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16	BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:
17	SECTION 1. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified
18	in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 1-8-113 of Title 10A, unless
19	there is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:
20	A. The Department of Human Services shall not:
21	1. Require any current or prospective adoptive or foster parent
22	to affirm, accept, or support any government policy regarding sexual
23	orientation or gender identity that conflicts with the parent's
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sincerely held religious or moral beliefs as a condition for
 eligibility to adopt or foster;

2. Deny a current or prospective adoptive or foster parent any authorization necessary to be eligible to adopt or foster based, in whole or in part, upon the parent's sincerely held religious or moral beliefs, or intent to guide, instruct, or raise a child consistent with those beliefs, regarding sexual orientation or gender identity; or

Establish or enforce any standard, rule, or policy that 10 precludes consideration of a current or prospective adoptive or 11 foster parent for any particular placement based, in whole or in 12 part, upon the parent's sincerely held religious or moral beliefs 13 regarding sexual orientation or gender identity.

14 B. Nothing in this section shall:

15 1. Preclude the Department from taking into account the 16 religious or moral beliefs of a particular adoptive or foster child, 17 or his or her family of origin including, but not limited to, the 18 child's or family's views regarding sexual orientation and gender 19 identity, considered in relation to the religious or moral beliefs 20 of a prospective adoptive or foster parent when determining which 21 placement is in the best interest of the child; or

22 2. Be construed to prohibit or relieve the Department of its
23 duty to make each placement consistent with the best interests of
24 the child as otherwise required by law.
