lead certificate, and
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c. Five Thousand Dollars (\$5,000.00) for a master certificate.

5 3. School districts may identify and designate the highest quality teachers for advanced, lead, and master certificates. 6 Participating districts shall submit designation plans to the State 7 Department of Education for evaluation and approval. Districts 8 9 shall have local control and flexibility in determining how to evaluate teachers and assign designations, but, at a minimum, the 10 designation system shall include a teacher observation, out-of-11 12 classroom time, and a student performance component.

- 13a.Teacher observation shall be based on the district's14selected Oklahoma Teacher and Leader Effectiveness15Evaluation System (TLE) evaluation tool or an16alternate method of evaluation; provided, the method17is evidenced-based. Alternate methods of evaluation18shall not replace the requirements of Section 6-101.1619of this title.
- b. Each school district that elects to participate in
  assigning advanced, lead, and master teacher
  certificates shall include an out-of-classroom
  component for its assigned teachers to allow for
  professional growth opportunities while staying in the

1 classroom. How out-of-classroom time is allotted and 2 managed shall be determined by the school district and submitted as part of its designation plan to the State 3 Department of Education for review and approval. 4 5 с. Student performance measures may be determined by the district and may include, but shall not be limited to, 6 pre- and post-tests, summative or formative, and 7 portfolios. The school district application shall 8 9 show evidence of validity and reliability of the 10 measures. No more than ten percent (10%) of each school 11 d. 12 district's teachers may be designated as an advanced, 13 lead, or master teacher in any given school year. Districts which receive Title I funds within the top 14 quartile of individual student allotment amounts may 15 designate an additional ten percent (10%) of teachers 16 employed at school sites which receive the Title I 17 funding as advanced, lead, and master. 18 Districts may use additional factors in determining which 19

19 Districts may use additional factors in determining which 20 teachers are eligible to receive a designation, such as student 21 surveys, teacher leadership responsibilities, teacher mentorship 22 responsibilities, family surveys, demonstration of district core 23 values, teacher peer surveys, and contributions to the broader 24 school community. No more than ten percent (10%) of each school 1 district's teachers may be designated as an advanced, lead, or 2 master teacher in any given school year.

4. If a school district chooses to participate in this program,
the state shall provide the increased salary stipend amounts
indicated for advanced, lead, and master certificates in paragraph 1
of this subsection above the base pay.

5. School districts that designate teachers for advanced, lead,
and master certificates do not have to participate in annual TLE
evaluations for the designated teachers.

6. School districts may designate teachers for advanced, lead,
or master certificates two times per year, once prior to the
beginning of the school year, and once prior to the beginning of the
second semester. Teachers statewide who receive these designations
shall be placed in professional development cohorts and provided
additional training opportunities from the State Department of
Education.

17 7. After initial approval by the State Department of Education,
18 the Department shall review and validate each participating school
19 district's teacher evaluation system biennially.

8. The State Department of Education shall annually report the
 school districts participating in the program, the number of
 advanced, lead, and master certificates awarded, and the total
 amount in state funding that was distributed to teachers from the

Teacher Empowerment Revolving Fund created in Section 6-190.2 of
 this title.

9. The selection criteria; designation of advanced, lead, or
master teachers; and any associated salary increases stipend amounts
shall not be subject to collective bargaining.

6 <u>10. Stipends provided pursuant to this subsection shall not be</u> 7 <u>included in the calculation of the teacher's salary for purposes of</u> 8 <u>meeting the district or statutory minimum salary schedule or for</u> 9 <u>purposes of calculating Teachers' Retirement System of Oklahoma</u> 10 contributions or benefits.

J. The State Board of Education shall adopt rules to implement a renewal schedule and associated fees for advanced, lead, and master teaching certificates. The rules shall allow a teacher that no longer meets the requirements of an advanced, lead, or master teaching certificate to make application for the standard teaching certificate.

17 K. The terms of the contracts issued to those holding advanced,18 lead, and master teaching certificates shall include the following:

Advanced: an additional five (5) days to be used to
 strengthen instructional leadership. A person with an advanced
 teaching certificate shall receive an annual salary increase stipend
 of Three Thousand Dollars (\$3,000.00) or the district's daily rate
 of pay, whichever is higher, in addition to the salary for which the
 teacher qualifies pursuant to Section 18-114.15 of this title. This

increase <u>stipend</u> shall be funded by state dollars from the lottery funds as provided in Section 713 of Title 3A of the Oklahoma Statutes and shall be paid <del>as regular annual compensation</del> directly to teachers through school districts;

5 2. Lead: an additional ten (10) days to be used to strengthen instructional leadership. A person with a lead teaching certificate 6 7 shall receive an annual salary increase stipend of Five Thousand Dollars (\$5,000.00) or the district's daily rate of pay, whichever 8 9 is higher, in addition to the salary for which the teacher qualifies 10 pursuant to Section 18-114.15 of this title. This increase stipend shall be funded by state dollars from the lottery funds as provided 11 in Section 713 of Title 3A of the Oklahoma Statutes and shall be 12 paid as regular annual compensation directly to teachers through 13 school districts; and 14

Master: an additional fifteen (15) days to be used to 15 3. strengthen leadership. A person with a master teaching certificate 16 shall receive an annual salary increase stipend of Ten Thousand 17 Dollars (\$10,000.00) or the district's daily rate of pay, whichever 18 is higher, in addition to the salary for which the teacher qualifies 19 pursuant to Section 18-114.15 of this title. This increase stipend 20 shall be funded by state dollars from the lottery funds as provided 21 in Section 713 of Title 3A of the Oklahoma Statutes and shall be 22 paid as regular annual compensation directly to teachers through 23 school districts. 24

If a person with an advanced, lead, or master teaching
 certificate changes school districts during the life of the
 certificate, the terms of the contracts required in this subsection
 shall be subject to approval by the new employing school district.
 L. Beginning in the 2022-2023 school year, the Department shall

6 make the teaching certificates provided for in this section
7 available for any person who has received a recommendation from his
8 or her school district and who meets the eligibility criteria as
9 outlined in each school district's teacher evaluation system
10 provided for in subsection I of this section.

The funding necessary for the administration of this section 11 М. 12 shall be provided from the Teacher Empowerment Revolving Fund 13 created in Section 6-190.2 of this title. If funding for the administration of the teaching certificates listed in subsection I 14 is not available, the Department shall not be required to fulfill 15 the requirements listed in subsections I, K, and L of this section. 16 Ν. The State Board of Education shall promulgate rules to 17 implement the provisions of Section 6-180 et seq. of this title. 18 SECTION 4. AMENDATORY Section 2, Chapter 359, O.S.L. 19 2022, as amended by Section 2, Chapter 122, O.S.L. 2024 (70 O.S. 20 Supp. 2024, Section 6-190.2), is amended to read as follows: 21 Section 6-190.2. A. There is hereby created in the State 22

23 Treasury a revolving fund for the State Department of Education to
24 be designated the "Teacher Empowerment Revolving Fund". The

revolving fund shall be a continuing fund, without legislative
appropriation, not subject to fiscal year limitations, and shall be
under the control and management of the State Department of
Education. Expenditures from the Teacher Empowerment Revolving Fund
shall be budgeted and expended as provided for in subsection B of
this section.

B. The State Department of Education shall utilize the funds
for the program outlined in Section 6-190 of this title. Funding
shall be allocated to school districts to provide the increased
salary stipend amounts indicated for advanced, lead, and master
certificates as provided for in subsection I of Section 6-190 of
this title on a first-come, first-served basis until the cash is
exhausted for the school year.

SECTION 5. This act shall become effective July 1, 2025. SECTION 6. It being immediately necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health, or safety, an emergency is hereby declared to exist, by reason whereof this act shall take effect and be in full force from and after its passage and approval.
